AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring each school district to include the percentage of its budget spent on instructional expenses in its school district report card

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 6 of section 1608 of the education law, as amended by section 5 of part A of chapter 436 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows:

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Each year, the board of education shall prepare a school district report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the school district, on a school by school basis, measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, commissioner, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. to regulations of the commissioner, the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. Such report card shall include, at a minimum, any information on the school district regarding pupil performance and expenditure per pupil required to be included in the annual report by the regents to the governor and the legislature pursuant to section two hundred fifteen-a of this chapter; and any other information required by the commissioner. School districts (i) identified as having

fifteen percent or more of their students in special education, or (ii) which have fifty percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs or services sixty percent or more of the school day in a general education building, or (iii) which have eight percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs in public or private separate educational settings shall indicate on their school district report card their respective percentages as defined in this subparagraph and subparagraphs (i) and (ii) of this paragraph as compared to the statewide average.

- S 2. Subdivision 6 of section 1716 of the education law, as amended by section 7 of part A of chapter 436 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows:
- 6. Each year, the board of education shall prepare a school district report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the school district, on a school by school basis, and measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERCENTAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Pursuant regulations of the commissioner, the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. Such report card shall include, at a minimum, information of the school district regarding pupil performance and expenditure per pupil required to be included in the annual report regents to the governor and the legislature pursuant to section two hundred fifteen-a of this chapter; and any other information required by the commissioner. School districts (i) identified as having fifteen more of their students in special education, or (ii) which have fifty percent or more of their students with disabilities education programs or services sixty percent or more of the school day in a general education building, or (iii) which have percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs in public or private separate educational settings shall indicate on their school district report card their respective percentages defined in this paragraph and paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subdivision as compared to the statewide average.
- S 3. Paragraph kk of subdivision 4 of section 1950 of the education law, as amended by chapter 378 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:

kk. For the nineteen hundred ninety-seven--ninety-eight school year and thereafter, the board of cooperative educational services (BOCES) shall prepare a BOCES report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed administrative budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the board of cooperative educational services, on a school by school or program by program basis, and measures of the fiscal performance of the supervisory district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED

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TO, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT Pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide for all boards of cooperative educational services. Such report card shall include any information required by the commissioner.

- S 4. Subdivision 24 of section 2554 of the education law, as amended by chapter 91 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:
- 24. Each year, the board of education shall prepare a school district report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at 12 the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic 15 performances of the school district, on a school by school basis, measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE commissioner, SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. 19 to regulations of the commissioner the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, 22 developed by the commissioner. Such report card shall include, at a minimum, any information on the school district regarding pupil perform-23 24 ance and expenditure per pupil required to be included in the annual report by the regents to the governor and the legislature pursuant to section two hundred fifteen-a of this chapter; and any other information 27 required by the commissioner. School districts (i) identified as having fifteen percent or more of their students in special education, or (ii) 29 which have fifty percent or more of their students with disabilities in 30 special education programs or services sixty percent or more of the school day in a general education building, or (iii) which have eight percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs in public or private separate educational settings shall indicate on their school district report card their respective percentages as defined in this paragraph and paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subdivision as compared to the statewide average.
  - S 5. Subdivision 24 of section 2554 of the education law, as added by chapter 474 of the laws of 1996, is amended to read as follows:
  - In every city school district in a city having a population of less than one million inhabitants, each year, the board of education shall prepare a school district report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performances of the school district, on school by school basis, and measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUDING, BUT NOT PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Pursuant to regulations of the commissioner the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. - Each year prepare a school district report card pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the school district, on a school by school basis, and measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUD-BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, the report card shall also compare these measures statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. Such report card shall include, at a minimum, any information on the school district regarding pupil performance and expenditure per pupil required to be included in the annual report by the requests to the governor and the legislature pursuant to section two hundred fifteen-a of this chapter; and any other information required by the commissioner. School districts (i) identified as having fifteen percent or more of their students in special education, or (ii) which have fifty percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs or services sixty percent or more of the school day in a general education building, or (iii) which have eight percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs in public private separate educational settings shall indicate on their school district report card their respective percentages as defined in this paragraph and paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subdivision as compared to the statewide average.
- S 7. Subdivision 8 of section 2590-e of the education law, as amended by chapter 720 of the laws of 1996, is amended to read as follows:
- 8. Each year prepare a school district report card pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of general circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the school district, on a school by school basis, and measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Pursuant to regulations of the

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commissioner, the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. - S 8. Subdivision 7 of section 2601-a of the education law, as amended by section 9 of part A of chapter 97 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- Each year, the board of education shall prepare a school district report card, pursuant to regulations of the commissioner, and shall make it publicly available by transmitting it to local newspapers of circulation, appending it to copies of the proposed budget made publicly available as required by law, making it available for distribution at the annual meeting, and otherwise disseminating it as required by the commissioner. Such report card shall include measures of the academic performance of the school district, on a school by school basis, measures of the fiscal performance of the district, as prescribed by the commissioner, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Pursuto regulations of the commissioner, the report card shall also compare these measures to statewide averages for all public schools, and statewide averages for public schools of comparable wealth and need, developed by the commissioner. Such report card shall include, at a minimum, any information on the school district regarding pupil performance and expenditure per pupil required to be included in the annual report by the regents to the governor and the legislature pursuant to section two hundred fifteen-a of this chapter; and any other information required by the commissioner. School districts (i) identified as having fifteen percent or more of their students in special education, or (ii) which have fifty percent or more of their students with disabilities special education programs or services sixty percent or more of the school day in a general education building, or (iii) which have eight percent or more of their students with disabilities in special education programs in public or private separate educational settings shall indicate on their school district report card their respective percentages as defined in this paragraph and paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subdivision as compared to the statewide average.
- S 9. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 2857 of the education law, as amended by chapter 101 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) a charter school report card, which shall include measures of the comparative academic and fiscal performance of the school, as prescribed by the commissioner in regulations adopted for such purpose. Such meas-

ures shall include, but not be limited to, graduation rates, dropout rates, performance of students on standardized tests, college entry rates, total spending per [pupil], and administrative spending per pupil THE PERCENTAGE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET THAT IS SPENT ON 5 INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. Such measures shall be presented in a format 6 that is easily comparable to similar public schools. In addition, the 7 charter school shall ensure that such information is easily accessible the community including making it publicly available by transmitting 8 it to local newspapers of general circulation and making it available 9 10 for distribution at board of trustee meetings.

S 10. Section 2 of the education law is amended by adding a new subdivision 20 to read as follows:

13 20. INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES. FOR PURPOSES OF SUBDIVISION SIX OF SECTION 14 SIXTEEN HUNDRED EIGHT, SUBDIVISION SIX OF SECTION SEVENTEEN HUNDRED 15 SIXTEEN, PARAGRAPH KK OF SUBDIVISION FOUR OF SECTION NINETEEN HUNDRED 16 FIFTY, SUBDIVISION TWENTY-FOUR SECTION TWENTY-FIVE  $\mathsf{OF}$ HUNDRED 17 FIFTY-FOUR, SUBDIVISION EIGHT OF SECTION TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED NINETY-E, SUBDIVISION SEVEN OF SECTION TWENTY-SIX HUNDRED ONE-A, AND PARAGRAPH (A) 18 19 SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED FIFTY-SEVEN OF THIS 20 CHAPTER, THE TERM "INSTRUCTIONAL EXPENSES" MEANS: A. THE SUM OF 21 EXPENDITURES IN THE SCHOOL YEAR DIRECTLY RELATED TO THE INSTRUCTIONAL 22 PROGRAM IN GRADES PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE OF THE 23 DISTRICT, EXCLUSIVE OF TUITION PAID TO ANOTHER PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT OR 24 AN INSTITUTION, OTHER THAN TUITION PAID PURSUANT TO A CONTRACT 25 AUTHORIZED BY ARTICLE EIGHTY-NINE OF THIS CHAPTER. SUCH SUM 26 INCLUDE GENERAL FUND, SPECIAL AID FUND, AND RISK RETENTION FUND EXPENSES 27 REPORTED IN THE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT OF THE DISTRICT FOR THE FOLLOW-28 ING PURPOSES:

- 52 (XXIII) FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSES THAT SHALL BE IDENTIFIED BY THE COMMIS-53 SIONER.
- 54 B. THE COST OF EMPLOYEE BENEFITS TO BE INCLUDED IN INSTRUCTIONAL 55 EXPENSE SHALL BE CALCULATED BY MULTIPLYING THE RATIO OF TOTAL EXPENDI-56 TURES FOR EMPLOYEE BENEFITS, INCLUDING EXPENDITURES FROM THE RISK

RETENTION FUND FOR PURPOSES OF EMPLOYEE BENEFIT CLAIMS RELATED TO SALARIES PAID FROM THE GENERAL AND SPECIAL AID FUNDS, TO TOTAL EXPENDITURES
FOR SALARIES, BOTH AS RECORDED IN THE GENERAL FUND AND SPECIAL AID FUND,
BY THE TOTAL EXPENDITURES FOR SALARIES, AS RECORDED IN THE GENERAL FUND
AND SPECIAL AID FUND, FOR THOSE PURPOSES LISTED IN PARAGRAPH A OF THIS
SUBDIVISION. SUCH RATIO SHALL BE EXPRESSED AS A DECIMAL CARRIED TO THREE
DECIMAL PLACES WITHOUT ROUNDING, AND SUCH CALCULATED COST OF EMPLOYEE
BENEFITS SHALL BE EXPRESSED AS A WHOLE NUMBER ROUNDED UP TO THE NEXT
WHOLE DOLLAR.

- S 11. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law; provided that:
- 1. the amendments to subdivision 24 of section 2554 of the education law made by section four of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 34 of chapter 91 of the laws of 2002, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section five of this act shall take effect;
- 2. the amendments to subdivision 8 of section 2590-e of the education law made by section six of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such section pursuant to section 34 of chapter 91 of the laws of 2002, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section seven of this act shall take effect; and
- 3. the amendments to subdivision 7 of section 2601-a of the education law made by section eight of this act shall not affect the expiration of such section and shall be deemed to expire therewith.
