- AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to exempting police dogs from confinement and observation

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 7 of section 2140 of the public health law, as 2 amended by chapter 510 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 "Confinement and observation" refers to the conditions under which 7. 5 apparently healthy dogs, cats, domesticated ferrets, and domestic liveб stock, which are not exhibiting symptoms of rabies, must be maintained 7 to determine rabies status if such an animal has potentially exposed a 8 person to rabies, and the owner wishes to avoid euthanizing and testing 9 the animal. If the county health authority does not approve home confinement, the ten day confinement and observation period must take 10 place, at owner's expense, at an appropriate facility such as an animal 11 12 shelter, veterinarian's office, kennel or farm. The confinement must 13 include (i) provisions to prevent escape of the animal during the confinement period and (ii) requirements that the owner notify the 14 public health authority immediately if the animal becomes ill at anytime 15 16 during confinement, and (iii) verification by the county health authori-17 ty or their designee at the end of the ten day period that the animal is healthy. IF A POLICE WORK DOG BITES AN INDIVIDUAL IN THE COURSE OF 18 SUCH DOG'S OFFICIAL DUTY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT MAY APPLY FOR A WAIVER FROM 19 20 CONFINEMENT FROM THE LOCAL DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.
