AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring licensing of rehabilitation counselors

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new article 152 to 1 2 read as follows: 3 ARTICLE 152 4 REHABILITATION COUNSELING 5 SECTION 7550. INTRODUCTION. 6 7551. DEFINITION OF THE PRACTICE OF "REHABILITATION COUNSELING". 7 7552. THIS ARTICLE APPLIES TO THE PROFESSION OF REHA-17 BILITATION COUNSELING. THE GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL PROFESSIONS CONTAINED IN ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY OF THIS TITLE 18 SHALL APPLY TΟ 19 THIS ARTICLE. S 7551. DEFINITION OF THE PRACTICE OF "REHABILITATION COUNSELING". THE 20 21 PRACTICE OF THE PROFESSION OF REHABILITATION COUNSELING IS DEFINED AS A 22 SYSTEMATIC PROCESS WHICH ASSISTS PERSONS WITH PHYSICAL, MENTAL, DEVELOP-MENTAL, COGNITIVE, AND EMOTIONAL DISABILITIES TO ACHIEVE THEIR PERSONAL, 23 24 CAREER, AND INDEPENDENT LIVING GOALS IN THE MOST INTEGRATED SETTING 25 POSSIBLE THROUGH THE APPLICATION OF THE COUNSELING PROCESS. SELING PROCESS INVOLVES COMMUNICATION, GOAL SETTING, AND BENEFICIAL 1 GROWTH OR CHANGE THROUGH SELF-ADVOCACY, PSYCHOLOGICAL, VOCATIONAL, 2 SOCIAL, AND BEHAVIORAL INTERVENTIONS. PRACTICE OF REHABILITATION COUNSELING AND USE OF THE TITLES S "REHABILITATION COUNSELOR" AND "LICENSED REHABILITATION COUNSELOR". ONLY 23 A PERSON LICENSED OR EXEMPT UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL PRACTICE REHABILI-24 25 TATION COUNSELING OR USE THE TITLE "REHABILITATION COUNSELOR". ONLY A PERSON LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL USE THE TITLE "LICENSED REHA-26 27 BILITATION COUNSELOR" OR ANY OTHER DESIGNATION TENDING TO IMPLY THAT THE 28 PERSON IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE REHABILITATION COUNSELING. 29 S 7553. STATE BOARD FOR REHABILITATION COUNSELING. 1. A STATE BOARD 30 FOR REHABILITATION COUNSELING SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS ON RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSISTING THE 31 32 BOARD OF REGENTS AND THE DEPARTMENT ON MATTERS OF LICENSING AND REGU-LATION. THE BOARD SHALL BE COMPOSED OF AT LEAST THREE REHABILITATION 33 COUNSELORS LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE AND AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC 34 35 REPRESENTATIVE WHO DOES NOT HOLD INTERESTS IN THE ORGANIZATION, FINANC-ING, OR DELIVERY OF REHABILITATION COUNSELING SERVICES. MEMBERS OF THE 36 37 FIRST BOARD NEED NOT BE LICENSED PRIOR TO THEIR APPOINTMENT TO THE 38 BOARD. AN EXECUTIVE SECRETARY TO THE BOARD SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE 39 BOARD OF REGENTS ON RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER. 40 2. THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL BE FIVE YEARS; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED, ONE SHALL 41 BE APPOINTED FOR THREE YEARS, ONE SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR FOUR YEARS, AND 42 43 TWO SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR FIVE YEARS. ANY VACANCY ON THE BOARD SHALL BE FILLED BY APPOINTMENT FOR THE REMAINDER OF SUCH MEMBER'S TERM IN ACCORD-44 45 ANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION. 3. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT; 52 2. EXAMINATION: PASS THE EXAMINATION OF THE COMMISSION ON REHABILI-53 54 TATION COUNSELING CERTIFICATION (CRCC); BE CERTIFIED BY THAT BODY AS A 55 CERTIFIED REHABILITATION COUNSELOR (CRC);

56 3. AGE: BE AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE;

1 2	4. CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-MENT; AND
2 3 4	5. FEES: PAY A FEE OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR ADMISSION TO LICENSURE AND FOR AN INITIAL LICENSE; AND A FEE OF ONE
5	HUNDRED SEVENTY DOLLARS FOR EACH TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION PERIOD.
6	S 7555. LIMITED PERMITS. THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS FOR A LIMITED
7	PERMIT SHALL APPLY TO THE PROFESSION LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE:
8	1. THE DEPARTMENT MAY ISSUE A LIMITED PERMIT TO AN APPLICANT WHOSE
9	QUALIFICATIONS HAVE BEEN APPROVED FOR ADMISSION TO THE CRCC EXAMINATION
10	IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS PROMULGATED THEREFOR.
11	2. LIMITED PERMITS SHALL BE FOR ONE YEAR AND MAY BE RENEWED, AT THE
12	DISCRETION OF THE DEPARTMENT, FOR ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR.
13	3. THE FEE FOR EACH LIMITED PERMIT AND FOR EACH RENEWAL THEREOF SHALL
14	BE SEVENTY DOLLARS.
15	S 7556. EXEMPT PERSONS. 1. THIS ARTICLE SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO
16	AFFECT OR PREVENT QUALIFIED PHYSICIANS, NURSES, PHYSICAL OR OCCUPATIONAL
17	THERAPISTS, PSYCHOLOGISTS, COUNSELORS, CREATIVE ARTS THERAPISTS, PSYCHO-
18 19	ANALYSTS, SOCIAL WORKERS OR MEMBERS OF THE CLERGY FROM PERFORMING THE WORK OF A REHABILITATION COUNSELOR WHERE INCIDENT TO THE PRACTICE OF
19 20	THEIR PROFESSIONS, PROVIDED THEY DO NOT HOLD THEMSELVES OUT TO THE
20 21	PUBLIC BY ANY TITLE AS BEING ENGAGED IN THE PRACTICE OF REHABILITATION
22	COUNSELING.
23	2. THIS ARTICLE SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO AFFECT OR PREVENT A REHABIL-
24	ITATION COUNSELING STUDENT FROM ENGAGING IN CLINICAL PRACTICE UNDER THE
25	SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED OR CERTIFIED REHABILITATION COUNSELOR AS PART
26	OF A PROGRAM CONDUCTED IN AN APPROVED AGENCY AFFILIATED WITH AN ACCRED-
27	ITED SCHOOL OF REHABILITATION COUNSELING WHICH IS APPROVED BY THE
28	DEPARTMENT.
29	S 7557. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. 1. ANY NONEXEMPT PERSON PRACTICING THE
30	PROFESSION TO BE LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE SHALL APPLY FOR A
31	LICENSE FOR PRACTICE OF SUCH PROFESSION WITHIN ONE YEAR OF THE EFFECTIVE
32	DATE OF SUCH PROFESSION. IF SUCH PERSON DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS
33	FOR A LICENSE ESTABLISHED WITHIN THIS ARTICLE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
34	LICENSE WITHOUT EXAMINATION IF THE APPLICANT SUBMITS EVIDENCE SATISFAC-
35	TORY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HAVING BEEN ENGAGED IN THE PRACTICE OF SUCH
36	PROFESSION FOR AT LEAST FIVE OF THE IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING EIGHT YEARS.
37	SUCH EXEMPTION SHALL BE IN EFFECT FOR ONLY ONE YEAR FOLLOWING THE EFFEC-
38	TIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION.
39	2. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL APPROVE ALL FEES AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE. SUCH FEES SHALL BE SET IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE
40 41	ARTICLE. SUCH FEES SHALL BE SET IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE EXPENSES OF ADMINISTERING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.
42	3. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMULGATE ANY RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY
43	TO ESTABLISH PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS OF REHABILITATION COUNSELORS AND ANY
44	OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO ADMINISTER THE PROVISIONS OF
45	THIS ARTICLE.
46	S 7558. SEPARABILITY. IF ANY SECTION OF THIS ARTICLE, OR PART THEREOF,
47	SHALL BE ADJUDGED BY ANY COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION TO BE INVALID,
48	SUCH JUDGMENT SHALL NOT AFFECT, IMPAIR OR INVALIDATE THE REMAINDER OF
49	ANY OTHER SECTION OR PART THEREOF.
50	S 2. This act shall take effect on the five hundred forty-fifth day
51	after it shall have become a law; provided, however, that any rules and
52	regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this act on its
53	effective date are authorized and directed to be promulgated, amended
54	and repealed on or before such date.
