AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to requiring scrap processors to record certain information

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 69-g of the general business law, as amended by 1 chapter 302 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as follows: 2 3 S 69-g. Records. 1. Such scrap processor shall record (i) each 4 purchase of any pig or pigs of metal, bronze or brass castings or parts thereof, sprues or gates or parts thereof, utility wire or brass car 5 journals, or of metal beer kegs, and (ii) each purchase of iron, steel 6 7 and/or nonferrous scrap for a price of fifty dollars or more, and preserve such record for a period of three years; which record shall 8 show the date of purchase, name of seller, his residence address by 9 10 street, number, city, village or town, THE LICENSE PLATE NUMBER OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVEN BY THE SELLER AT THE TIME OF TRANSACTION, the driv-11 12 er's license number or information from a government issued photographic identification card, if any, of such person, or by such description as 13 14 will reasonably locate the seller, the type and quantity of such purchase; and the scrap processor shall cause such record to be signed 15 by the seller or his agent. It shall be unlawful for any seller to 16 17 refuse to furnish such information or to furnish incorrect or incomplete information. Such scrap processor shall also make and retain a copy of 18 the government issued photographic identification card used to verify 19 the identity of the person from whom the scrap metal was purchased and 20 shall retain this copy in a separate book, register or electronic 21 22 archive for two years from the date of purchase.
