AN ACT to amend the general obligations law, in relation to enacting the "Steven Kovacs Law" to impose an affirmative duty upon a residential host to render assistance to a guest on private premises in the event of a medical emergency

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Steven Section 1. 1 2 Kovacs Law". 3 S 2. Article 9 of the general obligations law is amended by adding a 4 new title 2 to read as follows: 5 TITLE 2 6 SOCIAL HOST RESPONSIBILITY 7 SECTION 9-201. SOCIAL HOST RESPONSIBILITY. 8 S 9-201. SOCIAL HOST RESPONSIBILITY. 1. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS 9 SECTION, THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS: 10 (A) "HOST" MEANS ANY PERSON OVER EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE HAVING CONTROL OVER A PRIVATE PREMISES. 11 ACTUAL AUTHORITY AND ABILITY TO REGULATE, 12 (B) "CONTROL" MEANS THE 13 DIRECT OR DOMINATE THE PRIVATE PREMISES. 14 (C) "PRIVATE PREMISES" MEANS ANY HOME, APARTMENT, CONDOMINIUM, COOPER-15 ATIVE UNIT OR OTHER DWELLING UNIT OF ANY KIND, INCLUDING YARDS AND OPEN AREAS OVER WHICH THE HOST HAS CONTROL. 16 EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets

1 (D) "GUEST" MEANS A PERSON WHO IS PHYSICALLY PRESENT ON THE PRIVATE 2 PREMISES OF A HOST, WHICH SHALL NOT BE DEEMED TO INCLUDE PERSONS TRES-3 PASSING UPON THE PRIVATE PREMISES.

4 2. A HOST WHO IS PRESENT AND HAS ACTUAL KNOWLEDGE THAT A GUEST ON THE 5 PRIVATE PREMISES OVER WHICH THE HOST EXERCISES CONTROL IS SUFFERING OR 6 HAS SUFFERED A MEDICAL EMERGENCY AND WHO FAILS TO GIVE REASONABLE ASSISTANCE TO SUCH GUEST SHALL BE LIABLE FOR DAMAGES FOR 7 INJURIES SUSTAINED BY SUCH GUEST OR FOR DAMAGES FOR THE DEATH OF SUCH GUEST WHICH 8 OCCURRED BY REASON OF SUCH FAILURE. REASONABLE ASSISTANCE MAY INCLUDE 9 10 OBTAINING OR ATTEMPTING TO OBTAIN AID FROM LAW ENFORCEMENT OR MEDICAL PERSONNEL. 11

NOTWITHSTANDING SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION, ONCE A HOST OR 13 OTHER PERSON AT THE PRIVATE PREMISES HAS UNDERTAKEN TO RENDER REASONABLE 14 ASSISTANCE TO A GUEST, IT SHALL BE A COMPLETE DEFENSE AGAINST ANY CLAIM 15 FOR CIVIL DAMAGES ALLEGEDLY CAUSED BY ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF SUCH PERSON 16 IN RENDERING SUCH ASSISTANCE, UNLESS IT IS ESTABLISHED THAT SUCH INJU-17 RIES OR DEATH WERE CAUSED BY GROSS NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF SUCH 18 PERSON.

19 S 3. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 20 have become a law.
