AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to interior designers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Section 8307 of the education law is renumbered 8308 and a  
2     new section 8307 is added to read as follows:  
3     S 8307. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. A PERSON WHO HAS BEEN PRACTICING INTERIOR  
4     DESIGN AS DEFINED IN SECTION EIGHTY-THREE HUNDRED THREE OF THIS ARTICLE  
5     FOR FIFTEEN OR MORE YEARS PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION  
6     MAY FOR UP TO TWO YEARS FROM THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION APPLY TO  
7     THE DEPARTMENT FOR AN EXEMPTION FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF PARAGRAPHS (B)  
8     AND (D) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION EIGHTY-THREE HUNDRED FIVE OF THIS  
9     ARTICLE. SUCH APPLICATION FOR AN EXEMPTION SHALL BE DEVELOPED BY THE  
10    DEPARTMENT AND SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO: (1) A VERIFICATION  
11    OF EMPLOYMENT FOR THE PURPOSES OF DETERMINING WHETHER OR NOT SUCH INDI-  
12    VIDUAL MEETS THE MINIMUM FIFTEEN YEARS REQUIREMENT FOR EXEMPTION UNDER  
13    THE ARTICLE;  
14    (2) DOCUMENTS TO SUBSTANTIALLY DEMONSTRATE THAT SUCH WORK EXPERIENCE  
15    AND EMPLOYMENT PRACTICE HAS BEEN AS AN ACTUAL INTERIOR DESIGNER AS  
16    DISTINGUISHED FROM SERVICES PROVIDED BY INTERIOR DECORATORS AND OTHERS  
17    PROVIDING INTERIOR FURNISHING SERVICES; AND  
18    (3) RECOMMENDATIONS FROM CLIENTS AND FROM PRESENT AND, IF APPLICABLE,  
19    PAST EMPLOYERS OR COLLEAGUES. IN ADDITION, A REGISTRATION FEE OF ONE  
20    HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS SHALL BE SUBMITTED WITH THE APPLICATION.  
21    SUCH APPLICATION SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN TWO YEARS FROM THE EFFEC-  
22    TIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION.  
23    S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after  
24    it shall have become a law.
