AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to the calculation of weekly unemployment insurance benefits for workers who are partially unemployed; and to repeal certain provisions of the labor law relating thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 522 of the labor law, as amended by chapter 720 of the laws of 1953, is amended to read as follows:

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3 522. Total unemployment AND PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT. "Total unemploy-S 4 ment" means the total lack of any employment [on any day] DURING ANY 5 "PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT" MEANS ANY EMPLOYMENT DURING ANY WEEK THAT WEEK. IS LESS THAN FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT SO LONG AS THE COMPENSATION 6 PAID IS 7 LESS THAN THE CLAIMANT'S WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE PLUS THE CLAIMANT'S PARTIAL 8 BENEFIT CREDIT. The term "employment" as used in this section means any employment including that not defined in this title. 9

10 S 2. Section 523 of the labor law is REPEALED and a new section 523 is 11 added to read as follows:

12 S 523. EFFECTIVE WEEK. "EFFECTIVE WEEK" MEANS (A) A WEEK DURING WHICH 13 A CLAIMANT PERFORMS NO SERVICES FOR WHICH THE CLAIMANT IS PAID COMPEN-14 SATION, OR (B) A WEEK DURING WHICH A CLAIMANT PERFORMS SERVICES ON A 15 PART-TIME BASIS FOR WHICH THE CLAIMANT IS PAID COMPENSATION THAT IS LESS 16 THAN THE CLAIMANT'S WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE PLUS HIS OR HER PARTIAL BENEFIT 17 CREDIT.

18 S 3. The labor law is amended by adding a new section 514-a to read as 19 follows:

20 S 514-A. PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT. "PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT" MEANS THAT 21 PART OF THE COMPENSATION, IF ANY, PAID TO A CLAIMANT WITH RESPECT TO A 22 WEEK FOR WHICH BENEFITS ARE CLAIMED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER 23 WHICH IS NOT IN EXCESS OF FORTY PER CENTUM OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S WEEKLY

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[] is old law to be omitted.

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BENEFIT RATE, OR SEVENTY-ONE DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS, WHICHEVER IS THE
 GREATER. SUCH PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT, IF NOT A MULTIPLE OF ONE DOLLAR,
 SHALL BE COMPUTED TO THE NEXT HIGHER MULTIPLE OF ONE DOLLAR.

4 S 4. Subdivision 4 of section 527 of the labor law, as amended by 5 chapter 832 of the laws of 1968 and as renumbered by chapter 381 of the 6 laws of 1984, is amended to read as follows:

7 4. General condition. A valid original claim may be filed only in a 8 week [in which the claimant has at least one effective day of unemploy-9 ment] THAT QUALIFIES AS AN EFFECTIVE WEEK OF UNEMPLOYMENT FOR THE CLAIM-10 ANT.

11 S 5. Subparagraph 2 of paragraph (e) of subdivision 1 of section 581 12 of the labor law, as amended by chapter 282 of the laws of 2002, clause 13 (v) as added by chapter 106 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as 14 follows:

15 (2) Benefits payable to any claimant with respect to the claimant's then current benefit year shall be charged, when paid, to the account of the last employer prior to the filing of a valid original claim in an 16 17 18 amount equal to seven times the claimant's benefit rate. Thereafter, such charges shall be made to the account of each employer in the base 19 period used to establish the valid original claim in the same proportion 20 21 that the remuneration paid by each employer to the claimant during that base period bears to the remuneration paid by all employers to the 22 claimant during that base period except as provided below: 23

(i) In those instances where the claimant may not utilize wages paid 24 25 establish entitlement based upon subdivision ten of section five to hundred ninety of this article and an educational institution is the 26 claimant's last employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits, 27 or the claimant performed services in such educational institution in 28 29 such capacity while employed by an educational service agency which is 30 the claimant's last employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits, such employer shall not be liable for benefit charges for the 31 32 first [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFECTIVE WEEKS of benefits 33 paid as otherwise provided by this section. Under such circumstances, benefits paid shall be charged to the general account. In addition, 34 wages paid during the base period by such educational institutions, or 35 for services in such educational institutions for claimants employed by 36 37 an educational service agency shall not be considered base period wages 38 during periods that such wages may not be used to gain entitlement to benefits pursuant to subdivision ten of section five hundred ninety of 39 40 this article.

(ii) In those instances where the claimant may not utilize wages paid 41 establish entitlement based upon subdivision eleven of section five 42 to 43 hundred ninety of this article and an educational institution is the claimant's last employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits, 44 45 or the claimant performed services in such educational institution in such capacity while employed by an educational service agency which is 46 the claimant's last employer prior to the filing of the claim for bene-47 48 fits, such employer shall not be liable for benefit charges for the first [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFECTIVE WEEKS of benefits 49 paid as otherwise provided by this section. Under such circumstances, 50 benefits paid will be charged to the general account. In addition, wages 51 paid during the base period by such educational institutions, or for 52 services in such educational institutions for claimants employed by an 53 54 educational service agency shall not be considered base period wages 55 during periods that such wages may not be used to gain entitlement to benefits pursuant to subdivision eleven of section five hundred ninety 56

of this article. However, in those instances where a claimant was not afforded an opportunity to perform services for the educational institution for the next academic year or term after reasonable assurance was provided, such employer shall be liable for benefit charges as provided for in this paragraph for any retroactive payments made to the claimant.

6 (iii) In those instances where the federal government is the claim-7 last employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits and ant's 8 such employer is not a base-period employer, payments equaling the first [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFECTIVE WEEKS of benefits as 9 10 otherwise prescribed by this section shall be charged to the general 11 account. In those instances where the federal government is the claimant's last employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits and a 12 base-period employer, such employer shall be liable for charges for 13 all 14 benefits paid on such claim in the same proportion that the remuneration 15 paid by such employer during the base period bears to the remuneration paid by all employers during the base period. In addition, benefit 16 payment charges for the first [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFEC-17 18 WEEKS of benefits other than those chargeable to the federal TIVE government as prescribed above shall be made to the general account. 19

20 (iv) In those instances where a combined wage claim is filed pursuant 21 interstate reciprocal agreements and the claimant's last employer to 22 prior to the filing of the claim is an out-of-state employer and such employer is not a base-period employer, benefit payments equaling the 23 first [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFECTIVE WEEKS of benefits as 24 25 otherwise prescribed by this section shall be charged to the general account. In those instances where the out-of-state employer is the last 26 employer prior to the filing of the claim for benefits and a base-period employer such employer shall be liable for charges for all benefits paid 27 28 29 on such claim in the same proportion that the remuneration paid by such 30 employer during the base period bears to the remuneration paid by all employers during the base period. In addition, benefit payment charges 31 32 for the [twenty-eight effective days] SEVEN EFFECTIVE WEEKS of benefits 33 other than those chargeable to the out-of-state employer as prescribed 34 above shall be made to the general account.

35 In those instances where the last employer prior to the filing of (v) 36 a valid original claim has paid total remuneration to the claimant 37 during the period from the start of the base period used to establish the benefit claim until the date of the claimant's filing of the valid 38 39 original claim in an amount less than or equal to six times the claim-40 ant's benefit rate and the last employer has substantiated such amount the satisfaction of the commissioner within ten days of the commis-41 to sioner's original notice of potential charges to such last employer's account, benefits shall be charged as follows: benefits payable to the 42 43 44 claimant with respect to the claimant's then current benefit year shall 45 be charged, when paid, to the account of such last employer prior to the filing of a valid original claim in an amount equal to the lowest whole 46 47 number (one, two, three, four, five, or six) times the claimant's benerate where the product of such lowest whole number times the claim-48 fit 49 ant's benefit rate is equal to or greater than such total remuneration 50 paid by such last employer to the claimant. Thereafter, such charges 51 shall be made to the account of each employer in the base period used to 52 establish the valid original claim in the same proportion that the remuneration paid by each employer to the claimant during that base 53 54 period bears to the remuneration paid by all employers to the claimant 55 during that base period. Notice of such recalculation of potential

1 charges shall be given to the last employer and each employer of the 2 claimant in the base period used to establish the valid original claim.

3 S 6. Subdivision 1 of section 590 of the labor law, as amended by 4 chapter 645 of the laws of 1951, is amended to read as follows:

5 1. Entitlement to benefits. A claimant shall be entitled to accumulate 6 effective [days] WEEKS for the purpose of benefit rights only if he OR 7 SHE has complied with the provisions of this article regarding the 8 filing of his OR HER claim, including the filing of a valid original 9 claim, registered as totally OR PARTIALLY unemployed, reported his OR 10 HER subsequent employment and unemployment, and reported for work or 11 otherwise given notice of the continuance of his OR HER unemployment.

12 S 7. Subdivision 3 of section 590 of the labor law, as amended by 13 chapter 645 of the laws of 1951, is amended to read as follows:

14 3. Compensable periods. Benefits shall be paid for each [accumulation 15 of] effective [days within a] week.

16 S 8. Subdivision 4 of section 590 of the labor law, as amended by 17 chapter 457 of the laws of 1987, is amended to read as follows:

4. Duration. Benefits shall not be paid for more than [one hundred and four effective days] TWENTY-SIX EFFECTIVE WEEKS in any benefit year, except as provided in section six hundred one and subdivision two of section five hundred ninety-nine of this chapter.

22 S 9. Subdivision 5 of section 590 of the labor law, as amended by 23 chapter 413 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read as follows:

5. Benefit rate. A claimant's weekly benefit amount shall be one twen-24 25 ty-sixth of the remuneration paid during the highest calendar quarter of the base period by employers, liable for contributions or payments in 26 lieu of contributions under this article. However, for claimants whose 27 high calendar quarter remuneration during the base period is three thou-28 sand five hundred seventy-five dollars or less, the benefit amount shall 29 be one twenty-fifth of the remuneration paid during the highest calendar 30 quarter of the base period by employers liable for contributions or 31 payments in lieu of contributions under this article. 32 ANY CLAIMANT WHO 33 PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED WITH RESPECT TO ANY EFFECTIVE WEEK SHALL BE IS PAID, WITH RESPECT TO SUCH EFFECTIVE WEEK, A BENEFIT AMOUNT EQUAL TO HIS 34 35 OR HER WEEKLY BENEFIT AMOUNT LESS THE TOTAL OF THE REMUNERATION, IF ANY, PAID OR PAYABLE TO HIM OR HER WITH RESPECT TO SUCH WEEK FOR 36 SERVICES 37 PERFORMED WHICH IS IN EXCESS OF HIS OR HER PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT. Any claimant whose high calendar quarter remuneration during the base period is more than three thousand five hundred seventy-five dollars shall not 38 39 40 a weekly benefit amount less than one hundred forty-three dollars. have The weekly benefit amount, so computed, that is not a multiple of 41 one dollar shall be lowered to the next multiple of one dollar. On the first 42 43 Monday of September, nineteen hundred ninety-eight the weekly benefit 44 amount shall not exceed three hundred sixty-five dollars nor be less 45 than forty dollars, until the first Monday of September, two thousand, at which time the maximum benefit payable pursuant to this subdivision 46 47 equal one-half of the state average weekly wage for covered shall 48 employment as calculated by the department no sooner than July first, two thousand and no later than August first, two thousand, rounded down 49 50 to the lowest dollar.

51 S 10. Subdivision 6 of section 590 of the labor law, as added by chap-52 ter 720 of the laws of 1953 and as renumbered by chapter 675 of the laws 53 of 1977, is amended to read as follows:

6. Notification requirement. No effective [day] WEEK shall be counted for any purposes except effective [days] WEEKS as to which notification has been given in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. 1 2 S 11. Subdivision 7 of section 590 of the labor law, as amended by chapter 415 of the laws of 1983, is amended to read as follows: 7. Waiting period. A claimant shall not be entitled to accumulate

7. Waiting period. A claimant shall not be entitled to accumulate effective [days] WEEKS for the purpose of benefit payments until he OR SHE has accumulated a waiting period of [four effective days either wholly within the week in which he established his valid original claim or partly within such week and partly within his benefit year initiated by such claim] ONE EFFECTIVE WEEK.

9 S 12. Subdivision 1 of section 591 of the labor law, as amended by 10 chapter 413 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read as follows:

11 Unemployment. Benefits, except as provided in section five hundred 1. ninety-one-a of this title, shall be paid only to a claimant who is 12 totally unemployed OR PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED and who is unable to engage 13 in his OR HER usual employment or in any other for which he OR SHE 14 is reasonably fitted by training and experience. A claimant who is receiv-15 16 ing benefits under this article shall not be denied such benefits pursuant to this subdivision or to subdivision two of this section because of 17 18 such claimant's service on a grand or petit jury of any state or of the 19 United States.

20 S 13. Subdivision 1 of section 591 of the labor law, as amended by 21 chapter 446 of the laws of 1981, is amended to read as follows:

1. Unemployment. Benefits shall be paid only to a claimant who is 22 totally unemployed OR PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED and who is unable to engage 23 in his OR HER usual employment or in any other for which he OR SHE is 24 reasonably fitted by training and experience. A claimant who is receiv-25 ing benefits under this article shall not be denied such benefits pursu-26 27 ant to this subdivision or to subdivision two of this section because of 28 such claimant's service on a grand or petit jury of any state or of the 29 United States.

30 S 14. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subdivision 2 of section 31 591-a of the labor law, as added by chapter 413 of the laws of 2003, is 32 amended to read as follows:

(i) requirements relating to total unemployment AND PARTIAL UNEMPLOY-MENT, as defined in section five hundred twenty-two of this article, availability for work, as set forth in subdivision two of section five hundred ninety-one of this title and refusal to accept work, as set forth in subdivision two of section five hundred ninety-three of this title, are not applicable to such individuals;

39 S 15. Subdivision 2 of section 592 of the labor law, as amended by 40 chapter 415 of the laws of 1983, is amended to read as follows:

Concurrent payments prohibited. No [days] WEEKS of total unemploy-41 2. ment OR PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT shall be deemed to occur in any week with 42 43 respect to which [or a part of which] a claimant has received or is 44 seeking unemployment benefits under an unemployment compensation law of 45 any other state or of the United States, provided that this provision shall not apply if the appropriate agency of such other state or of the 46 47 United States finally determines that he OR SHE is not entitled to such 48 unemployment benefits.

49 S 16. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 593 of the labor law, 50 as amended by chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as 51 follows:

52 (a) No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT 53 shall be deemed to occur after a claimant's voluntary separation without 54 good cause from employment until he or she has subsequently worked in 55 employment and earned remuneration at least equal to five times his or 56 her weekly benefit rate. In addition to other circumstances that may be

found to constitute good cause, including a compelling family reason as 1 2 forth in paragraph (b) of this subdivision, voluntary separation set 3 from employment shall not in itself disqualify a claimant if circum-4 stances have developed in the course of such employment that would have 5 justified the claimant in refusing such employment in the first instance 6 under the terms of subdivision two of this section or if the claimant, 7 pursuant to an option provided under a collective bargaining agreement 8 or written employer plan which permits waiver of his OR HER right to 9 retain the employment when there is a temporary layoff because of lack 10 of work, has elected to be separated for a temporary period and the 11 employer has consented thereto.

12 S 17. Subdivision 2 of section 593 of the labor law, as amended by 13 chapter 415 of the laws of 1983, the opening paragraph as amended by 14 chapter 5 of the laws of 2000, paragraph (a) as added by chapter 589 of 15 the laws of 1998, and paragraphs (d) and (e) as amended by chapter 35 of 16 the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

17 2. Refusal of employment. No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR 18 PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT shall be deemed to occur beginning with the [day 19 on] WEEK IN which a claimant, without good cause, refuses to accept an offer of employment for which he OR SHE is reasonably fitted by training 20 21 and experience, including employment not subject to this article, until 22 he OR SHE has subsequently worked in employment and earned remuneration at least equal to five times his or her weekly benefit rate. Except that 23 claimants who are not subject to a recall date or who do not obtain 24 25 employment through a union hiring hall and who are still unemployed after receiving thirteen weeks of benefits shall be required to accept 26 27 any employment proffered that such claimants are capable of performing, 28 provided that such employment would result in a wage not less than eighty percent of such claimant's high calendar quarter wages received 29 the base period and not substantially less than the prevailing wage 30 in for similar work in the locality as provided for in paragraph (d) of 31 32 this subdivision. No refusal to accept employment shall be deemed with-33 out good cause nor shall it disqualify any claimant otherwise eliqible 34 to receive benefits if:

(a) a refusal to accept employment which would interfere with a claimant's right to join or retain membership in any labor organization or otherwise interfere with or violate the terms of a collective bargaining agreement shall be with good cause;

39 (b) there is a strike, lockout, or other industrial controversy in the 40 establishment in which the employment is offered; or

41 (c) the employment is at an unreasonable distance from his OR HER 42 residence, or travel to and from the place of employment involves 43 expense substantially greater than that required in his OR HER former 44 employment unless the expense be provided for; or

(d) the wages or compensation or hours or conditions offered are substantially less favorable to the claimant than those prevailing for similar work in the locality, or are such as tend to depress wages or working conditions; or

(e) the claimant is seeking part-time work as provided in subdivision five of section five hundred ninety-six of this title and the offer of employment is not comparable to his or her part-time work as defined in such subdivision.

53 S 18. Subdivision 3 of section 593 of the labor law, as amended by 54 chapter 589 of the laws of 1998, is amended to read as follows:

55 3. Misconduct. No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR PARTIAL UNEM-56 PLOYMENT shall be deemed to occur after a claimant lost employment 1 through misconduct in connection with his or her employment until he or 2 she has subsequently worked in employment and earned remuneration at 3 least equal to five times his or her weekly benefit rate.

4 S 19. Subdivision 4 of section 593 of the labor law, as amended by 5 chapter 589 of the laws of 1998, is amended to read as follows:

6 4. Criminal acts. No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR PARTIAL 7 UNEMPLOYMENT shall be deemed to occur during a period of twelve months 8 after a claimant loses employment as a result of an act constituting a felony in connection with such employment, provided the claimant is duly 9 10 convicted thereof or has signed a statement admitting that he or she has 11 committed such an act. Determinations regarding a benefit claim may be reviewed at any time. Any benefits paid to a claimant prior to a deter-mination that the claimant has lost employment as a result of such act 12 13 14 shall not be considered to have been accepted by the claimant in good 15 faith. In addition, remuneration paid to the claimant by the affected employer prior to the claimant's loss of employment due to such criminal 16 act may not be utilized for the purpose of establishing entitlement to a 17 18 subsequent, valid original claim. The provisions of this subdivision 19 shall apply even if the employment lost as a result of such act is not the claimant's last employment prior to the filing of his or her claim. 20

21 S 20. Section 594 of the labor law, as amended by chapter 728 of the 22 laws of 1952, the opening paragraph as amended by chapter 139 of the 23 laws of 1968, is amended to read as follows:

24 594. Reduction of benefits for false statement. A claimant who has S 25 wilfully made a false statement or representation to obtain any benefit 26 under the provisions of this article shall forfeit benefits for at least 27 first [four] ONE but not more than the first [eighty] TWENTY effecthe tive [days] WEEKS following discovery of such offense for which he OR 28 29 SHE otherwise would have been entitled to receive benefits. Such penalty 30 shall apply only once with respect to each such offense.

For the purpose of subdivision four of section five hundred ninety of this [article] TITLE, the claimant shall be deemed to have received benefits for such forfeited effective [days] WEEKS.

The penalty provided in this section shall not be confined to a single benefit year but shall no longer apply in whole or in part after the expiration of two years from the date on which the offense was committed.

A claimant shall refund all moneys received because of such false statement or representation made by him OR HER.

40 S 21. Subdivision 1 of section 596 of the labor law, as amended by 41 chapter 204 of the laws of 1982, is amended to read as follows:

Claim filing and certification to unemployment. A claimant shall 42 1. 43 file a claim for benefits at the local state employment office serving 44 the area in which he OR SHE was last employed or in which he OR SHE 45 resides within such time and in such manner as the commissioner shall prescribe. He OR SHE shall disclose whether he OR SHE owes child support 46 47 obligations, as hereafter defined. If a claimant making such disclosure is eligible for benefits, the commissioner shall notify the state or 48 49 local child support enforcement agency, as hereafter defined, that the 50 claimant is eligible.

A claimant shall correctly report any [days] WEEKS of employment and any compensation he OR SHE received for such employment, including employments not subject to this article, and the [days on] WEEKS DURING which he OR SHE was totally unemployed OR PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED and shall make such reports in accordance with such regulations as the commissioner shall prescribe. 1 S 22. Subdivision 4 of section 596 of the labor law, as added by chap-2 ter 705 of the laws of 1944 and as renumbered by section 148-a of part B 3 of chapter 436 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows:

4 4. Registration and reporting for work. A claimant shall register as 5 totally unemployed OR PARTIALLY UNEMPLOYED at a local state employment office serving the area in which he OR SHE was last employed or in which 6 7 he OR SHE resides in accordance with such regulations as the commission-8 er shall prescribe. After so registering, such claimant shall report for work at the same local state employment office or otherwise give notice 9 10 of the continuance of his OR HER unemployment as often and in such 11 manner as the commissioner shall prescribe.

12 S 23. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 599 of the labor law, 13 as amended by chapter 593 of the laws of 1991, is amended to read as 14 follows:

15 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, a claimant attending an approved training course or program under this section may 16 17 receive additional benefits of up to [one hundred four] TWENTY-SIX 18 following exhaustion of regular and, effective [days] WEEKS if in 19 effect, any other extended benefits, provided that entitlement to a new 20 benefit claim cannot be established. Certification of continued satis-21 factory participation and progress in such training course or program 22 must be submitted to the commissioner prior to the payment of any such The duration of such additional benefits shall in no case 23 benefits. exceed twice the number of effective [days] WEEKS of regular benefits to 24 25 which the claimant is entitled at the time the claimant is accepted in, 26 or demonstrates application for appropriate training.

27 S 24. Subdivision 1 of section 600 of the labor law, as added by chap-28 ter 793 of the laws of 1963, is amended to read as follows:

1. Reduction of benefit rate. If a claimant retires or is retired from employment by an employer and, due to such retirement, is receiving a pension or retirement payment under a plan financed in whole or in part by such employer, such claimant's benefit rate for [four] ONE effective [days] WEEK otherwise applicable under subdivision seven of section five hundred ninety OF THIS TITLE shall be reduced as hereinafter provided.

35 S 25. Subdivision 2 of section 601 of the labor law, as amended by 36 chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

2. Eligibility conditions. Extended benefits shall be payable to a 38 claimant for effective [days] WEEKS occurring [in any week] within an 39 eligibility period, provided the claimant

40 (a) has exhausted his or her rights to regular benefits under this 41 article in his or her current benefit year or, his or her benefit year 42 having expired prior to such week, he or she does not have the required 43 weeks of employment or earnings to establish a new benefit year, and he 44 or she has no rights to benefits under the unemployment insurance law of 45 any other state;

(b) has no rights to unemployment benefits or allowances under the railroad unemployment insurance act, the trade expansion act of nineteen hundred sixty-two, the automotive products trade act of nineteen hundred sixty-five, or such other federal laws as are specified in regulations issued by the secretary of labor of the United States;

51 (c) has not received and is not seeking unemployment benefits under 52 the unemployment compensation law of the Virgin Islands or of Canada 53 unless, if he or she is seeking such benefits, the appropriate agency 54 finally determines that he or she is not entitled to benefits under such 55 law;

(d) has satisfied the conditions of this article, required to render a 1 2 claimant eligible for regular benefits, which are applicable to extended 3 benefits, including not being subject to a disqualification or suspen-4 sion; 5 (e) is not claiming benefits pursuant to an interstate claim filed 6 under the interstate benefit payment plan in a state where an extended 7 benefit period is not in effect, except that this condition shall not 8 apply with respect to the first [eight] TWO effective [days] WEEKS for 9 which extended benefits shall otherwise be payable pursuant to an inter-10 state claim filed under the interstate benefit payment plan; and 11 in his or her base period has remuneration of one and one-half (f) 12 times the high calendar quarter earnings in accordance with section five hundred twenty-seven of this article. 13 14 S 26. Subdivision 3 of section 601 of the labor law, as amended by 15 chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows: 16 3. Extended benefit amounts; rate and duration. Extended benefits 17 shall be paid to a claimant 18 (a) at a rate equal to his or her rate for regular benefits during his 19 or her applicable benefit year but (b) for not more than [fifty-two] THIRTEEN effective [days] WEEKS with 20 21 respect to his or her applicable benefit year, with a total maximum 22 amount equal to fifty percentum of the total maximum amount of regular 23 benefits payable in such benefit year, and 24 (c) if a claimant's benefit year ends within an extended benefit peri-25 od, the remaining balance of extended benefits to which he or she would 26 be entitled, if any, shall be reduced by the number of effective [days] WEEKS for which he or she was entitled to receive trade readjustment allowances under the federal trade act of nineteen hundred seventy-four 27 28 29 during such benefit year, and 30 (d) for periods of high unemployment for not more than eighty effective days with respect to the applicable benefit year with a total maxi-31 32 mum amount equal to eighty percent of the total maximum amount of regu-33 lar benefits payable in such benefit year. 34 S 27. Subdivision 4 of section 601 of the labor law, as amended by 35 chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows: 36 Charging of extended benefits. The provisions of paragraph (e) of 4. 37 subdivision one of section five hundred eighty-one of this article shall apply to benefits paid pursuant to the provisions of this section, and 38 if they were paid for effective [days occurring in] weeks following the 39 40 end of a benefit year, they shall be deemed paid with respect to that benefit year. However, except for governmental entities as defined in 41 section five hundred sixty-five and Indian tribes as defined in section 42 43 five hundred sixty-six of this article, only one-half of the amount of 44 such benefits shall be debited to the employers' account; the remainder 45 thereof shall be debited to the general account, and such account shall be credited with the amount of payments received in the fund pursuant to 46 47 the provisions of the federal-state extended unemployment compensation 48 act. Notwithstanding the foregoing, where the state has entered an extended benefit period triggered pursuant to subparagraph one of 49 para-50 graph (a) of subdivision one of this section for which federal law provides for one hundred percent federal sharing of the costs of 51 benecharges shall be debited to the general account and such 52 fits, all account shall be credited with the amount of payments received in the 53 54 fund pursuant to the provisions of the federal-state extended unemploy-55 ment compensation act or other federal law providing for one hundred percent federal sharing for the cost of such benefits. 56

1 S 28. Paragraph (b) of subdivision 5 of section 601 of the labor law, 2 as amended by chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 (b) No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT shall be deemed to occur [in any week] within an eligibility period during which a claimant fails to accept any offer of suitable work or 5 6 7 fails to apply for suitable work to which he or she was referred by the 8 commissioner, who shall make such referral if such work is available, or during which he or she fails to engage actively in seeking work by 9 10 making a systematic and sustained effort to obtain work and providing 11 tangible evidence of such effort, and until he or she has worked in employment during at least four subsequent weeks and earned remuneration 12 13 of at least four times his or her benefit rate.

14 S 29. Paragraph (e) of subdivision 5 of section 601 of the labor law, 15 as amended by chapter 35 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as 16 follows:

17 (e) No [days] WEEKS of total unemployment OR PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT 18 shall be deemed to occur [in any week] within an eligibility period 19 under section five hundred ninety-three of this [article] TITLE, until 20 he or she has subsequently worked in employment in accordance with the 21 requirements set forth in section five hundred ninety-three of this 22 [article] TITLE.

23 S 30. Section 603 of the labor law, as added by chapter 438 of the 24 laws of 1985, is amended to read as follows:

25 S 603. Definitions. For purposes of this title: "Total unemployment" 26 shall mean the total lack of any employment [on any day] DURING ANY WEEK "PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT" SHALL MEAN ANY EMPLOYMENT DURING ANY WEEK 27 AND THAT IS LESS THAN FULL-TIME EMPLOYMENT SO LONG AS THE COMPENSATION 28 PAID THAN THE CLAIMANT'S WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE PLUS THE CLAIMANT'S 29 IS LESS PARTIAL BENEFIT CREDIT, other than with an employer applying for a 30 shared work program. "Full time hours" shall mean at least thirty-five 31 but not more than forty hours per week, and shall not include overtime 32 33 defined in the Fair Labor Standards Act. "Work force" shall mean the as total work force, a clearly identifiable unit or units thereof, or a 34 particular shift or shifts. 35

This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that 36 S 37 the amendments to subdivision 1 of section 591 of the labor law made by 38 section twelve of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 10 of chapter 413 of the 39 40 laws of 2003, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section thirteen of this act shall take effect; provided, further, however, that 41 the amendment to section 591-a of the labor law made by section fourteen 42 43 of this act shall not affect the repeal of such section and shall be 44 deemed repealed therewith.
