- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the development and implementation of statewide school nutrition standards for food and beverages that are sold to students and the review of school wellness policies

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 "the school nutrition act of 2011".

3 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 915-a to 4 read as follows:

5 915-A. FOOD AND BEVERAGE NUTRITION STANDARDS. 1. A. THE COMMISSION-S 6 ER, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE DEPARTMENT OF 7 AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS, THE OFFICE OF GENERAL SERVICES AND WITH INPUT 8 FROM, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AT LEAST ONE REPRESENTATIVE EACH 9 THE SCHOOL FOOD SERVICE DIRECTORS; SCHOOL BOARDS; SCHOOL ADMINIS-FROM 10 TRATORS; CERTIFIED DIETICIANS/NUTRITIONISTS OR REGISTERED DIETICIANS; 11 THE PEDIATRIC MEDICAL COMMUNITY; THE PUBLIC HEALTH COMMUNITY; COMPREHEN-CARE CENTERS FOR EATING DISORDERS, ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 12 SIVE TWENTY-SEVEN-J OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW; AND THE AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY, 13 14 SHALL DEVELOP BY DECEMBER THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE, STATEWIDE 15 SCHOOL NUTRITION STANDARDS FOR FOOD AND BEVERAGES THAT ARE SOLD TO 16 STUDENTS EXCLUSIVE OF THOSE PROVIDED THROUGH THE FEDERAL SCHOOL MEAL THE COMMISSIONER SHALL SEEK TO ENSURE THAT SUCH INPUT REPRES-17 PROGRAMS. ENTS A BALANCED AND COMPREHENSIVE PERSPECTIVE. 18 SUCH NUTRITION STANDARDS SHALL BE DEVELOPED TO PROMOTE A HEALTHFUL DIET 19 INTO ACCOUNT A TAKING 20 PREPONDERANCE OF THE NUTRITIONAL, SCIENTIFIC AND MEDICAL KNOWLEDGE WHICH 21 IS CURRENT AT THE TIME SUCH RECOMMENDATIONS ARE MADE.

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B. NO LATER THAN JUNE THIRTIETH, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, THE BOARD OF 1 REGENTS SHALL PROMULGATE REGULATIONS BASED ON THE NUTRITIONAL STANDARDS 2 3 RECOMMENDED BY THE COMMISSIONER. SUCH REGULATIONS SHALL APPLY TO SCHOOL 4 MEALS, EXCLUSIVE OF THOSE PROVIDED THROUGH FEDERAL OR SCHOOL MEAL 5 PROGRAMS, ENTREES, SNACKS AND BEVERAGES SOLD OR SERVED ON SCHOOL GROUNDS 6 EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCA-IN 7 TION AND CHARTER SCHOOL THAT PARTICIPATES IN A PROGRAM AUTHORIZED BY THE 8 RICHARD B. RUSSELL NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH ACT OR THE CHILD NUTRITION ACT OF 1966, COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS "SCHOOL DISTRICTS", 9 DURING THE SCHOOL DAY FROM ANY SOURCE INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, 10 11 SCHOOL CAFETERIAS, A LA CARTE LINES, SCHOOL STORES, OR VENDING MACHINES. SUCH REGULATIONS SHALL BE APPLICABLE IN THE TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO 12 13 THOUSAND FOURTEEN SCHOOL YEAR.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PARAGRAPH OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THIS SECTION AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED HEREUNDER SHALL NOT APPLY TO: 15 (I) 16 FOODS AND BEVERAGES PROVIDED UNDER THE FEDERAL CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM, WHICH SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS IMPOSED UNDER THAT 17 PROGRAM; (II) FOODS AND BEVERAGES SOLD, SERVED OR OFFERED AT AFTER 18 SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ATTENDED BY BOTH ADULTS AND STUDENTS, SUCH AS CONCERTS 19 20 AND SPORTING EVENTS; OR (III) FOODS AND BEVERAGES SOLD: (A) BY STUDENTS, 21 THEIR IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS OR GUARDIANS OR SCHOOL EMPLOYEES, (B) THROUGH SOURCES OTHER THAN SCHOOL CAFETERIAS, A LA CARTE LINES, VENDING 22 MACHINES, AND SCHOOL STORES, (C) AFTER THE END OF THE LAST SCHEDULED 23 MEAL PERIOD OF THE SCHOOL DAY, AND (D) ONLY FOR THE PURPOSE OF RAISING 24 25 FUNDS TO SUPPORT SCHOOL ACTIVITIES.

D. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, THIS SECTION AND REGU-LATIONS PROMULGATED HEREUNDER SHALL NOT PROHIBIT NOR RESTRICT THE ACQUI-SITION AND UTILIZATION OF ANY FOOD ITEM AVAILABLE THROUGH FEDERALLY FUNDED PROGRAMS SUCH AS THE USDA COMMODITIES PROGRAM AND DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE FOOD PROGRAMS.

2. ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, THE COMMISSIONER, 31 32 IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AT LEAST ONE REPRESENTATIVE EACH FROM THE SCHOOL FOOD 33 SERVICE DIRECTORS; SCHOOL BOARDS; SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS; CERTIFIED 34 35 DIETICIANS/NUTRITIONISTS OR REGISTERED DIETICIANS; COMPREHENSIVE CARE CENTERS FOR EATING DISORDERS, ESTABLISHED 36 PURSUANT ΤO ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN-J OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW; AND THE PEDIATRIC MEDICAL 37 38 COMMUNITY SHALL ISSUE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR METHODS AND THE PRACTICALITY 39 OF PROVIDING STUDENTS WITH AGE APPROPRIATE INFORMATION REGARDING THE 40 NUTRITIONAL CONTENT OF SCHOOL MENU ITEMS.

3. ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, THE COMMISSIONER,
IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS, AND
INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, AT LEAST ONE REPRESENTATIVE EACH FROM THE
SCHOOL FOOD SERVICE DIRECTORS; SCHOOL BOARDS; SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS; AND
THE AGRICULTURAL COMMUNITY, SHALL ISSUE RECOMMENDATIONS ON INCREASING
OPPORTUNITIES FOR NEW YORK STATE FARMS AND FARMERS TO COLLABORATE WITH
SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

48 4. RECOMMENDATIONS ISSUED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISIONS TWO AND THREE OF 49 THIS SECTION SHALL BE ISSUED IN A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE AND THE 50 GOVERNOR ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN. COPIES OF SUCH 51 REPORT SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

52 5. BEGINNING WITH THE TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN 53 SCHOOL YEAR, AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL RECEIVE AN 54 ADDITIONAL FIFTEEN CENTS (ABOVE THE AMOUNT PROVIDED FOR THE TWO THOUSAND 55 ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND TWELVE SCHOOL YEAR), PER THE NUMBER OF FEDERALLY 56 REIMBURSABLE BREAKFASTS AND LUNCHES SERVED IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR TO

STUDENTS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH AN ACT OF CONGRESS ENTITLED THE "NATIONAL 1 2 SCHOOL LUNCH ACT", P.L. 79-396, AS AMENDED, OR THE PROVISIONS OF THE 3 "CHILD NUTRITION ACT OF 1996", P.L. 89-642, AS AMENDED.

4 6. IF AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOUSAND 5 FOURTEEN SCHOOL YEAR, A SCHOOL DISTRICT HAS AN EXISTING CONTRACT WITH A 6 PROVIDE VENDING OR OTHER FOOD AND BEVERAGE SERVICES WHICH COMPANY TO 7 WOULD BE BREACHED BY COMPLIANCE WITH THE REGULATIONS ESTABLISHED PURSU-8 TO THIS SECTION, SUCH STANDARDS THAT AFFECT SUCH CONTRACT SHALL BE ANT APPLICABLE TO THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ON THE DAY FOLLOWING THE END OF THE 9 10 CURRENT TERM OF SUCH CONTRACT OR ON THE DATE ON WHICH THE CONTRACT IS TERMINATED, WHICHEVER IS EARLIER. SUCH STANDARDS SHALL APPLY TO ALL 11 12 CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED, RENEWED, MODIFIED, ALTERED OR AMENDED AFTER THE START OF THE TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN SCHOOL 13 14 YEAR.

15 S 3. The education law is amended by adding a new section 918-a to 16 read as follows:

17 S 918-A. LOCAL SCHOOL WELLNESS POLICIES. 1. ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, THOUSAND TWELVE, EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL, BOARD OF 18 TWO 19 COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND CHARTER SCHOOL THAT PARTICIPATES IN ANY PROGRAM AUTHORIZED BY THE RICHARD B. RUSSELL NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH 20 21 ACT OR THE CHILD NUTRITION ACT OF 1966, COLLECTIVELY REFERRED TO IN THIS 22 "SCHOOL DISTRICTS", SHALL BEGIN A REVIEW OF THEIR SCHOOL SECTION AS WELLNESS POLICIES TO DETERMINE THE EFFECTIVENESS AND ADEOUACY OF 23 SUCH 24 POLICY. IN THE COURSE OF SUCH REVIEW, THE GOVERNING BODY OR OFFICER OF 25 THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL:

26 A. INVOLVE, AT A MINIMUM, PARENTS AND GUARDIANS, STUDENTS, REPRESEN-TATIVES OF THE SCHOOL FOOD AUTHORITY, SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS, SCHOOL 27 NURSES OR OTHER HEALTH STAFF, CERTIFIED DIETICIANS/NUTRITIONISTS 28 OR 29 REGISTERED DIETICIANS IF AVAILABLE, PHYSICAL EDUCATION STAFF, AND TEACH-30 ERS;

CONSIDER ANY RECOMMENDATIONS MADE BY A SCHOOL DISTRICT NUTRITION 31 в. 32 ADVISORY COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED IN SECTION NINE HUNDRED EIGHTEEN OF THIS 33 ARTICLE, IF SUCH COMMITTEE HAS BEEN FORMED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT; 34

C. EVALUATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DISTRICT'S WELLNESS POLICY;

35 D. EVALUATE PROGRESS IN ACHIEVING GOALS FOR NUTRITION EDUCATION, AND OTHER SCHOOL BASED ACTIVITIES THAT ARE DESIGNED TO PROMOTE STUDENT WELL-36 37 NESS;

38 E. CONSIDER RECOMMENDATIONS FOR HEALTHY FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES, CLASS-39 ROOM EVENTS AND CELEBRATIONS;

40 F. (I) EVALUATE THE ROLE OF HEALTH EDUCATION AS PART OF THE CURRICULUM TO PROVIDE KNOWLEDGE AND TEACH SKILLS TO HELP STUDENTS ADOPT AND MAIN-41 TAIN LIFELONG, HEALTHY EATING PATTERNS IN BALANCE WITH PHYSICAL ACTIV-42 43 ITY; AND

44 (II) EVALUATE THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE RELEVANT COMPONENTS OF THE 45 DISTRICT CURRICULUM AND WELLNESS POLICY, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO 46 HEALTH EDUCATION AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION; AND

47 G. EVALUATE OPPORTUNITIES FOR INCREASED PHYSICAL ACTIVITY DURING THE 48 DAY.

49 2. THE REVIEW OF THE DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICY SHALL INCLUDE AT LEAST 50 ONE PUBLIC MEETING TO ALLOW FOR MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION BY THE PUBLIC. 51 SUCH PUBLIC MEETING MAY TAKE PLACE AS PART OF A REGULARLY SCHEDULED 52 BOARD MEETING.

3. A. THE INITIAL REVIEW OF DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICIES SHALL BE 53 54 COMPLETED BY JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN. FOLLOWING SUCH INITIAL 55 REVIEW, EACH DISTRICT SHALL COMMENCE A SUBSEQUENT REVIEW OF THEIR WELL-

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1 NESS POLICY, AT A MINIMUM, ONCE EVERY FIVE YEARS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 2 PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION.

B. CHANGES TO DISTRICT WELLNESS POLICIES AS A RESULT OF THESE REGULAR
REVIEWS SHALL BE ADOPTED BY THE BOARD AND MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC
IN A MANNER TO BE DETERMINED BY THE LOCAL BOARD.

6 4. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL MAKE THE CURRENT WELLNESS POLICY OF THE 7 DISTRICT AVAILABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT UPON REQUEST.

8 S 4. Subdivision 1 of section 2854 of the education law is amended by 9 adding a new paragraph (g) to read as follows:

10 (G) A CHARTER SCHOOL SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTIONS 11 NINE HUNDRED FIFTEEN-A AND NINE HUNDRED EIGHTEEN-A OF THIS CHAPTER.

12 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
