- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to training regarding domestic violence

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 6507 of the educa-2 tion law, as amended by chapter 356 of the laws of 2006, is amended to 3 read as follows:

4 a. Establish standards for preprofessional and professional education, 5 experience and licensing examinations as required to implement the artiб cle for each profession. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 7 commissioner shall establish standards requiring that all persons applying, on or after January first, nineteen hundred ninety-one, initially, 8 9 or for the renewal of, a license, registration or limited permit to be a 10 physician, chiropractor, dentist, registered nurse, podiatrist, optometrist, psychiatrist, psychologist, licensed master social 11 worker, 12 licensed clinical social worker, licensed creative arts therapist, 13 licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health counselor, licensed psychoanalyst, or dental hygienist shall, in addition to 14 all the other licensure, certification or permit requirements, have 15 completed [two] THREE hours of coursework or training regarding the 16 17 identification and reporting of child abuse [and], maltreatment, AND 18 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. The coursework or training shall be obtained from an institution or provider which has been approved by the department to 19

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provide such coursework or training. The coursework or training shall 1 2 include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of 3 child abuse [and], maltreatment, AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE and the statutory 4 reporting requirements set out in sections four hundred thirteen through four hundred twenty of the social services law, including but not limit-ed to, when and how a report must be made, what other actions the repor-5 б 7 is mandated or authorized to take, the legal protections afforded ter 8 reporters, and the consequences for failing to report. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ESTABLISH STANDARDS REQUIRING THAT BEGINNING JANUARY 9 FIRST, TWO 10 THOUSAND THIRTEEN, ONE HOUR OF THE THREE COURSEWORK OR TRAINING HOURS SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION REGARDING THE RELATIONSHIP 11 BETWEEN CHILD 12 MALTREATMENT, AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND THE IDENTIFICATION OF ABUSE, BEHAVIORAL AND PHYSICAL INDICATORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AS 13 DEFINED IN 14 SECTION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE-A OF THE SOCIAL SERVICES LAW. Such 15 coursework or training may also include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of the abuse of individuals with mental retardation and other developmental disabilities and voluntary reporting 16 17 18 of abused or neglected adults to the office of mental retardation and 19 developmental disabilities or the local adult protective services unit. 20 Each applicant shall provide the department with documentation showing 21 that he or she has completed the required training. The department shall 22 provide an exemption from the child abuse [and], maltreatment, AND 23 DOMESTIC VIOLENCE training requirements to any applicant who requests 24 such an exemption and who shows, to the department's satisfaction, that 25 there would be no need because of the nature of his or her practice for 26 him or her to complete such training; 27 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
