WHEREAS, Paul Cortright served in numerous other state and national leadership positions, such as Vice Chairman of the Foreign Relations Council, and the American Chairman of the American/Canadian Goodwill Committee remembering fallen heroes; and

WHEREAS, In 2001, Paul Cortright was honored as Legionnaire of the Year, Jefferson County, Fifth District, Department of New York; and

WHEREAS, Paul Cortright is survived by his wife of 53 years, Linda, and his three sons, Paul, Jr., David and Randy, as well as 11 grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Paul Cortright leaves behind a legacy which will long endure the passage of time and will remain as a comforting memory to all he served and befriended; now, therefore, be it
