WHEREAS, The mission of the Cambria Heights Community Church is to provide spiritual guidance to the members of its community without restrictions, or reservations; in addition, the Church cares for the needy, and the people it serves; and

WHEREAS, The Cambria Heights Community Church is family oriented, and an integral part of the community; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body is proud to take note of enduring religious institutions and to bring such institutions to the attention of the people of this Empire State; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when an event of such noble aims and accomplishments is brought to our attention, it should be recognized and applauded by all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
