AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the practice of pharmacy

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 6801 of the education law, as amended by chapter 563 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

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3 S 6801. Definition of practice of pharmacy. 1. The practice of the 4 profession of pharmacy is defined as the administering, preparing, 5 compounding, preserving, or the dispensing of drugs, medicines and ther-6 apeutic devices on the basis of prescriptions or other legal authority.

7 2. A licensed pharmacist may execute a non-patient specific regimen 8 prescribed or ordered by a licensed physician or certified nurse practi-9 tioner, pursuant to rules and regulations promulgated by the commission-10 er. When a licensed pharmacist administers an immunizing agent, he or 11 she shall:

12 (a) report such administration to the patient's attending primary 13 health care practitioner or practitioners, if any, pursuant to rules and 14 regulations of the commissioner;

15 (b) provide information to the patient on the importance of having a 16 primary health care practitioner, developed by the commissioner of 17 health; and

18 (c) report such administration, absent of any individually identifi-19 able health information, to the department of health in a manner 20 required by the commissioner of health.

WHEN A LICENSED PHARMACIST CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO ADMINISTER 21 IMMUNIZATIONS WITHIN A FACILITY LICENSED UNDER ARTICLE 22 TWENTY-EIGHT OF 23 PUBLIC HEALTH LAW OR IN AN IMMUNIZATION OUTREACH PROGRAM AUTHORIZED THE 24 BY THE STATE OR A COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT, THE IMMUNIZATION SHALL BE 25 THAT ENTITY AND THE RECORD OF SUCH ENTITY SHALL MEET THE RECORDED BY REQUIREMENTS IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS SUBDIVISION. 26

3. No pharmacist shall administer immunizing agents without receivingtraining satisfactory to the commissioner and the commissioner of health

1 which shall include, but not be limited to, techniques for screening 2 individuals and obtaining informed consent; techniques of adminis-3 tration; indications, precautions and contraindications in the use of 4 agent or agents; record keeping of immunization and information; and 5 handling emergencies, including anaphylaxis and needlesticks.

6 4. The commissioner of health, in consultation with the commissioner, 7 shall prepare and submit a report to the governor and the legislature, 8 on or before December thirty-first, two thousand eleven, reporting the results and evaluating the effectiveness and impact, if any, of imple-9 10 mentation of subdivision two of this section upon the supply of such 11 immunizing agents for the prevention of influenza and pneumococcal disease, upon the geographical distribution of such agents, and upon the 12 13 distribution of such agents among health care providers, including physicians, and pharmacies in New York state. 14

15 5. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, A PHARMACY STUDENT 16 PARTICIPATING IN AN INTERNSHIP OR RESIDENCY PROGRAM WHO HAS SUCCESSFULLY 17 COMPLETED EVERY REQUIREMENT ESTABLISHED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE 18 ADMINISTRATION MAY, UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF A CERTIFICATE OF 19 PHARMACIST WHO HAS A VALID CERTIFICATE OF ADMINISTRATION ISSUED ΒY THE 20 DEPARTMENT, ADMINISTER AN IMMUNIZATION AS PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION.

21 S 2. Subdivision 22 of section 6802 of the education law, as added by 22 chapter 563 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

22. "Administer", for the purpose of section sixty-eight hundred one 23 of this article, means the direct application of an immunizing agent [to 24 25 adults], whether by injection, ingestion or any other means, pursuant to 26 a patient specific order or non-patient specific regimen prescribed or 27 ordered [issued by a physician or certified nurse practitioner who has a practice site in the county in which the immunization is 28 administered. 29 However if the county where the immunization is to be administered has a population of seventy-five thousand or less, then the licensed physician 30 or certified nurse practitioner may be in an adjoining county]. Such 31 32 administration shall be limited to [immunizing agents to prevent influ-33 enza or pneumococcal disease] IMMUNIZATIONS AND VACCINES FORMULATED IN ADULT DOSAGE and medications required for emergency treatment of anaphy-34 35 laxis.

36 S 3. Subdivision 2 of section 6828 of the education law, as added by 37 chapter 563 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

2. The fee for a certificate of administration shall be one hundred 39 dollars [and shall be paid on a triennial basis]. A certificate may be 40 suspended or revoked in the same manner as a license to practice pharma-41 cy.

42 S 4. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 43 have become a law:

(a) provided, however, that the amendments to section 6801 of the education law made by section one of this act shall not affect the expiration of such section and shall be deemed to expire therewith;

47 (b) provided, further, that the amendments to subdivision 22 of 48 section 6802 of the education law made by section two of this act shall 49 not affect the repeal of such subdivision and shall be deemed repealed 50 therewith; and

51 (c) provided, further, that the amendments to subdivision 2 of section 52 6828 of the education law made by section three of this act shall not 53 affect the repeal of such section and shall be deemed repealed there-54 with.
