- AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to establishing the mature worker employment training program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The elder law is amended by adding a new article IV to read 2 as follows: 3 ARTICLE IV 4 MATURE WORKER EMPLOYMENT 5 TRAINING PROGRAM б SECTION 401. DEFINITIONS. 7 402. DUTIES OF THE DIRECTOR. 8 403. FUNDING FOR MATURE WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM. 9 404. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR. 10 S 401. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS SECTION: 1. "ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR THE AGING" SHALL MEAN THE ADVISORY COMMIT-11 12 TEE FOR THE AGING ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION TWO HUNDRED TEN OF 13 THIS CHAPTER. 14 2. "DESIGNATED AGENCY" SHALL MEAN A DESIGNATED AGENCY AS DEFINED IN 15 PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN OF THIS 16 CHAPTER. 17 3. "ELIGIBLE PERSON" SHALL MEAN AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS FIFTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER AND IS SEEKING AN EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PROGRAM TO ENABLE 18 THEM TO REMAIN IN OR RE-ENTER THE WORK FORCE. 19 20 4. "MATURE WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM" SHALL MEAN A PROGRAM, DEVELOPED IN 21 CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR, PROVIDING A VARIETY OF 22 EMPLOYMENT SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE PERSONS. 23 402. 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1 IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR, SHALL PROMULGATE RULES 2 AND REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING REQUIREMENTS AND STANDARDS FOR SUCH 3 PROGRAMS. SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED 4 TO:

(A) THE TRAINING SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED;

(B) THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA;

(C) A SLIDING SCALE FOR COST SHARING BY PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS;

(D) MONITORING AND EVALUATION OF PROGRAMS; AND

9 (E) ANY OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS THE DIRECTOR DEEMS NECESSARY AND 10 APPROPRIATE.

12 2. THE RULES AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION ONE 12 OF THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE INCLUSION OF MATURE WORKER TRAIN-13 ING PROGRAMS IN COUNTY PLANS AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH (G) OF SUBDIVISION 14 ONE OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED FOURTEEN OF THIS CHAPTER.

15 S 403. FUNDING FOR MATURE WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM. 1. THE DIRECTOR SHALL, WITHIN THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED THEREFOR, AWARD GRANTS ON A 16 17 COMPETITIVE BASIS TO NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATIONS, DESIGNATED AGENCIES 18 AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WITH DEMONSTRATED EXPERIENCE OPERATING MATURE 19 WORKER TRAINING PROGRAMS, WITH CONSIDERATION OF REGIONAL NEEDS. SUCH 20 GRANTS SHALL BE EQUAL TO SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE ALLOWABLE EXPENDI-21 TURES FOR SERVICES PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THE 22 DIRECTOR MAY ACCEPT IN KIND EQUIVALENTS TO COMPRISE UP TO FIFTEEN PERCENT OF THE GRANT RECIPIENT'S TWENTY-FIVE PERCENT SHARE OF SUCH 23 EXPENDITURES; PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT IN THE CASE OF MATURE WORKER 24 25 TRAINING PROGRAM PROVIDERS WHICH CAN DEMONSTRATE FINANCIAL NEED, THE 26 DIRECTOR MAY AWARD GRANTS UP TO ONE HUNDRED PERCENT OF THE ALLOWABLE 27 EXPENDITURES.

28 2. THE OFFICE SHALL EXPEND NOT MORE THAN TEN PERCENT OF THE APPROPRI-29 ATIONS, MADE FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE, FOR THE ADMINISTRATIVE 30 EXPENSES OF THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF.

3. NO EXPENDITURE OF FUNDS SHALL BE MADE PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE 31 TO 32 MATURE WORKER TRAINING PROGRAM FOR SERVICES PROVIDED TO ELDERLY ANY PERSONS WHO ARE OTHERWISE RECEIVING COMPARABLE SERVICES WHETHER THROUGH 33 34 THE WORKFORCE INVESTMENT ACT, THE JOB TRAINING PARTNERSHIP ACT, THE 35 SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM, THE CARL D. PERKINS VOCA-TIONAL AND APPLIED TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION ACT OF 1990 OR ANY OTHER SOURCE. 36 404. REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR. ESTIMATES AND RECOMMENDATIONS WITH REGARD TO THE FISCAL IMPLICATIONS OF
THE REGULATION OF MATURE WORKER TRAINING PROGRAMS.

50 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 51 it shall have become a law. Provided, that, effective immediately, any 52 rules and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act 53 on its effective date are authorized to be completed on or before such 54 date.
