AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to required training for individuals applying for certification or licensure to be a teacher

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 3004 of the education law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 2-a to read as follows:

3 THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PRESCRIBE REGULATIONS REQUIRING ALL 2-A. A. PERSONS APPLYING FOR CERTIFICATION OR A LICENSE TO BE A TEACHER, 4 ON OR 5 AFTER JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, TO HAVE COMPLETED A MINIMUM OF SIX HOURS OF COURSEWORK AND TRAINING IN HOW TO RECOGNIZE AND RESPOND TO 6 7 INCIDENTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND INTIMIDATION. EACH APPLICANT SHALL 8 PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT WITH DOCUMENTATION SHOWING THAT THE APPLICANT HAS 9 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE REQUIRED TRAINING. SUCH COURSEWORK OR TRAIN-10 SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER CERTIFICATION OR LICENSURE ING 11 REOUIREMENTS.

B. COURSEWORK AND TRAINING REQUIRED BY THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL: (I) 12 BE PROVIDED BY AN INSTITUTION OR PROVIDER WHICH HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE 13 14 DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE SUCH COURSEWORK OR TRAINING; AND (II) SHALL BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, INFORMATION TO HELP TEACHERS IDENTIFY 15 INCLUDE, 16 AND APPROPRIATELY RESPOND TO INCIDENTS OF BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND SCHOOLS, AND SHALL PROVIDE 17 INTIMIDATION IN TEACHERS WITH SKILLS TO PROMOTE POSITIVE AND APPROPRIATE SOCIAL INTERACTIONS, TOLERANCE, RESPECT 18 19 AND ACCEPTANCE OF DIVERSITY.

20 C. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION, BULLYING, HARASSMENT AND INTIM-21 IDATION ARE DEFINED AS ANY AGGRESSIVE BEHAVIOR INCLUDING VERBAL OR PHYS-22 ICAL CONDUCT, AND WRITTEN OR ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION, THAT HAS OR WOULD EFFECT OF CREATING A HOSTILE EDUCATIONAL 23 HAVE THE ENVIRONMENT BY SUBSTANTIALLY INTERFERING WITH A STUDENT'S EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS, 24 OPPOR-TUNITIES OR PERFORMANCE, OR WITH A STUDENT'S PHYSICAL OR PSYCHOLOGICAL 25 26 WELL-BEING, OR THAT REASONABLY CAUSES OR WOULD REASONABLY BE EXPECTED TO 27 CAUSE A STUDENT TO FEAR FOR HIS OR HER PHYSICAL SAFETY.

28 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 29 it shall have become a law.
