AN ACT to amend the legislative law, in relation to freezing per diems for legislators with secondary incomes exceeding 20 percent of their legislative salaries

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 5 of the legislative law, as amended by section 1 of part M-1 of chapter 407 of the laws of 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- Each member of the legislature shall receive payment of actual and 5 necessary transportation expenses and a per diem equivalent to the most 6 recent federal per diem rates published by the General Services Adminis-7 tration and set forth in 41 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations) Part 301, 8 App. A, while in travel status in the performance of his or her duties; 9 and such other reasonable expenses as may be necessary for the perform-10 ance of the member's responsibilities as determined by the temporary president of the senate or speaker of the assembly for their respective 11 houses. The per diem allowances, including partial per diem allowances, 12 13 shall be made pursuant to regulations promulgated by the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly for their respective 14 15 houses, on audit and warrant of the comptroller on vouchers approved by the temporary president of the senate or his or her designee 16 speaker of the assembly or his or her designee for their respective 17 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, 18 houses. 19 DIEM RATE RECEIVED BY LEGISLATORS WITH SECONDARY INCOMES THAT EXCEED
- 20 TWENTY PERCENT OF THEIR LEGISLATIVE SALARIES, SHALL NOT EXCEED THE PER
- 21 DIEM RATE ESTABLISHED FOR THE TWO THOUSAND NINE-TWO THOUSAND TEN STATE
- 22 FISCAL YEAR.
