AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to non-emergent treatment in hospitals of nonadmitted patients

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The section heading of section 2805-b of the public health law, as amended by chapter 787 of the laws of 1983, is amended to read as follows:

Admission of patients, and emergency AND NON-EMERGENT treatment of nonadmitted patients.

- S 2. Section 2805-b of the public health law is amended by adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:
- 6. IN ANY IMPLEMENTATION OF PROVISIONS FOR AN OBSERVATION LEVEL OF CARE, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL:
- 10 (A) ALLOW FOR THE PROVISION OF OBSERVATION CARE FOR A PERIOD OF UP TO 11 FORTY-EIGHT HOURS FROM THE TIME THE PHYSICIAN ORDER FOR OBSERVATION 12 SERVICES IS ISSUED;
- 13 (B) ALLOW A GENERAL HOSPITAL TO DETERMINE THE PROPER CLINICAL AREA AND 14 LOCATION FOR THE CARE OF A SPECIFIC PATIENT REQUIRING OBSERVATION CARE 15 BASED ON THE NEEDS OF THE PATIENT AND THE AVAILABILITY OF SERVICES TO 16 MEET THOSE NEEDS;
- 17 (C) ALLOW A GENERAL HOSPITAL TO DETERMINE WHETHER IT WILL PROVIDE SUCH 18 CARE IN A DISTINCT PHYSICAL SPACE; AND
- 19 (D) PROVIDE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE COVERAGE FOR OBSERVATION CARE.
- 20 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
