AN ACT to amend the transportation law, in relation to requiring all railroads transporting hazardous materials through the counties of Nassau and Suffolk to give advance notice to the Metropolitan Transportation Authority, local governments and municipalities, and law enforcement and first responder personnel located within a quarter mile of the railroad tracks

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 14-f of the transportation law is 2 amended by adding a new paragraph (c) to read as follows:

3 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, ALL (C) RAILROADS TRANSPORTING HAZARDOUS MATERIALS 4 THROUGH THE COUNTIES OF 5 NASSAU AND SUFFOLK SHALL, AT LEAST TWENTY-FOUR HOURS PRIOR TO COMMENCING б ANY SUCH TRANSPORT, NOTIFY THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY, ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND MUNICIPALITIES, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT AND FIRST 7 RESPONDER PERSONNEL LOCATED WITHIN A QUARTER MILE OF THE RAILROAD TRACKS 8 9 WHICH THE HAZARDOUS MATERIAL IS BEING TRANSPORTED OF THE IMPENDING ON 10 TRANSPORT. SUCH NOTIFICATION SHALL BE GIVEN IN SUCH FORM AND MANNER AS 11 PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

(I) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE TERM "RAILROAD" SHALL MEAN 12 13 PRIVATE OR PUBLIC RAILROAD OPERATING IN THE COUNTIES OF NASSAU AND Α SUFFOLK CARRYING EITHER FREIGHT OR FREIGHT AND PASSENGERS INCLUDING, BUT 14 15 NOT LIMITED TO, THOSE OPERATED BY THE AUTHORITY AND ITS SUBSIDIARIES, ISLAND RAIL ROAD, THE METRO-NORTH RAILROAD, THE STATEN ISLAND 16 THE LONG RAPID TRANSIT OPERATING AUTHORITY, THE NEW YORK CITY TRANSIT AUTHORITY, 17 OTHER PUBLIC AUTHORITY OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT, OR ANY PRIVATE RAILROAD 18 ANY 19 ENTITY OPERATING ON TRACKS OF THE LONG ISLAND RAIL ROAD.

20 (II) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL NOT APPLY IN THE CASE OF 21 AN EMERGENCY AS DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

22 S 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall 23 have become a law.
