AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the registration and certification of pharmacy technicians; and providing for the repeal of certain provisions upon expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6805-a
2 to read as follows:

3 S 6805-A. REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION AND CERTIFICATION AS A PHAR-
4 MACY TECHNICIAN. 1. ANY PERSON SEEKING TO BE EMPLOYED AS A PHARMACY
5 TECHNICIAN SHALL FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS IN ORDER TO BE
6 REGISTERED AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN:

7 A. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT;

8 B. EDUCATION: HAVE RECEIVED AN EDUCATION, INCLUDING HIGH SCHOOL GRADU-
9 ATION OR A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA (GED);

10 C. AGE: BE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE;

11 D. CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-
12 MENT, WHICH SHALL INCLUDE A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK THAT INDICATES
13 THAT THE APPLICANT HAS NO FELONY OR DRUG RELATED CONVICTIONS; AND

14 E. FEE: PAY A REGISTRATION FEE ESTABLISHED IN REGULATION BY THE BOARD
15 OF REGENTS. SUCH FEES SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN A DEDICATED FUND TO SUPPORT
16 THE REGULATION OF THE PROFESSIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT.

17 2. ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, NO PERSON SHALL ACT
18 AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN UNLESS REGISTERED BY THE BOARD.

19 3. BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN, TO QUALIFY TO BE A PHAR-
20 MACY TECHNICIAN, AN APPLICANT SHALL FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS
21 IN ORDER TO BE CERTIFIED AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN:

22 A. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT;

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[] is old law to be omitted.

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1 B. EDUCATION: HAVE RECEIVED AN EDUCATION, INCLUDING: (I) HIGH SCHOOL
2 GRADUATION OR A GENERAL EQUIVALENCY DIPLOMA (GED); AND (II) SUCCESSFUL
3 COMPLETION OF AN EDUCATION OR TRAINING PROGRAM, AS MAY BE APPROVED BY
4 THE DEPARTMENT;

5 C. EXPERIENCE: HAVE EXPERIENCE SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN
6 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS;

7 D. EXAMINATION: PASS AN EXAMINATION SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN
8 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS;

9 E. AGE: BE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE;

10 F. CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-
11 MENT WHICH SHALL INCLUDE A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK THAT INDICATES THAT
12 THE APPLICANT HAS NO FELONY OR DRUG RELATED CONVICTIONS; AND

13 G. FEE: PAY A TRIENNIAL FEE ESTABLISHED IN REGULATION BY THE BOARD OF
14 REGENTS. SUCH FEE SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN A DEDICATED FUND TO SUPPORT THE
15 REGULATION OF THE PROFESSIONS BY THE DEPARTMENT.

16 4. ON OR AFTER JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN, NO PERSON SHALL
17 ACT AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN UNLESS CERTIFIED BY THE BOARD PROVIDED,
18 HOWEVER, THAT STUDENTS ENROLLED IN ACCREDITED PROGRAMS OR STUDY IN PHAR-
19 MACY SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO REGISTER OR BE CERTIFIED AS A PHARMACY
20 TECHNICIAN IN ORDER TO COMPLETE PRACTICE REQUIREMENTS. SUCH STUDENTS
21 SHALL BE DIRECTLY SUPERVISED AT ALL TIMES, SHALL BE ALLOWED TO PERFORM
22 ONLY NON-JUDGMENTAL TASKS AND SHALL BE LIMITED TO PERFORMING THESE TASKS
23 FOR A PERIOD OF TIME, AS MAY BE DEFINED BY THE DEPARTMENT. IN ADDITION,
24 INDIVIDUALS ENROLLED IN PHARMACY TECHNICIAN EDUCATION OR TRAINING
25 PROGRAMS, AS MAY BE APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT, SHALL ALSO NOT BE
26 REQUIRED TO REGISTER OR BE CERTIFIED AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN, PROVIDED,
27 HOWEVER, THAT SUCH INDIVIDUALS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND
28 CHECK THAT INDICATES THAT THE APPLICANT HAS NO FELONY OR DRUG RELATED
29 CONVICTIONS AND PROVIDED FURTHER THAT SUCH EXEMPTION FROM REGISTRATION
30 OR CERTIFICATION SHALL BE FOR ONLY TWO YEARS.

31 5. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

32 A. "BOARD" SHALL MEAN THE STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY;

33 B. "PHARMACY TECHNICIAN" SHALL MEAN AN INDIVIDUAL DELEGATED DUTIES,
34 TASKS OR FUNCTIONS BY A LICENSED PHARMACIST TO FULFILL THEIR DUTY OF
35 PROVIDING HEALTH CARE PRODUCTS TO PATIENTS. CONSISTENT WITH REGULATIONS
36 OF THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION AND RULES OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS,
37 PHARMACY TECHNICIANS SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE SUPERVISION OF LICENSED
38 PHARMACISTS AND SHALL HAVE NO INDEPENDENT AUTHORITY AND, IN ACCORDANCE
39 WITH THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT. UPON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE
40 CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH UNDER SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS
41 SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT AND THE BOARD OF REGENTS SHALL ADJUST THE RATIO
42 OF PHARMACY TECHNICIANS TO PHARMACISTS AND CONSIDER THE SCOPE OF AUTHOR-
43 ITY THAT MAY BE EXERCISED BY SUCH CERTIFIED PHARMACY TECHNICIANS;

44 C. "CERTIFIED PHARMACY TECHNICIAN" SHALL MEAN AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS
45 SUCCESSFULLY FULFILLED THE REQUIREMENTS TO OBTAIN PHARMACY TECHNICIAN
46 CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION.

47 S 2. This act shall take effect one year after the date on which it
48 shall have become a law; provided, however, that subdivisions 1 and 2 of
49 section 6805-a of the education law, as added by section one of this
50 act, shall expire and be deemed repealed January 1, 2017. Effective
51 immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regu-
52 lation necessary for the implementation of the provisions of this act on
53 its effective date is authorized to be made on or before such effective
54 date.
