AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to policy coverage of chemotherapy treatment

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Legislative findings. The legislature finds that advances 1 2 medical research have led to significant new developments of various in 3 medical treatments. These treatments offer patients a wide range of new choices to combat very serious diseases. The area of cancer treatment 4 5 has been one of the fields that has seen these significant new medical 6 advancements. In recent years, oral chemotherapy treatments have been developed that provide viable alternatives to traditional intravenous 7 8 cancer treatments for patients. This oral chemotherapy treatment offers the treating physician and the patient a choice in relation to treatment 9 options. However, this choice is sometimes limited as the oral 10 chemotherapy treatments are, in most cases, covered under the prescription drug 11 12 benefit of an insurance plan rather than under the major medical insur-13 ance benefit of an insurance plan. This discrepancy in coverage can limit a patient's ability to choose the oral chemotherapy treatment 14 because of the cost associated with the disparate treatment. 15

16 S 2. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is amended by 17 adding a new paragraph 12-a to read as follows:

(12-A) EVERY POLICY DELIVERED OR ISSUED FOR DELIVERY IN THIS 18 STATE 19 THAT PROVIDES MEDICAL, MAJOR MEDICAL, OR SIMILAR COMPREHENSIVE-TYPE 20 COVERAGE AND PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR CANCER CHEMOTHERAPY TREATMENT SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR A PRESCRIBED, ORALLY ADMINISTERED ANTICANCER MEDI-21 CATION USED TO KILL OR SLOW THE GROWTH OF CANCEROUS CELLS ON A BASIS 22 NO 23 LESS FAVORABLE THAN INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED OR INJECTED CANCER MEDI-24 CATIONS.

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1 S 3. Subsection (k) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by 2 adding a new paragraph 9-a to read as follows:

3 (9-A) EVERY GROUP OR BLANKET POLICY DELIVERED OR ISSUED FOR DELIVERY
4 IN THIS STATE THAT PROVIDES MEDICAL, MAJOR MEDICAL, OR SIMILAR COMPRE5 HENSIVE-TYPE COVERAGE AND PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR CANCER CHEMOTHERAPY
6 TREATMENT SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR A PRESCRIBED, ORALLY ADMINISTERED
7 ANTICANCER MEDICATION USED TO KILL OR SLOW THE GROWTH OF CANCEROUS CELLS
8 ON A BASIS NO LESS FAVORABLE THAN INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED OR INJECTED
9 CANCER MEDICATIONS.

10 S 4. Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new 11 subsection (q-1) to read as follows:

(O-1) EVERY POLICY ISSUED BY A MEDICAL EXPENSE INDEMNITY CORPORATION, 12 A HOSPITAL SERVICE CORPORATION OR A HEALTH SERVICE CORPORATION FOR 13 14 DELIVERY IN THIS STATE THAT PROVIDES MEDICAL, MAJOR MEDICAL, OR SIMILAR COMPREHENSIVE-TYPE COVERAGE AND PROVIDES COVERAGE FOR CANCER CHEMOTHERA-15 PY TREATMENT SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR A PRESCRIBED, ORALLY ADMINIS-16 TERED ANTICANCER MEDICATION USED TO KILL OR SLOW THE GROWTH OF CANCEROUS 17 CELLS ON A BASIS NO LESS FAVORABLE THAN INTRAVENOUSLY ADMINISTERED 18 OR 19 INJECTED CANCER MEDICATIONS.

20 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately and shall apply to poli-21 cies issued, modified, or renewed on or after such effective date.
