AN ACT to amend the military law, in relation to authorizing additional paid leave for state correction officers who are absent on military duty

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 5 of section 242 of the military law, as
2 amended by chapter 161 of the laws of 1984, is amended to read as
3 follows:
4 5. Pay for military duty. [Every] (A) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN
5 PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION, EVERY public officer or employee
6 shall be paid his OR HER salary or other compensation as such public
7 officer or employee for any and all periods of absence while engaged in
8 the performance of ordered military duty, and while going to and return-
9 ing from such duty, not exceeding a total of thirty days or twenty-two
10 working days, whichever is greater, in any one calendar year and not
11 exceeding thirty days or twenty-two working days, whichever is greater,
12 in any one continuous period of such absence.
13 (B) EVERY CORRECTION OFFICER EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION-
14 AL SERVICES SHALL BE PAID HIS OR HER SALARY OR OTHER COMPENSATION AS
15 SUCH CORRECTION OFFICER FOR ANY AND ALL PERIODS OF ABSENCE WHILE ENGAGED
16 IN THE PERFORMANCE OF ORDERED MILITARY DUTY, AND WHILE GOING TO AND
17 RETURNING FROM SUCH DUTY, NOT EXCEEDING FORTY DAYS OR THIRTY WORKING
18 DAYS, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, IN ANY ONE CALENDAR YEAR AND NOT EXCEEDING
19 FORTY DAYS OR THIRTY WORKING DAYS, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, IN ANY ONE
20 CONTINUOUS PERIOD OF SUCH ABSENCE.
21 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
