- AN ACT creating the LaGrange public library district in the town of LaGrange, New York; and to amend chapter 672 of the laws of 1993 amending the public authorities law relating to the construction and financing for certain public libraries, in relation to providing for financing through the dormitory authority

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Creation of library district. Notwithstanding the 1 Section 1. provisions of any general, special, or local law to the contrary, there 2 is hereby created and established in the town of LaGrange, county of 3 4 Dutchess, a public library district which shall be known as the LaGrange 5 public library district, hereinafter referred to as the district, and 6 which shall consist of all the territory within the town of LaGrange, 7 hereinafter referred to as the town. The district will operate a public 8 library to be known as the LaGrange public library.

9 S 2. Election. 1. The district herein described shall not come into 10 existence unless and until it is approved with the initial budget in 11 support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of the existing 12 LaGrange library, and nine trustees are elected by a vote of the majori-13 ty of the qualified voters voting in an election held, not later than 14 September 30, 2013, pursuant to the following provisions:

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1 Upon receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five voters 2 qualified to vote at a general election in the town, the board of trus-3 tees of the existing LaGrange library shall conduct an election at which 4 the issues shall be:

(a) whether the public library district herein described with the initial budget in support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of 5 6 7 the existing LaGrange library shall be created or not; and 8

(b) the election of nine trustees as provided by this act.

The board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library shall give 9 10 notice of such election by publication of notice at least twice in one 11 or more newspapers having a general circulation in the district to be 12 The first publication of such notice shall be not less than served. thirteen days and not more than twenty days prior to the date of such 13 14 election. In addition, the board of trustees of the existing LaGrange 15 library shall cause copies of such notice to be posted conspicuously in 16 three public places in the district at least thirteen days prior to the date of such election. Such notice shall specify the date and time when 17 and the place where such election will be held and the issues to be 18 19 decided at such election. The board of trustees of the existing LaGrange 20 library shall designate a resident qualified voter of such district to 21 act as chairperson of any election of such district and shall designate 22 not less than two nor more than four resident qualified voters to act as election inspectors and ballot clerks at such election. No trustee of 23 the existing LaGrange library shall serve as chairperson or 24 as an 25 election inspector or ballot clerk. The board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library may adopt a resolution providing that such chair-26 person, election inspectors and ballot clerks shall be paid reasonable 27 28 compensation for their respective services at such election. Every 29 voter who is a resident of the district and otherwise qualified to vote 30 at a general election in the town shall be qualified to vote at said election. The board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library may, to 31 32 the extent authorized by law, authorize the use of absentee ballots for 33 the election. After the polls have closed at such election, the election inspectors and the ballot clerks shall immediately canvass publicly the 34 35 ballots cast and the chairperson of the election shall publicly announce the result. Within seventy-two hours thereafter, the chairperson, 36 37 election inspectors and ballot clerks shall execute and file a certif-38 icate of the result of the canvass with the board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library and the town clerk. If a majority of the 39 40 voters approve the formation of the district with the initial budget in support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library, then the district shall come into existence on the terms and conditions set forth in this act. 41 42 43

44 2. In the event that the district is created, there shall be an annual 45 election conducted by the board of trustees of the LaGrange public library district in accordance with the provisions of subdivision one of 46 47 this section at a time to be set by the board of trustees of the 48 district, at which election vacancies on the board of trustees shall be filled and at which any proposed budget which the board shall determine 49 50 to submit to the voters pursuant to section four of this act shall be submitted to the voters. 51

52 3. Candidates for the office of member of the board of trustees of the LaGrange public library district shall be nominated by petition. No 53 54 vacancy to be filled on the board of trustees shall be considered a 55 separate, specific office. A separate petition shall be required to nominate each candidate for a vacancy on the board. Each petition shall 56

be directed to the secretary of the board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library, shall be signed by at least twenty-five qualified 1 2 3 the district, shall state the residence of each signer, and voters of 4 shall state the name and residence of the candidate. In the event that 5 any such nominees shall withdraw their candidacy prior to the election, 6 such person shall not be considered a candidate unless a new petition 7 nominating such person in the same manner and within the same time limi-8 tation applicable to other candidates is filed with the secretary of the board of trustees of the existing LaGrange library. Each petition shall 9 10 filed with the secretary of the board of trustees of the existing be 11 LaGrange library, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., not later than the thirtieth day before the election at which the candidates 12 13 nominated are to be elected. In the event that the new district is 14 created, petitions nominating candidates for the board of trustees for 15 all future elections shall be filed with the secretary of the LaGrange 16 public library district.

S 3. Organization and structure. The LaGrange public library district 17 shall be managed, operated, and controlled by a board of trustees 18 19 consisting of nine members. The trustees shall take office at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees following their election. At 20 21 the first regular meeting of the board of trustees of the district, the 22 trustees shall determine when the terms of office of each member shall expire as follows: the trustees receiving the first, second, and third 23 highest number of votes shall each serve for three years, the trustees 24 25 receiving the fourth, fifth, and sixth highest number of votes shall 26 each serve for two years, and the trustees receiving the seventh, eighth, and ninth highest number of votes shall each serve for one year. 27 As vacancies occur due to expiration of terms of office, trustees shall 28 29 be elected by the voters of the district at the election provided for by 30 this act to serve three year terms, such terms to commence at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees of the district next following 31 their election. All other vacancies caused by resignation, removal, 32 33 death, or inability to serve shall be filled by appointment by the board of trustees of the district until the next election, at which time the 34 vacancy shall be filled by election for the remaining portion of the 35 36 term. At any election where one or more persons are to be elected for 37 the unexpired portion of a term or terms, the candidate receiving the largest number of votes shall be entitled to the full three year term 38 39 and the candidates receiving the next highest number of votes shall be 40 entitled, in decreasing order of the respective numbers of votes, to the 41 vacancy or vacancies, in decreasing order of the length of the unexpired portion or portions of a term or terms. Only qualified voters of the district shall be eligible for election to the board of trustees. The 42 43 44 board of trustees at its first meeting after each annual election shall 45 elect or appoint a president and vice-president, who shall be members of the board, and a secretary, treasurer, and such other officers as they 46 47 deem necessary. If the board so determines, the offices of secretary and 48 treasurer may be held by individuals who are not members of the board of trustees and, in that event, such officers may, if the board so deter-mines, receive compensation as fixed by resolution of the board. 49 50

51 S 4. Finances. 1. The initial budget to support the district shall be 52 determined by a vote of the voters of the district in the initial 53 election as hereinafter provided for. All future budgets that increase 54 or decrease the district's proposed tax levy as compared to the tax levy 55 in the preceding fiscal year's budget shall be submitted to the resi-56 dents voting at the annual election of trustees pursuant to section two 1 of this act. Funds voted for library purposes at the initial election 2 and at all future elections shall be considered an annual appropriation 3 therefor and shall be levied and collected yearly by the town for the 4 district in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes in the 5 town.

6 2. The board of trustees of the district shall annually file with the 7 clerk of the town on or before the first day of November an estimate of 8 the proposed budget including costs of library services to be raised by 9 levy for the library district in the fiscal year beginning on the first 10 day of January of the next year. The town shall not make any change in 11 the estimate of revenues or expenditures submitted by the board of the 12 district in preparation of its preliminary budget.

3. The town board of the town of LaGrange shall levy a tax against the 13 14 real property lying within the district for the amount to be raised by 15 tax as approved by the voters of the district. The town board shall pay the full amount of the tax levy approved by the voters over to the trea-16 17 surer of the district pursuant to the schedule set forth in this 18 The town board shall annually pay over to the treasurer of the section. 19 district on or before the thirtieth day after its tax collection period ends, the full amount of the levy due. If necessary to meet this sched-20 21 ule, the town board may issue tax anticipation notes pursuant to article 22 II of the local finance law to obtain the necessary moneys therefor.

4. The town board of the town shall have the power to authorize, sell, 23 issue bonds, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness pursuant to 24 and 25 the local finance law in order to permit the district to provide facilities or improved facilities for library purposes. Upon written request 26 from the board of trustees of the district, after approval by the quali-27 28 fied voters of such district, the town board shall authorize, sell, and issue such bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness as are 29 30 necessary to accomplish the improvements specified in the notice. The proceeds of such bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness shall 31 32 paid to the treasurer of the district and maintained in a segregated be 33 account in accordance with section 165.00 of the local finance law and 34 expended by the treasurer only on specific authorization by the board of 35 trustees.

5. The board of trustees of the district may accept on behalf of the district any absolute gift, devise, or bequest of real or personal property and such conditional gifts, devises, or bequests as it shall by resolution approve.

40 The treasurer of the district shall be custodian of all funds of 6. the district, including gifts and trust funds paid over to the trustees. 41 The board of trustees may authorize the investment of funds in the 42 43 custody of the treasurer in the same manner in which town funds may be 44 invested. Proceeds of obligations received from the town may be invested 45 in accordance with section 165.00 of the local finance law. The town of LaGrange shall promptly pay over to the district all monies which belong 46 are raised for the district. No monies shall be disbursed by the 47 to or 48 treasurer of the district except after audit by the board of trustees. 49 The board of trustees of the district shall audit all claims and shall 50 order the payment thereof, except as otherwise provided by this section. 51 No such claims shall be audited or ordered paid by the trustees unless an itemized voucher therefor shall be presented to the board of trustees 52 for audit and allowance. The provisions of this section shall not be 53 54 applicable to payment of utility costs, claims of fixed salaries, and 55 amounts which the district may be required to pay on account of retirement contributions for past or current services to officers and employ-56

1 ees of the district. The treasurer shall keep such records in such 2 manner as the board of trustees may require.

3 S 5. Charter, commencement of operations, and transfer of property and 4 employees. The initially elected trustees of the district shall, within 5 ninety days from the date of approval of the district by the voters of 6 the district, apply to the board of regents for a charter as a public 7 library. Upon the granting of such a charter by the board of regents, 8 title to all liabilities and assets, including all property, both real and personal, and both tangible and intangible, all trust and other funds, and all other obligations, now held by the existing LaGrange 9 10 11 library shall be transferred to, vested in, and be acquired by the district established by this act. The above provisions for transfer to, 12 13 vesting and acquisition of real and personal property, both tangible and 14 intangible, and all trust and other funds, are effectuated by operation 15 of law pursuant to the authority of this act, except that, for purposes of clarity of real property records, deeds of conveyance shall be 16 executed and filed for any parcels of real property. Upon the transfer 17 18 of all such property, the existing LaGrange library shall be deemed 19 dissolved. Upon the granting of such charter by the board of regents, 20 all employees of the existing LaGrange library shall become employees of 21 the district upon the same terms and conditions of employment and at the 22 same rate of pay as their previous employment by the existing LaGrange 23 library.

24 S 6. Ad valorem levy. The several lots and parcels of land within the 25 area of the district are hereby determined to be benefited by the 26 library facilities and devices existing as of the effective date of this and the town of LaGrange is hereby authorized to assess, levy, and 27 act, collect the necessary expenses of operation, maintenance, and repair 28 of such facilities and services and such capital improvements, including 29 30 debt service on bonds, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness of the town issued for the purpose of the LaGrange public library district, as 31 32 may be hereafter authorized pursuant to the provisions of this act from 33 such lots and parcels of land in the same manner and at the same time as 34 other town charges.

35 S 7. Education law. Except as otherwise provided by this act, the 36 provisions of the education law relating to public libraries shall be 37 applicable to the district established by this act.

38 S 8. The district is deemed a special district which is separate and 39 distinct from the town for all purposes, including but not limited to 40 management, appropriations, and expenditures. Any tax levy for the 41 district shall not be charged or imputed to the town, and shall instead 42 be charged or imputed to the district, for purposes of any general or 43 special laws enacted by the legislature.

44 S 9. Section 5 of chapter 672 of the laws of 1993, amending the public 45 authorities law relating to the construction and financing of facilities for certain public libraries, as separately amended by chapter 46 533 of 47 2011 and chapter 23 of the laws of 2012, the forty-second laws of the 48 undesignated paragraph as added by a chapter of the laws of 2012 amending chapter 672 of the laws of 1993, amending the public authorities law relating to the construction and financing of facilities for certain 49 50 public libraries, relating to including the Guilderland public library 51 within the provisions of such chapter, as proposed in legislative bill 52 numbers S. 6450-A and A. 9236-A, and the forty-third undesignated para-53 54 graph as added by a chapter of the laws of 2012 amending chapter 672 of 55 the laws of 1993, amending the public authorities law relating to the construction and financing of facilities for certain public libraries, 56

relating to including the Ethelbert B. Crawford public library within 1 the provisions of such chapter, as proposed in legislative bills numbers 2 3 S. 6287 and A. 9159, is amended to read as follows: 4 S 5.
