- AN ACT to amend the economic development law, in relation to establishing the academic research information access act

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative findings. The public and private academic and 2 research libraries of New York individually license research and devel-3 opment information resources, access to which is vitally important to 4 the furtherance of an innovation-based economy. The primary obstacles 5 limiting access to these information resources both at institutions of higher education, and within the entrepreneurial community, are the high 6 7 cost of licensing agreements and restrictive contracts that inhibit collaboration. New companies and emerging industries will be encouraged 8 to locate their business in New York state adding to state revenues that 9 are derived by the existence of such private and public sector commerce. 10 Therefore, it is in the best interests of the economic development 11 and education interests of this state to enact the academic research 12 hiqher 13 information access act.

14 S 2. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as the 15 "academic research information access act".

16 S 3. Section 100 of the economic development law is amended by adding 17 two new subdivisions 32-a and 32-b to read as follows:

18 32-A. TO PROMOTE EFFICIENT UTILIZATION OF STATE RESOURCES FOR THE 19 PROCUREMENT OF INFORMATION, DATA AND CONTENT RESOURCES, FOR ACADEMIC, 20 RESEARCH AND COMMERCIAL INSTITUTIONS.

32-B. TO SECURE AGREEMENTS WITH PUBLIC, NOT-FOR-PROFIT AND FOR-PROFIT
 CORPORATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE PRODUCTIVE USE OF THE STATE RESOURCES
 NEEDED TO ENHANCE TEACHING, LEARNING AND RESEARCH.

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S 4. The economic development law is amended by adding a new article 1 2 18 to read as follows: 3

## ARTICLE 18

## ACADEMIC RESEARCH INFORMATION ACCESS

SECTION 360. ACADEMIC RESEARCH INFORMATION ACCESS.

6 360. ACADEMIC RESEARCH INFORMATION ACCESS. 1. THE DEPARTMENT, IN S 7 COOPERATION WITH THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK AND THE NEW YORK STATE 8 BOARD OF REGENTS, SHALL ESTABLISH CONTRACTS AND LICENSES FOR THE PROVISION OF PROPRIETARY ELECTRONIC RESOURCES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMIT-9 10 TO ACADEMIC, PROFESSIONAL AND INDUSTRY JOURNALS, REFERENCE HANDBOOKS ED AND MANUALS, RESEARCH TRACKING TOOLS, INDEXES AND ABSTRACTS. 11 THEBENE-12 FICIARIES OF THESE INFORMATION RESOURCES WILL OPERATE PRIMARILY IN THE FIELDS OF SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MEDICAL RESEARCH 13 AND DEVELOPMENT, AND INCLUDE RESEARCHERS, SCHOLARS, FACULTY AND STUDENTS AT 14 15 MEMBER AND ASSOCIATED INSTITUTIONS OF THE NEW YORK STATE HIGHER EDUCA-16 INITIATIVE, AND OTHER INSTITUTIONS REGISTERED BY THE STATE EDUCA-TION 17 TION DEPARTMENT OFFICE OF COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY EVALUATION (OCUE) AND RESEARCHERS, ENTREPRENEURS, OTHER INNOVATORS EXISTING IN BUSINESS INCU-18 19 BATORS ALIGNED WITH THE NEW YORK STATE HIGHER EDUCATION INITIATIVE 20 INSTITUTIONS, RECIPIENTS OF GRANTS FROM THE NEW MEMBER AND ASSOCIATED 21 YORK STATE FOUNDATION FOR SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND INNOVATIONS, THE EMPIRE STATE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, AND OTHER BUSINESSES WITH FIFTY OR 22 FEWER EMPLOYEES WHO OTHERWISE MEET THE DEFINITION OF A QUALIFIED EMERG-23 24 ING TECHNOLOGY COMPANY AS DEFINED BY PARAGRAPH (C) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF 25 SECTION THIRTY-ONE HUNDRED TWO-E OF THE PUBLIC AUTHORITIES LAW.

26 2. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CREATE OR UTILIZE AN ADVISORY BOARD REPRESEN-27 TATIVE OF THE ACADEMIC AND RESEARCH LIBRARIES FROM THE SMALL, MEDIUM AND 28 LARGE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE 29 AND THE SMALL BUSINESS COMMUNITIES FOR THE EXPRESS PURPOSE OF MAKING REGULAR RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT REGARDING THE SELECTION AND 30 MAINTENANCE OF INFORMATION RESOURCES. 31

32 3. AGREEMENTS REACHED UNDER THE ACADEMIC RESEARCH INFORMATION ACCESS 33 NEGOTIATED BY A STANDING PUBLIC ENTITY THAT COMPLIES PROGRAM SHALL BE WITH STATE PROCUREMENT CONTRACTING PROCEDURES AND IS 34 SELECTED BY THE 35 ADVISORY BOARD PURSUANT TO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AMONG THE NEW YORK STATE HIGHER EDUCATION INITIATIVE, AND THE NEW YORK STATE 36 LIBRARY 37 AND OTHER SUCH STANDING PUBLIC ENTITY AS NECESSARY. SUCH NEGOTIATING 38 ENTITY MAY, AS PART OF THE TERMS OF AN ADOPTED CONTRACT, BE COMPENSATED FROM FUNDS APPROPRIATED FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION. 39

40 4. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PROMULGATE SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS ARE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE. 41

S 5. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 42 43 shall have become a law; provided that, effective immediately, the it 44 addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary 45 for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized and directed to be made and completed on or before such effective date. 46
