AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to granting the attorney general jurisdiction to investigate and prosecute police misconduct

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 63 of the executive law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 16 to read as follows:
- 3 INVESTIGATE THE ALLEGED COMMISSION OF ANY CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES COMMITTED BY A POLICE OFFICER IN CONNECTION WITH THE 5 OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES, AND PROSECUTE ANY SUCH PERSON OR 6 PERSONS BELIEVED TO HAVE COMMITTED SUCH CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES 7 CONNECTION WITH THEPERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES. THE 8 ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY ONLY EXERCISE THE JURISDICTION PROVIDED BY THIS 9 UPON A WRITTEN FINDING THAT SUCH JURISDICTION IS NECESSARY SUBDIVISION 10 BECAUSE; (A) OF A LACK OF ALTERNATIVE PROSECUTORIAL RESOURCES 11 ADEOUATELY INVESTIGATE AND PROSECUTE SUCH CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES OR, (B) THE EXERCISE OF SUCH JURISDICTION IS NECESSARY 12 TO ENSURE THE 13 CONFIDENCE OF THE PUBLIC ΙN THEJUDICIAL SYSTEM. IN ALLSUCH PROCEEDINGS, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY APPEAR IN PERSON OR BY HIS OR HER 14 15 DEPUTY OR ASSISTANT BEFORE ANY COURT OR GRAND JURY AND EXERCISE ALL OF THE POWERS AND PERFORM ALL OF THE DUTIES WITH RESPECT TO SUCH ACTIONS OR 16 PROCEEDINGS WHICH THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY WOULD OTHERWISE BE AUTHORIZED OR 17 18 REOUIRED TO EXERCISE OR PERFORM.
- $\tilde{S}$  2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 20 have become a law.
