AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to personal watercraft and certain safety provisions that require their use; and to amend the navigation law, in relation to making technical corrections thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 1341 of the 2 public health law is amended to read as follows:
- 3 (a) Every person maintaining any such bathing establishment shall also and provide in connection therewith, for the facilitating of the 5 rescue of persons in danger of drowning, a surfboat OR A PERSONAL WATER-CRAFT AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION THIRTY OF SECTION TWO OF THE NAVIGATION 7 A SURFBOAT SHALL BE not less than sixteen feet long, on each side of which there shall be hanging ropes arranged so that persons 9 water can easily catch hold of same, or be supported thereby. Such boats shall be equipped with two or more sets of oars and life-lines and life-10 belts, and at least one ring buoy or life preserver, with quarter-inch 11 12 cotton line, not less than five hundred feet in length, with reel attached thereto. In addition thereto, there shall be anchored on 13 14 the shore, a suitable reel with a half-inch cotton line not less than five hundred feet in length, with a life-belt attached thereto, kept in 15 good order and proper condition, so that it can readily be used by those 16 17 assisting in saving life.
- 18 S 2. Subdivision 30 of section 2 of the navigation law, as added by 19 chapter 830 of the laws of 1990, is renumbered subdivision 30-a.
 - S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
