WHEREAS, This Legislative Body is justly proud to honor Marcia Reed upon the occasion of being selected as the 2013 South Jefferson Citizen of the Year for her long-standing commitment to volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Marcia Reed was a board member of the South Jefferson Ecumenical Council, chairwoman of the Annual Crop Walk, and a volunteer for the South Jefferson United Way for many years, eventually serving as its Chairwoman; she was honored in 1978 by the United Way as its Volunteer of the Year; and

WHEREAS, Currently, Marcia Reed serves as the president of the Rohde Center in Adams, New York, working with people who are struggling to feed their families; and

WHEREAS, Moreover, Marcia Reed is the AARP Driver Safety Program Coordinator, and volunteers for the Salvation Army Red Kettle campaign; she serves on the Board of Directors of the Historical Association of South Jefferson, the committee for the Adams United Methodist Church Staff/Pastor parish relations, and its Worship Committee, as well as chairwoman for the Annual Church Christmas Bazaar; and

WHEREAS, It is the practice of this Legislative Body that those who enhance the well-being and vitality of their community and have shown a long and sustained commitment to excellence certainly have earned the recognition and applause of all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
