AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to regents awards for
children of deceased police officers, peace officers, firefighters and
volunteer firefighters

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 668-a of the education law, as amended by chapter
2 887 of the laws of 1981, the section heading and subdivision 1 as
3 amended by chapter 568 of the laws of 1999 and subdivision 3 as added by
4 chapter 335 of the laws of 1987, is amended to read as follows:
5 S 668-a. Regents awards for children of deceased police officers,
6 peace officers, firefighters and volunteer firefighters. 1. Eligible
7 students. Awards shall be made to resident children of police officers
8 and peace officers as defined in the criminal procedure law, firefight-
9 ers and volunteer firefighters and correction officers of the state or
10 any political subdivision thereof, or volunteer firefighters of fire
11 departments or companies under contract to provide fire protection to a
12 municipality or fire district who have died as a result of an injury
13 sustained in the line of duty, WHO ARE MATRICULATED IN AN APPROVED
14 PROGRAM, AS DEFINED BY THE COMMISSIONER PURSUANT TO ARTICLE THIRTEEN OF
15 THIS CHAPTER.
16 2. Amount and duration. Every recipient shall receive an annual award
17 [of four hundred fifty dollars] EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT OF UNDERGRADUATE
18 TUITION FOR RESIDENTS OF NEW YORK STATE CHARGED BY THE STATE UNIVERSITY
19 OF NEW YORK INCLUDING THE COST FOR ROOM AND BOARD OR ACTUAL TUITION AND
20 THE AVERAGE COST OF ROOM AND BOARD CHARGED AT THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF
21 NEW YORK, WHICHEVER IS LESS, for each of not more than four academic
22 years of undergraduate study or five academic years if a program normal-

1 ly requires five years, as defined by the commissioner pursuant to arti-
2 cle thirteen of this chapter.

3 3. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of this chapter, no
4 child of a correction officer of the state who is receiving an award
5 under the provisions of section six hundred sixty-nine of this article
6 shall receive an award under the provisions of this section.

7 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
