AN ACT to authorize First Unitarian Society to file applications for real property tax exemptions

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the assessor of the city of Schenectady is hereby authorized to accept from First Unitarian Society, applications for exemptions from real property taxes pursuant to section 420-a of the real property tax law 5 for the 2008 and 2009 assessment rolls for the parcels owned by First Unitarian Society located in the city of Schenectady at 1227 Wendell Avenue, Schenectady, otherwise known as section 39.67, block 1, lot 3; 7 8 1248 Wendell Street, otherwise known as section 39.68, block 1, 34.1. If accepted, the applications shall be reviewed as if they had 9 been received on or before the taxable status date established for such 10 rolls. If satisfied that First Unitarian Society would otherwise be 11 entitled to such exemptions if it had filed the applications 12 for the 13 exemptions by the appropriate taxable status dates, the assessor of the 14 city of Schenectady may upon approval by the city council of such city, grant exemptions from taxation based on the 2008 and 2009 assessment 15 rolls and owing by such not-for-profit organization on the effective 16 17 date of this act, and make appropriate correction of the subject rolls. If such exemptions are granted and if such not-for-profit organization 18 19 shall have paid any tax with respect to the subject rolls, the governing 20 body or tax department may, in its sole discretion, provide for the refund of those taxes paid and cancel taxes, fines, penalties or inter-21 22 est remaining unpaid.

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
