- AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to requiring one member of the crime victims compensation board to be an attorney with a concentration in elder law

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 622 of the executive law, as 2 amended by chapter 17 of the laws of 1982, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 1. There is hereby created in the executive department a board, to be known as the crime victims board. Such board shall consist of [five] SIX 5 members, no more than [three] FOUR of whom shall belong to the same 6 7 political party, who shall be appointed by the governor by and with the advice and consent of the senate. Three of the members appointed by the 8 governor shall have been admitted to practice law in the state of New 9 10 York for not less than five years next preceding their appointment AND ONE SHALL HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO PRACTICE LAW IN THE STATE OF NEW 11 YORK WITH A CONCENTRATION IN ELDER LAW FOR NOT LESS THAN FIVE YEARS PRECEDING 12 HIS OR HER APPOINTMENT. 13

14 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
