AN ACT to amend the energy law, in relation to appliance and equipment energy efficiency standards

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 5-108-a of the energy law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 3 to read as follows:
 - 3. CONSUMER AUDIO AND VIDEO PRODUCTS AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION ELEVEN OF SECTION 16-102 OF THIS CHAPTER PURCHASED BY OR FOR THE STATE OR ANY AGENCY THEREOF SHALL MEET OR EXCEED THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS: (I) THAT SUCH PRODUCTS MEET THE ELECTRONIC PRODUCT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT TOOL (EPEAT) GOLD STANDARDS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE FOR AT LEAST
- 8 NINETY-FIVE PERCENT OF PRODUCTS PURCHASED IN ALL RELEVANT ELECTRONIC
- 9 PRODUCT CATEGORIES, UNLESS THERE IS NO EPEAT GOLD STANDARD FOR SUCH 10 PRODUCT; (II) THAT SUCH PRODUCTS MEET THE CURRENT VERSION OF THE APPLI-
- 11 CABLE ENERGY STAR STANDARD; (III) THAT POLICIES ARE ESTABLISHED AND
- 12 IMPLEMENTED TO EXTEND THE USEFUL LIFE OF THE AGENCY ELECTRONIC EQUIP-
- 13 MENT; (IV) THAT ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND PRACTICES ARE USED WITH RESPECT TO
- 14 DISPOSITION OF AGENCY ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT THAT HAS REACHED THE END O
- 15 ITS USEFUL LIFE; AND (V) THAT SUCH PRODUCTS ARE LIFE-CYCLE COST-EFFEC-
- 16 TIVE AND PRACTICABLE AND WHERE THE RELEVANT PRODUCT'S UTILITY AND 17 PERFORMANCE ARE NOT COMPROMISED AS A RESULT.
- 18 S 2. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 16-106 of the energy 19 law, as added by chapter 431 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as 20 follows:

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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1 or before [June thirtieth, two thousand six] JANUARY (a) 2 THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN, the secretary, in consultation with 3 the president, shall adopt regulations in accordance with the provisions of this article establishing: (i) energy efficiency performance stand-5 ards for new products of the types set forth in paragraphs (a) through 6 (n) of subdivision one of section 16-104 of this article, with 7 exception of such [paragraph] PARAGRAPHS (E) (CONSUMER AUDIO AND VIDEO 8 PRODUCTS) AND (q) (incandescent reflector lamps); (ii) procedures for testing the energy efficiency of the products covered by paragraphs (a) 9 10 through (n) of subdivision one of section 16-104 of this article; (iii) 11 procedures for manufacturers to certify that products covered under this 12 article meet the energy efficiency standards to be promulgated under this article; and (iv) such further matters as are necessary to insure 13 14 the proper implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this 15 article. WITH RESPECT TO CONSUMER AUDIO, VIDEO AND INFORMATION TECHNOL-OGY PRODUCTS, INCLUDED IN PARAGRAPH (E) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION 16 16-104 OF THIS ARTICLE, THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PRESI-17 DENT, SHALL CONDUCT A STUDY TO DETERMINE WHETHER AN ENERGY PERFORMANCE 18 19 STANDARD FOR SUCH PRODUCT SHOULD BE ESTABLISHED, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT 20 FACTORS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, THE POTENTIAL IMPACT ON ELECTRIC-21 ITY USAGE, PRODUCT AVAILABILITY, MANUFACTURING COST, INNOVATION, PRODUCT 22 CONVERGENCE, PRODUCT FEATURES AND FUNCTION, AND CONSUMER AND ENVIRON-MENTAL BENEFITS. BASED ON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF SUCH STUDY, THE 23 IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PRESIDENT, MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS IN 24 25 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE ESTABLISHING ENERGY 26 PERFORMANCE **STANDARDS** FOR SUCH PRODUCTS ON OR BEFORE 27 THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN. With respect to incandescent reflector lamps, included in paragraph (g) of subdivision one of section 28 29 16-104 of this article, the secretary, in consultation with the presi-30 dent, shall conduct a study to determine whether an energy efficiency performance standard for such product should be established, taking into 31 32 account factors including the potential impact on electricity usage, 33 product availability and consumer and environmental benefits. If it is 34 determined based on this study that such a standard would reduce energy 35 use and would not be preempted by the federal law, the secretary, consultation with the president, shall adopt regulations in accordance 36 37 with the provisions of this article establishing energy performance standards for such product on or before January first, two thousand 38 39 eight. 40

S 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that no energy efficiency performance standard shall become effective for a product less than one hundred eighty days after such energy efficiency performance standard shall become final.
