AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to the sale of monuments and memorials

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 454 of the general business law,
2 as amended by chapter 390 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as
3 follows:
- 4 2. Each sale of a memorial shall only be evidenced by a written
5 contract which shall be signed by all the parties to the contract, which
6 shall be dated, and which shall be completely separate and may not be
7 included in any other contract, agreement, purchase order, price list,
8 itemization of funeral services and merchandise selected or like docu-
9 ment reflecting the purchase by a consumer of any other real or personal
10 property or service related to the burial, cremation, or other disposi-
11 tion of the remains of a deceased person. For purposes of this section,
12 the pourer of a foundation shall not be considered the seller of a foun-
13 dation. Such separate contract shall be prepared, completed and main-
14 tained in accordance with this section for every memorial sale, includ-
15 ing a foundation therefor, and shall be the only contractual document
16 prepared in connection with such sale. Provided however in the case of
17 the sale of a monument or memorial made at the same time as a preneed
18 sale of funeral goods or services, a one page document summarizing the
19 transaction shall be given to the consumer in addition to, but not in
20 lieu of, the separate contract required by this section. A full and
21 complete copy of such contract shall be given to the consumer by the
22 seller at the time of purchase of such memorial, and shall be retained
23 by the seller for a period of at least three years from the date of
24 sale. Said contract shall contain at least the following:
- 25 (a) the name, address and telephone number of the seller of the memo-
26 rial;
- 27 (b) the name, address and telephone number of the consumer;

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1 (c) the full name of the individual to be memorialized and, if known,
2 the date of such individual's death;

3 (d) a full description of the memorial, including the material to be
4 provided, the dimensions of the finished memorial, a sketch or drawing
5 of the proposed memorial, the wording of any inscription on such memori-
6 al including the approximate layout thereof, [and] the method of SAND-
7 BLASTING OR engraving of such inscription, AND A CERTIFICATE OF QUALITY,
8 DETAILING COUNTRY OR STATE OF ORIGIN;

9 (e) the approximate date when the memorial is expected to be
10 completed;

11 (f) the name of the cemetery in which the memorial is to be placed,
12 together with the location of the plot or grave, if known, AND THE NAME
13 OF THE OWNER OF THE PLOT; and

14 (g) a full disclosure of each of the following: the price of the memo-
15 rial; applicable sales tax, if any; the charge made by the cemetery for
16 the foundation; any charges for additional work, provided that such
17 additional work is clearly described in the contract and such charges
18 are itemized; the total price as contracted; and the schedule for
19 payment, if any.

20 S 2. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 454-a
21 to read as follows:

22 S 454-A. UNSOLICITED OFFERS FOR MONUMENTS OR MEMORIALS. 1. (A) IT
23 SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO PROVIDE ANY OFFER FOR MONUMENTS OR MEMORIALS UNLESS
24 SUCH OFFER HAS FIRST BEEN SOLICITED BY THE INDIVIDUAL TO WHICH IT IS
25 SENT. (B) PROVIDED, HOWEVER, SUCH AN OFFER IS PERMISSIBLE WHERE, IN
26 LARGE, BOLD-FACE TYPE AT THE TOP OF SUCH OFFER, "SOLICITATION" IS CLEAR-
27 LY PRINTED.

28 2. AN OFFER PROVIDED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (B) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF
29 THIS SECTION SHALL ADDITIONALLY PROVIDE: A FULL DESCRIPTION OF THE MEMO-
30 RIAL, INCLUDING THE MATERIAL TO BE PROVIDED, THE DIMENSIONS OF THE
31 FINISHED MEMORIAL, A SKETCH OR DRAWING OF THE PROPOSED MEMORIAL, THE
32 WORDING OF ANY INSCRIPTION ON SUCH MEMORIAL INCLUDING THE APPROXIMATE
33 LAYOUT THEREOF, THE METHOD OF ENGRAVING OF SUCH INSCRIPTION, AND A
34 CERTIFICATE OF QUALITY DETAILING COUNTRY OR STATE OF ORIGIN, AS WELL AS
35 A FULL DISCLOSURE OF EACH OF THE FOLLOWING: THE PRICE OF THE MEMORIAL;
36 APPLICABLE SALES TAX, IF ANY; THE CHARGE MADE BY THE CEMETERY FOR THE
37 FOUNDATION; ANY CHARGES FOR ADDITIONAL WORK, PROVIDED THAT SUCH ADDI-
38 TIONAL WORK IS CLEARLY DESCRIBED IN THE OFFER AND SUCH CHARGES ARE ITEM-
39 IZED; THE TOTAL PRICE AS OFFERED; AND THE SCHEDULE FOR PAYMENT, IF ANY.

40 3. WHENEVER THERE SHALL BE A VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS
41 SECTION, AN APPLICATION MAY BE MADE BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN THE NAME
42 OF THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO A COURT OR JUSTICE HAVING
43 JURISDICTION TO ISSUE AN INJUNCTION, AND UPON NOTICE TO THE DEFENDANT OF
44 NOT LESS THAN FIVE DAYS, TO ENJOIN AND RESTRAIN THE CONTINUANCE OF THE
45 VIOLATION. IF IT SHALL APPEAR TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE COURT OR THE
46 JUSTICE THAT THE DEFENDANT HAS VIOLATED THIS SECTION, AN INJUNCTION MAY
47 BE ISSUED BY THE COURT OR JUSTICE, ENJOINING AND RESTRAINING ANY FURTHER
48 VIOLATION, WITHOUT REQUIRING PROOF THAT ANY PERSON HAS, IN FACT BEEN
49 INJURED OR DAMAGED THEREBY. IN ANY SUCH PROCEEDING, THE COURT MAY MAKE
50 ALLOWANCES TO THE ATTORNEY GENERAL AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH SIX OF
51 SUBDIVISION (A) OF SECTION EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED THREE OF THE
52 CIVIL PRACTICE LAW AND RULES AND DIRECT RESTITUTION. IN CONNECTION WITH
53 ANY SUCH PROPOSED APPLICATION, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IS AUTHORIZED TO
54 TAKE PROOF AND MAKE A DETERMINATION OF THE RELEVANT FACTS AND TO ISSUE
55 SUBPOENAS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CIVIL PRACTICE LAW AND RULES. WHENEVER
56 THE COURT SHALL DETERMINE THAT A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION HAS OCCURRED,

1 THE COURT MAY IMPOSE A CIVIL PENALTY OF UP TO FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS FOR
2 THE FIRST VIOLATION AND UP TO ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE SECOND OR
3 SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION WITHIN AN EIGHTEEN MONTH PERIOD.
4 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
