CONCURRENT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY

proposing an amendment to section 2 of article 3 of the constitution, in  
relation to increasing the terms of office of members of the legisla-  
ture to four years

1     Section 1. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That section 2 of arti-  
2     cle 3 of the constitution be amended to read as follows:  
3     S 2. The senate shall consist of fifty members, except as hereinafter  
4     provided. The senators [elected in the year one thousand eight hundred  
5     and ninety-five shall hold their offices for three years, and their  
6     successors] shall be [chosen] ELECTED for TERMS OF two years; PROVIDED,  
7     THAT SENATORS ELECTED IN THE YEAR TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN AND IN SUBSEQUENT  
8     YEARS THEREAFTER SHALL HOLD THEIR OFFICES FOR FOUR YEARS. The assembly  
9     shall consist of one hundred and fifty members. The assembly members  
10    [elected in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and  
11    their successors,] shall be [chosen] ELECTED for TERMS OF two years;  
12    PROVIDED, THAT ASSEMBLY MEMBERS ELECTED IN THE YEAR TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN  
13    AND IN SUBSEQUENT YEARS THEREAFTER SHALL HOLD THEIR OFFICES FOR FOUR  
14    YEARS.  
15    S 2. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That the provisions of the  
16    foregoing amendments shall apply only to terms of office commencing  
17    after such amendments shall have been adopted pursuant to section 1 of  
18    article 19 of the constitution.  
19    S 3. Resolved (if the Assembly concur), That the foregoing amendments  
20    be referred to the first regular legislative session convening after the  
21    next succeeding general election of the members of the assembly, and, in  
22    conformity with section 1 of article 19 of the constitution, be  
23    published for three months previous to the time of such election.
