- AN ACT relating to reporting on the tuition assistance program; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Report on the tuition assistance program. The president of 1 the higher education services corporation shall develop and prepare a 2 report on the tuition assistance program (TAP) which shall be submitted 3 4 by February 15 of each year to the governor, the temporary president of 5 the senate, the minority leader of the senate, the speaker of the assem-6 bly, the minority leader of the assembly, the chair of the senate finance committee, the chair of the assembly ways and means committee 7 the chairs of the higher education committees in both houses. Such 8 and 9 report shall review and include, but not be limited to, information or data on the following areas: 10

- 11 (1) All polices regarding, and the costs associated with, the distrib-12 ution of TAP funds to both full-time and part-time TAP recipients.
- 13 (2) Payment schedules, certification times, and repayment procedures 14 for TAP.
- 15 (3) A survey of the eligibility requirements for full-time and part-16 time TAP recipients.

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1 (4) A review of all procedures for the adjustments of income for 2 change in circumstance and its impact and utilization by recipients of 3 TAP, at each institution, each semester or trimester.

4 (5) The number and circumstances under which one-time exemptions from 5 academic progress requirements were granted to recipients of TAP, at 6 each institution, each semester or trimester.

7 (6) The availability of state financial assistance as it pertains to 8 the increasing cost of attending a college or university.

9 (7) The number of students receiving TAP, full-time and part-time, at 10 each institution, each semester or trimester.

11 (8) The number of credits earned by students receiving TAP, full-time 12 and part-time, at each institution, each semester or trimester.

13 (9) The number of students receiving TAP, full-time and part-time, at 14 each institution, each semester or trimester, that become ineligible for 15 TAP because they have exhausted their allotment.

16 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be 17 deemed repealed upon the submission of the report on February 15, 2013.
