- AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to training, examination and certification of dog control officers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The agriculture and markets law is amended by adding a new 2 section 114-a to read as follows:

3 S 114-A. TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION OF DOG CONTROL OFFICERS. 1. THE 4 DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP A TRAINING, EXAMINATION AND CERTIFICATION 5 PROGRAM FOR DOG CONTROL OFFICERS, POLICE OFFICERS AND PEACE OFFICERS WHO 6 DEAL WITH ANIMAL CONTROL OR ANIMAL ABUSE ISSUES.

7 2. (A) EXCEPT AS IS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION, ANY PERSON APPOINTED AS A DOG CONTROL OFFICER SHALL, BEFORE APPOINTMENT 8 OR YEAR THEREAFTER, COMPLETE A COURSE OF TRAINING APPROVED BY 9 WITHIN ONE 10 THE DEPARTMENT AND SHALL TAKE AND PASS AN EXAMINATION GIVEN BY THE DEPARTMENT. ANY PERSON CURRENTLY EMPLOYED AS A DOG CONTROL OFFICER SHALL 11 12 COMPLETE THE TRAINING AND TAKE AND PASS THE EXAMINATION NO LATER THAN DECEMBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN. THE 13 TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO, BUT NOT REQUIRED FOR POLICE OFFICERS OR PEACE 14 15 OFFICERS WHO DEAL WITH ANIMAL CONTROL OR ANIMAL ABUSE ISSUES.

16 (B) A VETERINARIAN LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED 17 THIRTY-FIVE OF THE EDUCATION LAW SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE TRAINING 18 REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION.

19 3. THE TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE TRAIN-20 ING REGARDING:

21 (A) THE SCOPE OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DOG CONTROL OFFICER;

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(B) APPROPRIATE AND HUMANE HANDLING OF ANIMALS, INCLUDING TRANSPORTING 1 2 ANIMALS SAFELY, GENERAL ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROPER METHODS FOR CAPTURING 3 ANIMALS; 4 (C) THE LAWS AND RULES REGARDING DOG LICENSING, AND SEARCH AND 5 SEIZURE; 6 (D) CRISIS INTERVENTION AND OFFICER SAFETY; 7 (E) IDENTIFICATION OF RESOURCES TO HOUSE ANIMALS WHILE A CRIMINAL CASE 8 IS RESOLVED; 9 (F) REPORT WRITING AND COURTROOM TESTIMONY; 10 (G) DISPOSAL OF THE REMAINS OF DECEASED ANIMALS; (H) IDENTIFICATION AND NOTIFICATION OF AN ANIMAL'S OWNER; AND 11 (I) OTHER RELEVANT PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER. 12 4. THE GOVERNING BODY OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THAT APPOINTS A DOG 13 CONTROL OFFICER WHO FAILS TO OBTAIN CERTIFICATION WITHIN THE REQUIRED 14 15 TIME SHALL TERMINATE THE APPOINTMENT. 16 5. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL: (A) DETERMINE THE FORMAT OF THE TRAINING AND 17 CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS, INCLUDING AN INTERNET-BASED FORMAT IF THE DEPARTMENT DEEMS SUCH TO BE APPROPRIATE; 18 (B) ESTABLISH THE SCHEDULE FOR OFFERING TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS; 19 (C) ESTABLISH SUCH FEES AS THE DEPARTMENT DEEMS NECESSARY FOR TRAIN-20 21 ING, ADMISSION TO THE EXAMINATION, RE-EXAMINATION AND CERTIFICATION; AND (D) PROMULGATE RULES, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS REGARDING THE APPLICA-22 23 TION OF THE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION TOWARD RECERTIFICATION OR CONTIN-24 UING EDUCATION REOUIREMENTS. 25 S 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013, provided that, effective 26 immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or requ-27 lation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized and directed to be made and completed on or before 28 29 such effective date.
