AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to raising the level of immunity of children against meningococcal disease

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 613 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 36 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:

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- 1. (a) The commissioner shall develop and supervise the execution of a program of immunization, surveillance and testing, to raise to the high-5 6 est reasonable level the immunity of the children of the state against 7 communicable diseases including, but not limited to, influenza, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps, rubella, haemophilus influenzae type b (Hib), 8 diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, varicella, hepatitis B, pneumococcal 9 10 disease, MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE, and the immunity of adults of the state against diseases identified by the commissioner, including but not 11 12 limited to influenza, smallpox, and hepatitis. The commissioner shall encourage the municipalities in the state to develop and shall assist 13 them in the development and the execution of local programs of inocu-14 15 lation to raise the immunity of the children and adults of each municipality to the highest reasonable level. Such programs shall include 16 provision of vaccine, surveillance of vaccine effectiveness by means of 17 laboratory tests, serological testing of individuals and educational 18 efforts to inform health care providers and target populations or their 19 parents, if they are minors, of the facts relative to these diseases and 20 21 inoculation to prevent their occurrence.
  - (b) In connection with efforts to raise the immunity of children against influenza, the commissioner shall administer a program of influenza education to the families of children ages six months to eighteen years of age who attend licensed and registered day care programs, nursery schools, pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, school age child care

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programs, public schools or non-public schools. Such program shall include educational materials on influenza and the benefits of influenza 3 immunizations to be made available on the department's website in anticipation of times of highest risk for contraction of influenza as determined by the commissioner. The office of children and family services, 5 6 department of education, and the New York city department of health 7 and mental hygiene shall, as part of their routine notification proc-8 esses, notify licensed and registered day care programs, nursery 9 schools, pre-kindergarten programs, kindergarten programs, school age 10 child care programs, public schools and non-public schools that the information regarding immunizations for influenza is free and accessible 11 12 on the department's website and such information shall be posted in such 13 licensed and registered day care programs, nursery schools, pre-kinder-14 gartens, kindergartens, school age child care programs, public schools 15 and non-public schools in plain view in anticipation of such times of 16 highest risk for contraction of influenza as determined by the commis-17 sioner.

- (c) IN CONNECTION WITH EFFORTS TO RAISE THE IMMUNITY OF CHILDREN AGAINST MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADMINISTER A PROGRAM OF MENINGOCOCCAL EDUCATION TO THE FAMILIES OF CHILDREN TO EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE WHO ATTEND SCHOOL AGE CHILD CARE PROGRAMS, PUBLIC SCHOOLS OR NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS. SUCH PROGRAM INCLUDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS REGARDING THE MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE, THE BENEFITS OF MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE IMMUNIZATIONS, APPROPRIATE VACCINE, PURSUANT TO THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND THEPREVENTION'S ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON IMMUNIZATION PRACTICES, INFORMATION ON HOW ADOLESCENTS MAY ACCESS THE VACCINE. INCLUDE SUCH MATERIALS SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE THE DEPARTMENT'S ONWEBSITE. EDUCATION DEPARTMENT AND THE NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL, AS PART OF THEIR ROUTINE NOTIFICATION PROCESSES, SCHOOL AGE CHILD CARE PROGRAMS, PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS THAT THE INFORMATION REGARDING IMMUNIZATIONS FOR MENINGOCOCCAL ACCESSIBLE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE AND SUCH FREE AND INFORMATION SHALL BE POSTED IN SUCH SCHOOL AGE CHILD CARE PROGRAMS, PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN PLAIN VIEW.
- (D) The commissioner shall invite and encourage the active assistance and cooperation in such education activities of: the medical societies, organizations of other licensed health personnel, hospitals, corporations subject to article forty-three of the insurance law, trade unions, trade associations, parents and teachers and their associations, organizations of child care resource and referral agencies, the media of mass communication, and such other voluntary groups and organizations of citizens as he or she shall deem appropriate. The public health council, the department of education, the department of family assistance, and the department of mental hygiene shall provide the commissioner with such assistance in carrying out the program as he or she shall request. All other state agencies shall also render such assistance as the commissioner may reasonably require for this program. Nothing in this subdivision shall authorize mandatory immunization of adults or children, except as provided in sections twenty-one hundred sixty-four and twenty-one hundred sixty-five of this chapter.
- S 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012; provided, that, effective immediately, any actions necessary to implement the provisions of this act on its effective date are authorized and directed to be completed on or before such date.
