AN ACT to amend the general municipal law, in relation to training expenses for police and peace officers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 72-c of the general municipal law, as amended by section 1 of subpart C of part C of chapter 97 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:

S 72-c. Expenses of members of the police department and other peace officers in attending [police] training schools. The board or body of a county, city, town or village authorized to appropriate and to raise money by taxation and to make payments therefrom, is hereby authorized, in its discretion, to appropriate and to raise money by taxation and to make payments from such moneys, for the annual expenses of the members of the police department of such municipal corporation in attending a [police] training school, as provided by the regulations of the department, either within such municipal corporation or elsewhere within the state; and for the payment of reasonable expenses of such members and other police officers or peace officers of the municipality while going to, attending, and returning from any training school conducted by or under the auspices of the federal bureau of investigation, whether within or without the state. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of any general, special or local law to the contrary, whenever a member of the police department of a municipal corporation has attended a [police] training school, the expense of which was borne by such municipal corporation, terminates employment with such municipal corporation and commences employment with any other [municipal corporation or employer

county sheriff | LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WITHIN NEW YORK STATE, such employer [municipal corporation or employer county sheriff] shall reim-3 burse the [prior employer] municipal corporation THAT FORMERLY POLICE OFFICER OR PEACE OFFICER for such expenses, including, sala-5 ry, tuition, enrollment fees, books, and the cost of transportation to 6 from training school, as follows: on a pro rata basis, to be calcu-7 lated by subtracting from the number of days in the three years 8 ing the date of the member's graduation from police training school, the 9 number of days between the date of the member's graduation from training 10 school and the date of the termination of employment with the municipal corporation which paid for such training, and multiplying the difference 11 by the per diem cost of such expenses, to be calculated by dividing 12 such expenses by the number of days in the three years 13 total cost of 14 following the date of the member's graduation, if such change in employ-15 ment occurs within three years of such member's graduation from [police] 16 training school. Provided, however, [the employer municipal corporation 17 employer county sheriff] A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY shall not be 18 required to reimburse the prior employer [municipal corporation] 19 that portion of such expenses which [is] MAY BE reimbursable by the 20 member to [the] HIS OR HER prior employer [municipal corporation] under 21 terms of an employment or labor agreement. [Provided, further, however, the employer municipal corporation or employer county sheriff 22 23 shall not be required to reimburse the prior employer municipal corporation] NO REIMBURSEMENT SHALL BE REQUIRED for such basic training if 24 25 such change in employment occurs after the expiration of the validity of 26 the member's certificate attesting to the satisfactory completion of an approved [municipal police] basic training program. 27
