AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to protecting employees of social services districts, local juvenile detention agencies, and persons involved in cases handled by such agencies from assault

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivisions 3 and 11 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as separately amended by chapters 318 and 345 of the laws of 2010, are amended to read as follows:

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3 With intent to prevent a peace officer, a police officer, regis-4 5 tered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, a firefighter, including a firefighter acting as a paramedic or emergency 7 medical technician administering first aid in the course of performance duty as such firefighter, an emergency medical service paramedic or 9 emergency medical service technician, or medical or related personnel in 10 a hospital emergency department, a city marshal, a traffic enforcement 11 officer or traffic enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL SOCIAL 12 SERVICES DISTRICT OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY ADMINISTERED AND 13 OPERATED BY ANY COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, from performing a 14 lawful duty, by means including releasing or failing to control an 15 animal under circumstances evincing the actor's intent that the animal 16 17 obstruct the lawful activity of such peace officer, police officer, 18 registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement 19 agent, firefighter, paramedic, technician, city marshal, 20 enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL

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SOCIAL SERVICES DISTRICT OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY ADMINIS-1 TERED AND OPERATED BY ANY COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE 3 PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, he or she causes physical injury to such peace officer, police officer, registered nurse, 5 licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, firefighter, 6 paramedic, technician or medical or related personnel in a hospital 7 emergency department, city marshal, traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL SOCIAL SERVICES DISTRICT 8 9 OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY ADMINISTERED AND OPERATED BY ANY 10 COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 11 NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW; or

12 11. With intent to cause physical injury to a train operator, ticket inspector, 13 conductor, signalperson, bus operator or station agent 14 employed by any transit agency, authority or company, public or private, 15 whose operation is authorized by New York state or any of its political 16 subdivisions, a city marshal, a traffic enforcement officer, traffic 17 enforcement agent or sanitation enforcement agent, registered nurse or 18 licensed practical nurse, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL SOCIAL SERVICES 19 DISTRICT OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY ADMINISTERED AND OPERATED ANY COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF 20 21 ARTICLE NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, he or she causes physical inju-22 ry to such train operator, ticket inspector, conductor, signalperson, bus operator or station agent, city marshal, traffic enforcement offi-23 24 cer, traffic enforcement agent, registered nurse or licensed practical 25 [or], sanitation enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL SOCIAL 26 SERVICES DISTRICT OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY ADMINISTERED 27 OPERATED BY ANY COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE 28 PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, while such 29 employee is performing an assigned duty on, or directly related to, the operation of a train or bus, or such city marshal, traffic enforcement 30 officer, traffic enforcement agent, registered nurse or licensed practi-31 32 [or], sanitation enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A LOCAL nurse 33 SOCIAL SERVICES DISTRICT OR EMPLOYEE AT A DETENTION FACILITY 34 TERED AND OPERATED BY ANY COUNTY OR THE CITY OF NEW YORK PURSUANT TO THE 35 PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE NINETEEN-G OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, is performing an 36 assigned duty.

37 S 2. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-38 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
