WHEREAS, Anton Dietrich served his country with honor and distinction as a member of the United States Army during World War II; he grew up in Richmond Hill, where he still resides; and

WHEREAS, Anton Dietrich served in the 39th Infantry Regiment Co. G. 9th Infantry Division from July 1941 to April 1947; this proud soldier was honored with the Bronze Star, two Purple Hearts, Presidential Unit Citation, French Legion of Honor, American Defense Service Medal, Combat Infantry Badge, and the ETO Campaign Medal with Bronze Arrowhead and 4 Stars; and

WHEREAS, Residents of this great State must never forget the courage with which these men and women served their country, and must recognize that no greater debt is owed than that owed to those who gave their lives for their beloved Nation and to those who continue to be missing in action; and

WHEREAS, Having exhibited their patriotism both at home and abroad, these men and women demonstrated their love for their country and merit forevermore, the highest respect of their State and Nation; and

WHEREAS, Our Nation's veterans deserve to be recognized, commended and thanked by the people of the State of New York for their service and for their dedication to their communities, their State and their Nation; now, therefore, be it
