AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to the purchase of second-hand precious metals

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 2 391-s to read as follows:

- S 391-S. SECOND-HAND PRECIOUS METALS; RECORDS. 1. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- (A) "DEALER" SHALL MEAN ANY PERSON WHO, IN THE REGULAR COURSE OF BUSINESS, DEALS IN THE PURCHASE OF SECOND-HAND ARTICLES OR THINGS COMPRISED OF GOLD, SILVER OR PLATINUM FOR THE PURPOSE OF RESALE, MELTING OR REFINING, AND SHALL INCLUDE COLLATERAL LOAN BROKERS.
- 9 (B) "SELLER" SHALL MEAN ANY PERSON WHO SELLS ANY SECOND-HAND ARTICLE 10 OR THING COMPRISED OF GOLD, SILVER OR PLATINUM.
- 2. NO DEALER SHALL TAKE POSSESSION OF AND PROVIDE CONSIDERATION FOR 11 ANY SECOND-HAND ITEM COMPRISED OF GOLD, SILVER OR PLATINUM FROM A SELLER 12 WITHOUT CONFIRMING THE IDENTITY OF SUCH SELLER UPON PRESENTATION OF TWO 13 14 FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION. THE DEALER SHALL MAINTAIN A RECORD OF EACH SECOND-HAND ITEM COMPRISED OF GOLD, SILVER OR PLATINUM HE OR SHE TAKES 15 POSSESSION OF, AND SUCH RECORD SHALL INCLUDE A COPY OF THE 16 17 IDENTIFICATION PRESENTED BY THE SELLER AND A TELEPHONE NUMBER AND ADDRESS AT WHICH THE SELLER MAY BE CONTACTED. ALL SUCH RECORDS SHALL BE 18 19 MAINTAINED BY $_{
 m THE}$ DEALER FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN TWO YEARS, AND 20 SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS.
- 3. UPON TAKING POSSESSION OF ANY SECOND-HAND ITEM COMPRISED OF GOLD, SILVER OR PLATINUM, A DEALER SHALL RETAIN POSSESSION OF SUCH ITEM FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN SEVENTY-TWO HOURS.
- 24 S 2. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 25 have become a law.
