AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to creating a homeowners' bill of rights and a consumer guide on insuring against catastrophic loss caused by natural disasters

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The insurance law is amended by adding a new section 3444-a 2 to read as follows:

S 3444-A. HOMEOWNERS' BILL OF RIGHTS. (A) 3 ANY INSURER THAT WRITES 4 PERSONAL LINES INSURANCE OR COMMERCIAL LINES INSURANCE POLICIES THAT 5 COVER LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO REAL PROPERTY, PERSONAL PROPERTY, OR OTHER 6 LIABILITIES FOR LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY SHALL, UPON ISSUANCE AND RENEWAL OF ANY SUCH POLICY OR CONTRACT, PROVIDE TO AN INSURED OR 7 POTEN-8 INSURED WRITTEN DETAILED DISCLOSURE IN A NOTICE PRESCRIBED OR TIAL 9 APPROVED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT DESCRIBING CLEARLY AND IN PLAIN LANGUAGE 10 THE FOLLOWING:

(1) ANY AND ALL COVERAGE FOR LOSS CAUSED BY CERTAIN OCCURRENCES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO FIRE, WIND, WINDSTORM, MUDSLIDE, HURRICANE, SNOW, ICE, WATER SURGE, OR FLOOD, COVERAGES PROVIDED UNDER THE POLICY, ANY LIMITATIONS ON OR EXCLUSIONS FROM COVERAGE, CIRCUMSTANCES THAT WOULD INVALIDATE COVERAGE UNDER THE POLICY, ANY APPLICABLE DEDUCTIBLES, AND WHEN SUCH DEDUCTIBLES SHALL BE TRIGGERED;

17 (2) ALL INFORMATION RELATED TO CLAIMS INVESTIGATION AND PROCESSING, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO THE PROCESS BY WHICH THE INSURED MAY FILE A 18 APPLICABLE TIME FRAMES REQUIRED BY LAW AND REGULATION, ALL 19 ALL CLAIM, NECESSARY PROOF OF LOSS INFORMATION AND OTHER INFORMATION 20 THE INSURER MAY REQUIRE FROM THE INSURED, THE PROCESS BY WHICH THE INSURED MAY FILE 21 A COMPLAINT WITH THE DEPARTMENT, AND ANY OTHER INFORMATION DEEMED NECES-22 23 SARY BY THE SUPERINTENDENT;

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(3) ANY AND ALL RIGHTS A CLAIMANT HAS UNDER THE LAWS AND POLICY WHEN A 1 2 CLAIM IS DENIED OR WHEN THE CLAIMANT REJECTS A SETTLEMENT OFFER FROM THE 3 INSURER, INCLUDING THEIR RIGHT TO FILE A COMPLAINT WITH THE DEPARTMENT; 4 (4) THAT THEPROVISIONS OF THIS POLICY MAY BE MODIFIED OR CHANGED 5 PURSUANT TO STATE OR FEDERAL LAW WHEN A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY IS 6 DECLARED PURSUANT TO SECTION TWENTY-FOUR OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW, WHEN THE 7 GOVERNOR DECLARES A DISASTER EMERGENCY PURSUANT TO SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT 8 THE EXECUTIVE LAW, OR WHEN THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES ISSUES OF 9 A MAJOR DISASTER OR EMERGENCY DECLARATION PURSUANT TO THE ROBERT т. 10 STAFFORD DISASTER RELIEF AND EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE ACT (P.L. 93-288) AND HOW THE INSURED MAY OBTAIN INFORMATION ABOUT ANY SUCH MODIFICATIONS 11 OR 12 CHANGES; 13 INFORMATION ON HOW THE INSURED MAY CONTACT THE INSURER, INCLUDING (5) 14 THE INSURER'S BUSINESS HOURS, MAILING ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, FAX NUMBER, 15 WEBSITE ADDRESS AND EMAIL; AND 16 (6) INFORMATION ON HOW THE INSURED CAN OBTAIN THE CONSUMERS GUIDE ON 17 INSURING AGAINST CATASTROPHIC LOSSES CREATED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT OF THIS CHAPTER AND ANY 18 OTHER 19 GUIDES, PAMPHLETS, OR OTHER INFORMATION THE DEPARTMENT HAS MADE PUBLICLY 20 AVAILABLE THAT WOULD BE BENEFICIAL TO THE INSURED. 21 IN THE EVENT THAT A POLICY SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS (B) 22 SECTION DOES NOT INCLUDE COVERAGE FOR DAMAGE AS A RESULT OF WEATHER 23 CONDITIONS, NATURAL DISASTERS, OR OTHER OCCURRENCES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO FIRE, WIND, WINDSTORM, MUDSLIDE, HURRICANE, SNOW, ICE, 24 WATER 25 INSURER OR PRODUCER SHALL, UPON ISSUANCE AND SURGE, OR FLOOD, THE 26 RENEWAL OF ANY SUCH POLICY OR CONTRACT, PROVIDE TO AN INSURED OR POTEN-27 INSURED INFORMATION ON ANY ADDITIONAL COVERAGE OPTIONS, INCLUDING TIAL ADDITIONAL POLICIES AND RIDERS, THE NEW YORK PROPERTY 28 INSURANCE UNDER-29 WRITING ASSOCIATION, THE COASTAL MARKET ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND ANY OTHER OPTIONS AUTHORIZED BY STATE OR 30 31 FEDERAL LAW. 32 S 2. Paragraph 6 of subsection (a) of section 2601 of the insurance 33 law, as amended by chapter 388 of the laws of 2008, is amended and a new 34 paragraph 7 is added to read as follows: 35 (6) failing to promptly disclose coverage pursuant to subsection (d) or subparagraph (A) of paragraph two of subsection (f) of section three 36 37 thousand four hundred twenty of this chapter[.]; OR 38 (7) KNOWINGLY MISREPRESENTING OR FAILING TO PROVIDE PERTINENT FACTS OF 39 POLICY PROVISIONS TO CLAIMANTS AS REQUIRED BY SECTION THREE THOUSAND 40 FOUR HUNDRED FORTY-FOUR-A OF THIS CHAPTER AND NOT COMPLYING WITH SUCH POLICY PROVISIONS, INCLUDING ESTABLISHED TIME FRAMES FOR INVESTIGATION, 41 CLAIMS PROCESSING AND SETTLEMENT, AND PAYMENT OF CLAIMS. 42 S 3. The insurance law is amended by adding a new section 338 to read 43 44 as follows: 45 S 338. CONSUMER GUIDE ON INSURING AGAINST CATASTROPHIC LOSSES. (A) SIX MONTHS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, THE SUPERINTENDENT 46 47 SHALL ISSUE AND UPDATE, AS NECESSARY, A CONSUMER GUIDE ON INSURING 48 AGAINST CATASTROPHIC LOSSES THAT SHALL CONTAIN COMPREHENSIVE INFORMATION 49 WRITTEN IN PLAIN LANGUAGE IN A CLEAR AND UNDERSTANDABLE FORMAT, INCLUD-50 ING THE FOLLOWING: 51 (1) THE WAYS IN WHICH DIFFERENT TYPES OF WEATHER CONDITIONS, NATURAL DISASTERS, OR OTHER OCCURRENCES CAN CAUSE CATASTROPHIC LOSSES, INCLUDING 52 BUT NOT LIMITED TO DAMAGE FROM FIRE, WIND, WINDSTORM, MUDSLIDE, HURRI-53 54 CANE, SNOW, ICE, EXTREME COLD, WATER SURGE, AND FLOOD; 55 (2) THE TYPES OF INSURANCE AVAILABLE THAT PROVIDE COVERAGE AGAINST 56 CATASTROPHIC LOSSES FOR BOTH HOMEOWNERS AND BUSINESSES, A LISTING OF 1 COMPANIES THAT PROVIDE SUCH COVERAGE, AND RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO HOW BEST 2 TO SHOP FOR AND COMPARE PRICES, SERVICE AND QUALITY OF INSURANCE COVER-3 AGE;

4 (3) A LIST OF THE EXCLUSIONS TYPICALLY FOUND IN SUCH COVERAGE AND 5 INFORMATION ON HOW A CONSUMER MAY OBTAIN COVERAGE FOR SUCH EXCLUSIONS, 6 INCLUDING A LISTING OF COMPANIES THAT PROVIDE SUCH COVERAGE AND AN 7 EXPLANATION OF, INFORMATION ON, AND THE TYPES OF COVERAGE AVAILABLE FROM 8 THE NEW YORK PROPERTY INSURANCE UNDERWRITERS ASSOCIATION, THE COASTAL 9 MARKET ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, AND THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND 10 OTHER OPTIONS AUTHORIZED BY STATE OR FEDERAL LAW;

11 (4) STEPS A CONSUMER CAN TAKE TO PREPARE FOR A NATURAL DISASTER OR 12 OTHER CATASTROPHIC LOSS;

13 (5) STEPS A CONSUMER CAN TAKE FOLLOWING A CATASTROPHIC LOSS IN ORDER 14 TO FACILITATE THE TIMELY PROCESSING OF THE CONSUMER'S INSURANCE CLAIM 15 AND AN EXPLANATION OF POLICYHOLDERS' RIGHTS AS PROVIDED IN LAW AND REGU-16 LATION; AND

17 (6) A DEPARTMENT TOLL FREE CONSUMER HOT-LINE AND WEBSITE ADDRESS 18 THROUGH WHICH CONSUMERS MAY INITIATE COMPLAINTS, AND REQUEST GENERAL 19 INFORMATION ABOUT INSURANCE.

20 (B) THE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION MAY 21 BE SATISFIED BY SEPARATE OR SUPPLEMENTAL PUBLICATIONS AND UPDATES.

22 (C) THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL POST THE CONSUMER GUIDE ON INSURING 23 AGAINST CATASTROPHIC LOSSES ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

24 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
