- AN ACT to amend chapter 912 of the laws of 1920 relating to the regulation of boxing, sparring and wrestling, in relation to establishing protocols for combative sports and authorizing mixed martial arts events in this state; and in relation to establishing the New York mixed martial arts injury compensation fund, inc.; to amend the workers' compensation law, in relation to benefits secured by the New York mixed martial arts injury compensation fund; to amend the tax law, in relation to the imposition of a tax on the gross receipts of any person holding any professional or amateur boxing, sparring or wrestling match or exhibition, or professional combative sports match or exhibition; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivisions 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of section 4 of chapter 912 2 of the laws of 1920 relating to the regulation of boxing, sparring and 3 wrestling, subdivisions 2 and 6 as amended by chapter 437 of the laws of 4 2002 and subdivisions 3, 4 and 5 as added by chapter 603 of the laws of 5 1981, are amended to read as follows:

6 2. The advisory board shall have power and it shall be the duty of the 7 board to prepare and submit to the commission for approval regulations 8 and standards for the physical examination of professional boxers AND 9 PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS including, without limita-10 tion, pre-fight and/or post-fight examinations and periodic comprehen-11 sive examinations. The board shall continue to serve in an advisory

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capacity to the commission and from time to time prepare and submit to 1 2 the commission for approval, such additional regulations and standards 3 of examination as in their judgment will safeguard the physical welfare 4 of professional boxers licensed by the commission. The advisory board shall recommend to the commission from time to time such qualified 5 6 physicians, for the purpose of conducting physical examinations of 7 professional boxers AND PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS and 8 other services as the rules of the commission shall provide; and shall recommend to the commission a schedule of fees to be paid to physicians 9 10 for such examinations and other services as required by this act.

The advisory board shall develop appropriate medical education 11 3. programs for all commission personnel involved in the conduct of boxing 12 sparring matches or exhibitions OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS 13 and 14 MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS so that such personnel can recognize and act upon 15 evidence of potential or actual adverse medical indications in a partic-16 ipant prior to or during the course of a match OR EXHIBITION.

17 4. The advisory board shall review the credentials and performance of 18 each commission physician on an annual basis as a condition of reap-19 pointment of each such physician, including each such physician's 20 comprehension of the medical literature on boxing OR PROFESSIONAL COMBA-21 TIVE SPORTS referred to in subdivision five of this section.

22 The advisory board shall recommend to the commission a compilation 5. 23 of medical publications on the medical aspects of boxing OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS which shall be maintained by the commission and be made 24 25 available for review to all commission personnel involved in the conduct 26 of any boxing or sparring match or exhibition OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE 27 SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION.

28 6. The advisory board shall also advise the commission on any study of 29 equipment, procedures or personnel which will, in their opinion, promote 30 the safety of boxing participants AND PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS 31 PARTICIPANTS.

32 S 2. Section 5-a of chapter 912 of the laws of 1920 relating to the 33 regulation of boxing, sparring and wrestling, as added by chapter 14 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows: 34 35

S 5-a. Combative sports. 1. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

36 (A) "BOARD" MEANS MEDICAL ADVISORY BOARD AS ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 37 FOUR OF THIS ACT.

38 A "combative sport" shall mean any professional match or exhibi-(B) 39 tion other than boxing, sparring, wrestling or martial arts wherein the 40 contestants deliver, or are not forbidden by the applicable rules thereof from delivering kicks, punches or blows of any kind to the body of an 41 opponent or opponents. For the purposes of this section, the term "martial arts" shall include any professional match or exhibition OF A 42 43 44 SINGLE DISCIPLINE sanctioned by AN ORGANIZATION APPROVED BY THE COMMIS-SION, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, any of the following organizations: 45 U.S. Judo Association, U.S. Judo, Inc., U.S. Judo Federation, U.S. 46 Tae 47 Kwon Do Union, North American Sport Karate Association, U.S.A. Karate 48 Foundation, U.S. Karate, Inc., World Karate Association, Professional Karate Association, Karate International, International Kenpo Associ-49 50 ation, or World Wide Kenpo Association. The commission [is authorized SHALL promulgate regulations which would establish a process to 51 to] allow for the inclusion or removal of martial arts organizations from 52 the above list. Such process shall include but not be limited to consid-53 the following factors: 54 eration of [(a)] (1) is the organization's 55 primary purpose to provide instruction in self defense techniques; [(b)] 56 (2) does the organization require the use of hand, feet and groin

1 protection during any competition or bout; and [(c)] (3) does the organ-2 ization have an established set of rules that require the immediate 3 termination of any competition or bout when any participant has received 4 severe punishment or is in danger of suffering serious physical injury.

5 (C) "COMMISSION" MEANS THE STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION AS PROVIDED FOR 6 IN SECTION ONE OF THIS CHAPTER OR AN AGENT OF THE COMMISSION ACTING ON 7 ITS BEHALF.

8 MARTIAL ARTS" MEANS ANY (D) "MIXED PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS 9 COMPETITION WHEREIN THE RULES OF SUCH COMPETITION SUBJECT TO THE APPLI-10 LIMITATIONS AS SET FORTH BY THE COMMISSION AUTHORIZE PROFESSIONAL CABLE 11 COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS BETWEEN VARIOUS FIGHTING DISCI-12 INCLUDING THE UTILIZATION OF PERMITTED MARTIAL ARTS TECHNIOUES, PLINES, 13 INCLUDING STRIKING, KICKING AND GRAPPLING. NO NON-PROFESSIONAL OR 14 AMATEUR BOUT, EXHIBITION OR PARTICIPANT SHALL BE AUTHORIZED BY THIS 15 SECTION.

16 (E) "PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANT" OR "PARTICIPANT" SHALL 17 MEAN A COMBATIVE SPORTS FIGHTER WHO COMPETES FOR A MONEY PRIZE OR TEACH-18 ES OR PURSUES OR ASSISTS IN THE PRACTICE OF MIXED MARTIAL ARTS AS A 19 MEANS OF OBTAINING A LIVELIHOOD OR PECUNIARY GAIN, AND ANY CONTEST 20 CONFORMING TO THE RULES, REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

(F) "PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION" SHALL MEAN ANY
 MATCH OR EXHIBITION THAT MUST BE APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION WHERE
 PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE CONSIDERATION OF ANY
 VALUE OR AN ADMISSION IS CHARGED.

25 1-A. COMMISSION REVIEW. THE COMMISSION SHALL REVIEW EACH MARTIAL ARTS 26 SANCTIONING ORGANIZATION, INCLUDING THOSE LISTED IN SUBDIVISION ONE OF 27 THIS SECTION, AT LEAST BIENNIALLY, OR SOONER IF DETERMINED NECESSARY 28 BASED UPON THE PERIODIC COMPLIANCE CHECKS OR COMPLAINTS TO THE COMMIS-29 SION, TO DETERMINE CONTINUATION OF THE COMMISSION'S APPROVAL. THE COMMISSION SHALL CONTINUE APPROVAL OR SHALL SUSPEND OR REVOKE APPROVAL 30 BASED UPON COMPLIANCE OF THE ORGANIZATION WITH THE APPROVED SANCTIONING 31 32 STANDARDS AND ITS ABILITY TO SUPERVISE MATCHES IN THE STATE. THE 33 COMMISSION SHALL ACT UPON ANY APPLICATION FOR INCLUSION IN THE LIST IN 34 PARAGRAPH (B) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION WITHIN SIXTY DAYS OF THE DATE SUCH APPLICATION IS MADE TO THE COMMISSION. 35

1-B. MIXED MARTIAL ARTS COMPETITION. (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL PROMUL-36 37 GATE RULES AND REGULATIONS TO ALLOW FOR MIXED MARTIAL ARTS COMPETITIONS 38 TO BE CONDUCTED, HELD, OR GIVEN WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND SHALL 39 ALLOW FOR LICENSES TO BE APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION FOR SUCH MATCHES OR 40 EXHIBITIONS. THE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGU-TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBDIVISION. SUCH RULES AND 41 LATIONS REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, 42 THE ADOPTION OF 43 UNIFIED RULES OF MIXED MARTIAL ARTS, A LICENSING PROCESS FOR MATCHES AND 44 EXHIBITIONS, A FEE SCHEDULE FOR SUCH LICENSES, PROCEDURES TO ALLOW FOR 45 THE PARTICIPATION, PROMOTION, AND ADVANCEMENT OF SUCH EVENTS, THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF PARTICIPANTS, AND THE BEST INTERESTS OF MIXED MARTIAL ARTS 46 47 AND THE ADOPTION OF RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LICENSING AND REGULATION 48 OF ANY AND ALL GYMS, CLUBS, TRAINING CAMPS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAINTAIN TRAINING FACILITIES PROVIDING CONTACT SPARRING FOR PERSONS 49 WHO 50 PREPARE FOR PARTICIPATION IN SUCH PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS OR EXHI-51 BITIONS, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

52 (B) THE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO REQUIRE THAT ALL 53 SITES WHEREIN PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS ARE CONDUCTED SHALL COMPLY 54 WITH STATE AND APPLICABLE LOCAL SANITARY CODES APPROPRIATE TO SCHOOL 55 ATHLETIC FACILITIES. 1 2. [No combative sport shall be conducted, held or given within the 2 state of New York, and no licenses may be approved by the commission for 3 such matches or exhibitions.

4 3. (a) A person who knowingly advances or profits from a combative 5 sport activity shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor, and shall be 6 guilty of a class E felony if he or she has been convicted in the previ-7 ous five years of violating this subdivision.

8 (b) A person advances a combative sport activity when, acting other 9 than as a spectator, he or she engages in conduct which materially aids 10 any combative sport. Such conduct includes but is not limited to conduct directed toward the creation, establishment or performance of a comba-11 tive sport, toward the acquisition or maintenance of premises, parapher-12 13 nalia, equipment or apparatus therefor, toward the solicitation or inducement of persons to attend or participate therein, toward the actu-14 15 al conduct of the performance thereof, toward the arrangement of any of 16 its financial or promotional phases, or toward any other phase of а 17 combative sport. One advances a combative sport activity when, having 18 substantial proprietary or other authoritative control over premises 19 being used with his or her knowledge for purposes of a combative sport 20 activity, he or she permits such to occur or continue or makes no effort 21 to prevent its occurrence or continuation.

(c) A person profits from a combative sport activity when he or she accepts or receives money or other property with intent to participate in the proceeds of a combative sport activity, or pursuant to an agreement or understanding with any person whereby he or she participates or is to participate in the proceeds of a combative sport activity.

27 (d) Any person who knowingly advances or profits from a combative sport activity shall also be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed 28 29 for the first violation ten thousand dollars or twice the amount of gain derived therefrom whichever is greater, or for a subsequent violation 30 twenty thousand dollars or twice the amount of gain derived therefrom 31 The attorney general is hereby empowered to 32 whichever is greater. 33 commence judicial proceedings to recover such penalties and to obtain injunctive relief to enforce the provisions of this section.] PROFES-34 SIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES AND EXHIBITIONS AUTHORIZED. NO COMBATIVE 35 SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION SHALL BE CONDUCTED, HELD OR GIVEN WITHIN THE 36 37 STATE EXCEPT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION AND THE 38 AND REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE COMMISSION PURSUANT THERETO. RULES 39 THE COMMISSION SHALL DIRECT A REPRESENTATIVE TO BE PRESENT AT EACH PLACE 40 WHERE COMBATIVE SPORTS ARE TO BE HELD PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUCH REPRESENTATIVE 41 SECTION. SHALL ASCERTAIN THE EXACT CONDITIONS MATCH OR EXHIBITION AND MAKE A WRITTEN REPORT OF THE 42 SURROUNDING SUCH 43 SAME IN THE MANNER AND FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION. SUCH COMBATIVE 44 SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS MAY BE HELD IN ANY BUILDING FOR WHICH THE 45 COMMISSION IN ITS DISCRETION MAY ISSUE A LICENSE. WHERE SUCH MATCH OR EXHIBITION IS AUTHORIZED TO BE HELD IN A STATE OR CITY OWNED ARMORY, THE 46 47 PROVISION OF THE MILITARY LAW IN RESPECT THERETO MUST BE COMPLIED WITH, 48 BUT NO SUCH MATCH OR EXHIBITION SHALL BE HELD IN A BUILDING WHOLLY USED 49 FOR RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

50 3. JURISDICTION OF COMMISSION. (A) THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE AND HERE-51 BY IS VESTED WITH THE SOLE DIRECTION, MANAGEMENT, CONTROL AND JURISDIC-TION OVER ALL PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS TO BE 52 CONDUCTED, HELD OR GIVEN WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND OVER ALL 53 54 LICENSES TO ANY AND ALL PERSONS WHO PARTICIPATE IN SUCH COMBATIVE SPORTS 55 MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS AND OVER ANY AND ALL GYMS, CLUBS, TRAINING CAMPS 56 ORGANIZATIONS THAT MAINTAIN TRAINING FACILITIES PROVIDING AND OTHER

1 CONTACT SPARRING FOR PERSONS WHO PREPARE FOR PARTICIPATION IN SUCH 2 PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS OR EXHIBITIONS, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE 3 PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

4 (B) THE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO REQUIRE THAT ALL 5 SITES WHEREIN PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS ARE CONDUCTED SHALL COMPLY 6 WITH STATE AND APPLICABLE LOCAL SANITARY CODES APPROPRIATE TO SCHOOL 7 ATHLETIC FACILITIES.

8 4. ENTITIES REQUIRED TO PROCURE LICENSES; PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS DEFINED. EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBDIVISION 9 10 SIX OF THIS SECTION, ALL CORPORATIONS, PERSONS, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPA-NIES, REFEREES, JUDGES, CORPORATION TREASURERS, PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE 11 12 SPORTS PARTICIPANTS, THEIR MANAGERS, PROMOTERS, TRAINERS AND CHIEF SECONDS SHALL BE LICENSED BY THE COMMISSION, AND NO SUCH ENTITY SHALL BE 13 14 PERMITTED TO PARTICIPATE, EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, IN ANY PROFES-15 SIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION, OR THE HOLDING THEREOF, 16 UNLESS SUCH ENTITY SHALL HAVE FIRST PROCURED A LICENSE FROM THE COMMIS-SION. THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH BY RULE AND REGULATION LICENSING 17 STANDARDS FOR REFEREES, JUDGES, MANAGERS, PROMOTERS, TRAINERS AND CHIEF 18 19 SECONDS. ANY MATCH OR EXHIBITION CONFORMING TO THE RULES, REGULATIONS 20 AND REOUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE A PROFESSIONAL 21 COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION.

5. LICENSE TO ENTITIES. (A) THE COMMISSION MAY, IN ITS DISCRETION, ISSUE A LICENSE TO CONDUCT OR HOLD PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS, SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS HEREOF, TO ANY PERSON, CORPO-RATION OR LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY DULY INCORPORATED OR FORMED, HEREIN-AFTER REFERRED TO AS "ENTITY".

(B) A PROSPECTIVE LICENSEE MUST SUBMIT TO THE COMMISSION PROOF THAT IT
 CAN FURNISH SUITABLE PREMISES IN WHICH SUCH MATCH OR EXHIBITION IS TO BE
 HELD.

(C) UPON WRITTEN APPLICATION AND THE PAYMENT OF A FEE OF FIVE HUNDRED
DOLLARS WHICH MUST ACCOMPANY THE APPLICATION, THE COMMISSION MAY GRANT
TO ANY ENTITY HOLDING A LICENSE ISSUED HEREUNDER, THE PRIVILEGE OF HOLDING SUCH A MATCH OR EXHIBITION ON A SPECIFIED DATE IN OTHER PREMISES, OR
IN ANOTHER LOCATION, THAN THE PREMISES OF LOCATION PREVIOUSLY APPROVED
BY THE COMMISSION, SUBJECT HOWEVER TO APPROVAL OF THE COMMISSION AND THE
RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION.

(D) ALL PENALTIES IMPOSED AND COLLECTED BY THE COMMISSION FROM ANY
ENTITY LICENSED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT, WHICH FINES AND PENALTIES ARE IMPOSED AND COLLECTED UNDER THE AUTHORITY HEREBY VESTED SHALL
WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE RECEIPT THEREOF BY THE COMMISSION BE PAID
BY THEM INTO THE STATE TREASURY.

6. TEMPORARY WORKING PERMITS FOR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTIC-42 IPANTS, MANAGERS, TRAINERS AND CHIEF SECONDS. THE COMMISSION MAY ISSUE 43 TEMPORARY WORKING PERMITS TO PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS, 44 45 THEIR MANAGERS, TRAINERS AND CHIEF SECONDS. A TEMPORARY WORKING PERMIT SHALL AUTHORIZE THE EMPLOYMENT OF THE HOLDER OF SUCH PERMIT TO ENGAGE IN 46 47 A SINGLE MATCH OR EXHIBITION AT A SPECIFIED TIME AND PLACE. A TEMPORARY 48 WORKING PERMIT MAY BE ISSUED IF IN THE JUDGMENT OF THE COMMISSION THE 49 PARTICIPATION OF THE HOLDER THEREOF IN A PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS 50 MATCH OR EXHIBITION WILL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSES AND PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE BEST INTERESTS OF COMBATIVE SPORTS GENERALLY, 51 AND THE PUBLIC INTEREST, CONVENIENCE OR NECESSITY. THE COMMISSION MAY 52 REQUIRE THAT PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS APPLYING FOR 53 54 TEMPORARY WORKING PERMITS UNDERGO A PHYSICAL EXAMINATION, NEUROLOGICAL 55 OR NEUROPSYCHOLOGICAL TEST OR PROCEDURE, INCLUDING COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY

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1 OR MEDICALLY EQUIVALENT PROCEDURE. THE FEE FOR SUCH TEMPORARY WORKING 2 PERMIT SHALL BE TWENTY DOLLARS.

7. LICENSE FEES; TERM OF LICENSES; RENEWALS. EACH APPLICANT FOR A 3 4 PROMOTER LICENSE SHALL, BEFORE A LICENSE IS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION, PAY TO THE COMMISSION, AN ANNUAL LICENSE FEE AS FOLLOWS: WHE SEATING CAPACITY IS NOT MORE THAN TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED, 5 WHERE THE 6 FIVE 7 HUNDRED DOLLARS; WHERE THE SEATING CAPACITY IS MORE THAN TWO THOUSAND 8 FIVE HUNDRED BUT NOT MORE THAN FIVE THOUSAND, ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS; WHERE THE SEATING CAPACITY IS MORE THAN FIVE THOUSAND BUT NOT MORE THAN 9 10 FIFTEEN THOUSAND, ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS; WHERE THE SEATING 11 CAPACITY IS MORE THAN FIFTEEN THOUSAND BUT NOT MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND, TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS; WHERE THE SEATING CAPACITY 12 MORE THAN TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND, THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS; 13 IS 14 REFEREE, ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS; JUDGES, ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS; PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANTS, FIFTY DOLLARS; MANAGERS, FIFTY DOLLARS; 15 16 TRAINERS, FIFTY DOLLARS; AND CHIEF SECONDS, FORTY DOLLARS. EACH LICENSE OR RENEWAL THEREOF ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBDIVISION ON OR AFTER OCTO-17 18 BER FIRST SHALL BE EFFECTIVE FOR A LICENSE YEAR EXPIRING ON THE THIRTI-19 ETH DAY OF SEPTEMBER FOLLOWING THE DATE OF ITS ISSUANCE. THE ANNUAL 20 LICENSE FEE PRESCRIBED BY THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE THE LICENSE FEE DUE 21 AND PAYABLE THEREFOR AND SHALL BE PAID IN ADVANCE AT THE TIME APPLICA-IS MADE THEREFOR, AND EACH SUCH LICENSE MAY BE RENEWED FOR PERIODS 22 TION OF ONE YEAR UPON THE PAYMENT OF THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE PRESCRIBED BY 23 24 THIS SUBDIVISION. NO PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 16 EIGHTEEN YEARS SHALL PARTICIPATE IN ANY PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS 17 MATCH OR EXHIBITION, AND NO PERSON UNDER SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE SHALL BE 18 PERMITTED TO ATTEND AS A SPECTATOR; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT A PERSON 19 UNDER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN SHALL BE PERMITTED TO ATTEND AS A SPECTATOR IF 20 ACCOMPANIED BY A PARENT OR GUARDIAN.

21 19. REGULATION OF CONDUCT OF MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS. (A) EXCEPT FOR CHAMPIONSHIP MATCHES, WHICH SHALL NOT BE MORE THAN FIVE ROUNDS, 22 NO COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION SHALL BE MORE THAN THREE ROUNDS IN 23 LENGTH. NO PARTICIPANT SHALL BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN MORE THAN 24 25 THREE MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS OR COMPETE FOR MORE THAN SIXTY MINUTES 26 WITHIN SEVENTY-TWO CONSECUTIVE HOURS. 16 (5) ESTABLISHMENT OF A POLICY CONCERNING THE RESTRICTION OF SMOKING IN 17 TRAINING AREAS, INCLUDING PROVISIONS FOR ITS ENFORCEMENT BY THE FACILITY 18 OPERATOR;

(6) COMPLIANCE WITH STATE AND LOCAL FIRE ORDINANCES;

20 (7) INSPECTION AND APPROVAL OF RINGS AS REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION THIRTY 21 OF THIS SECTION; AND

(8) ESTABLISHMENT OF A POLICY FOR POSTING ALL COMMISSION LICENSE
 SUSPENSIONS AND LICENSE REVOCATIONS RECEIVED FROM THE COMMISSION INCLUD ING PROVISIONS FOR ENFORCEMENT OF SUCH SUSPENSIONS AND REVOCATIONS BY
 THE FACILITY OPERATOR.

(B) A PROSPECTIVE LICENSEE SHALL SUBMIT TO THE COMMISSION PROOF THAT
IT CAN FURNISH SUITABLE FACILITIES IN WHICH THE TRAINING IS TO BE
CONDUCTED, INCLUDING THE MAKING OF SUCH TRAINING FACILITIES AVAILABLE
FOR INSPECTION BY THE COMMISSION AT ANY TIME DURING WHICH TRAINING IS IN
PROGRESS.

28. TEMPORARY TRAINING FACILITIES. ANY TRAINING FACILITY PROVIDING 31 32 CONTACT SPARRING ESTABLISHED AND MAINTAINED ON A TEMPORARY BASIS FOR THE 33 PURPOSE OF PREPARING A PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORT PARTICIPANT FOR A 34 SPECIFIC PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHIBITION TO ΒE CONDUCTED, HELD OR GIVEN WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW YORK 35 SHALL BE EXEMPT THIS ACT INSOFAR AS IT CONCERNS THE LICENSING OF SUCH FACILITIES 36 FROM 37 IF, IN THE JUDGMENT OF THE COMMISSION, ESTABLISHMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF 38 SUCH FACILITY WILL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSES AND PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER, THE BEST INTERESTS OF PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS GENER-39 40 ALLY, AND THE PUBLIC INTEREST, CONVENIENCE OR NECESSITY.

41 29. WEIGHTS; CLASSES AND RULES. THE WEIGHTS AND CLASSES OF COMBATIVE 42 SPORT PARTICIPANTS AND THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF PROFESSIONAL COMBA-43 TIVE SPORTS SHALL BE PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSION.

30. RINGS OR FIGHTING AREAS. NO PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH
OR EXHIBITION OR TRAINING ACTIVITY SHALL BE PERMITTED IN ANY RING OR
FIGHTING AREA UNLESS SUCH RING OR FIGHTING AREA HAS BEEN INSPECTED AND
APPROVED BY THE COMMISSION. THE COMMISSION SHALL PRESCRIBE STANDARD
ACCEPTABLE SIZE AND QUALITY REQUIREMENTS FOR RINGS OR FIGHTING AREAS AND
APPURTENANCES THERETO.

50 31. MISDEMEANOR. ANY ENTITY WHO INTENTIONALLY, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY 51 CONDUCTS, HOLDS OR GIVES A PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCH OR EXHI-52 BITION OR PARTICIPATES EITHER DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY IN ANY SUCH MATCH 53 OR EXHIBITION AS A REFEREE, JUDGE, CORPORATION TREASURER, PROFESSIONAL 54 COMBATIVE SPORTS PARTICIPANT, MANAGER, PROMOTER, TRAINER OR CHIEF 55 SECOND, WITHOUT FIRST HAVING PROCURED AN APPROPRIATE LICENSE OR PERMIT 56 AS PRESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR. 1 S 3. Chapter 912 of the laws of 1920 relating to the regulation of 2 boxing, sparring and wrestling, is amended by adding a new section 5-b 3 to read as follows:

4 S 5-B. NEW YORK MIXED MARTIAL ARTS INJURY COMPENSATION FUND, INC. 1. 5 THERE IS CREATED A NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION TO BE KNOWN AS THE NEW 6 YORK MIXED MARTIAL ARTS INJURY COMPENSATION FUND, INC. IF AN APPLICABLE PROVISION OF THIS ACT OR THE PLAN OF OPERATION OF 12 THE FUND HEREUNDER RELATES TO A MATTER EMBRACED IN A PROVISION OF THE 13 14 NOT-FOR-PROFIT CORPORATION LAW BUT IS NOT IN CONFLICT THEREWITH, BOTH PROVISIONS SHALL APPLY. THE FUND SHALL PERFORM ITS FUNCTIONS UNDER THE 15 16 PLAN OF OPERATION ESTABLISHED AND APPROVED UNDER THIS SECTION AND SHALL THROUGH THE STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION WHO SHALL 17 EXERCISE ITS POWERS DEVELOP REGULATIONS AS TO THE MAKE-UP OF THE FUND'S BOARD OF DIRECTORS. 18

(A) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSIST OF SEVEN MEMBERS, SIX OF 20 ARE TO BE SELECTED FROM THE GENERAL MEMBERSHIP OF THE FUND IN A WHOM 21 MANNER AND FOR TERMS TO BE PRESCRIBED BY THE INITIAL FUND BOARD. THE SEVENTH MEMBER SHALL BE 28 ELECTED EVERY TWO YEARS ON THE SECOND TUESDAY OF JUNE, OR AS DESIGNATED BY THE FUND, 29 PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION BY A VOTE OF MIXED MARTIAL 30 ARTS CONTESTANTS DULY LICENSED PURSUANT TO SECTION FIVE-A OF THIS ACT. 31 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL ELECT ANNUALLY FROM THE MEMBERS A CHAIR-32 THE 33 PERSON AND A VICE-CHAIRPERSON WHO SHALL ACT AS CHAIRPERSON IN THE ABSENCE OF THE CHAIRPERSON. EACH MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL 34 35 HAVE EQUAL VOTING RIGHTS WITH THE OTHERS.

(B) (1) THE ELECTION OF THE SEVENTH BOARD MEMBER SHALL BE CONDUCTED BY 36 37 AN ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR SELECTED BY THE FUND NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER FIFTEENTH OF THE YEAR PRECEDING THE ELECTION. THE FUND SHALL INFORM THE 38 STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION OF ITS SELECTION THEREOF. THE FUND SHALL ENTER 39 40 INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR AT LEAST ONE HUNDRED TWENTY DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE ELECTION. THE FUND SHALL BE RESPON-41 SIBLE FOR COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE CONTRACT WITH THE ELECTION ADMINIS-42 43 TRATOR.

(2) THE ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR MAY BE THE INDIVIDUAL, ORGANIZATION, OR 44 45 CORPORATION UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE FUND TO PROVIDE MANAGEMENT SERVICES OF NOVEMBER FIFTEENTH OF THE YEAR PRECEDING THE ELECTION. THE 46 AS 47 ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR SHALL DEVISE AND PROVIDE NOMINATING PETITIONS TO 48 CANDIDATES, SHALL VALIDATE SUCH PETITIONS UPON SUBMITTAL BY VERIFYING MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS TO SIGN SUCH 49 THE ELIGIBILITY OF THE MIXED 50 PETITIONS, AND SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE PRINTING, DISSEMINATION, 51 VALIDATION, AND TABULATION OF BALLOTS FOR SUCH ELECTION. THE STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION SHALL PROVIDE A LIST OF ALL DULY LICENSED MIXED 52 MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO THE FUND FOR 53 PURPOSES OF VALIDATING NOMINATING PETITIONS AND BALLOTS. THE ELECTION 54 55 ADMINISTRATOR SHALL REPORT THE RESULTS OF THE ELECTION TO THE STATE

ATHLETIC COMMISSION, WHICH SHALL THEN CERTIFY THE ELECTION OF THE 1 2 SEVENTH BOARD MEMBER. 3 (3) ANY INDIVIDUAL SEEKING ELECTION PURSUANT TO THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL 4 PROVIDE A NOMINATING PETITION CONTAINING THE SIGNATURES OF NO FEWER THAN 5 TEN DULY LICENSED MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS ELIGIBLE TO SIGN SUCH 6 PETITION. TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SIGN SUCH PETITION, A MIXED MARTIAL ARTS 7 CONTESTANT SHALL POSSESS A VALID LICENSE ISSUED BY THE STATE ATHLETIC 8 COMMISSION AS OF MARCH FIRST IN THE YEAR OF THE ELECTION. SUCH PETITIONS 9 MAY BE SIGNED BY ELIGIBLE MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS BEGINNING APRIL 10 FIRST OF AN ELECTION YEAR AND SHALL BE RETURNED TO THE ELECTION ADMINIS-TRATOR FOR VALIDATION NO LATER THAN THE FIRST MONDAY OF MAY OF 11 AN ELECTION YEAR. IF A MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANT'S LICENSE EXPIRES 12 13 BETWEEN MARCH SECOND AND THE FIRST MONDAY OF MAY AND HAS NOT BEEN 14 RENEWED BY THE LATTER DATE, THE ELECTION ADMINISTRATOR SHALL INVALIDATE 15 SUCH MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANT'S SIGNATURE ON THE NOMINATING PETI-16 TION SO SUBMITTED. (4) TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THE ELECTION, MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTES-17 TANTS AND APPRENTICE MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS MUST POSSESS A VALID

18 TANTS AND APPRENTICE MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS MUST POSSESS A VALID 19 MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANT'S LICENSE AT LEAST THIRTY DAYS PRIOR TO 20 THE DATE OF THE ELECTION. IF SUCH MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANT'S 21 LICENSE EXPIRES DURING THE THIRTY DAYS PRECEDING THE ELECTION AND SUCH 22 LICENSE HAS NOT BEEN RENEWED AS OF THE DATE OF THE ELECTION, SUCH MIXED 23 MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANT SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE.

24 (5) IF, FOLLOWING AN ELECTION OF THE SEVENTH BOARD MEMBER, SUCH MEMBER 25 UNABLE TO DISCHARGE HIS OR HER DUTIES AS A BOARD MEMBER OR IS OTHER-IS WISE UNABLE TO COMPLETE HIS OR HER TERM, THE FUND'S CHAIRPERSON SHALL 26 27 OFFER THE SEVENTH BOARD MEMBER'S POSITION TO THE CANDIDATE WHO RECEIVED THE HIGHEST TOTAL NUMBER OF VOTES FOLLOWING THAT RECEIVED BY THE ELECTED 28 BOARD MEMBER DURING THE ELECTION. IF SUCH CANDIDATE DECLINES TO 29 ACCEPT SUCH POSITION, THE CHAIRPERSON SHALL OFFER THE POSITION TO EACH REMAIN-30 ING CANDIDATE IN DESCENDING ORDER OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF VOTES RECEIVED 31 32 EACH SUCH CANDIDATE DURING THE ELECTION UNTIL A CANDIDATE HAS ΒY 33 ACCEPTED THE POSITION. IF NONE OF THE REMAINING CANDIDATES HAS ACCEPTED THE POSITION, THE CHAIRPERSON MAY APPOINT AN INTERIM MEMBER TO THE POSI-34 35 TION FOR SUCH TIME AS INTERVENES UNTIL A NEW SEVENTH BOARD MEMBER IS 36 ELECTED.

37 3. MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION 38 FOR THEIR SERVICES, BUT SHALL BE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR ACTUAL 39 AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR OFFICIAL 40 DUTIES.

41 4. MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY 42 LAW, MAY ENGAGE IN PRIVATE EMPLOYMENT, OR IN A PROFESSION OR BUSINESS.

5. THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF FOUR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
SHALL BE NECESSARY FOR THE TRANSACTION OF ANY BUSINESS OR THE EXERCISE
OF ANY POWER OR FUNCTION OF THE FUND. THE FUND MAY DELEGATE TO ONE OR
MORE OF ITS MEMBERS, OR ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS OR EMPLOYEES, SUCH POWERS
AND DUTIES AS IT MAY DEEM PROPER.

6. THE FUND SHALL SECURE HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE ON A BLANKET BASIS FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL PROFESSIONAL MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS WHO PARTICIPATE IN AND SUSTAIN PHYSICAL INJURY AS A RESULT OF PARTICIPATING IN A NEW YORK STATE SANCTIONED MIXED MARTIAL ARTS EVENT AND COVER LIABILITIES REGARDLESS OF ANY LENGTH OF TIME BETWEEN A SANCTIONED MATCH AND THE DISCOVERY OF INJURY.

54 7. IN ORDER TO PAY THE COSTS OF THE INSURANCE REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION 55 AND TO CARRY OUT ITS OTHER POWERS AND DUTIES AND TO PAY FOR ANY OF ITS 56 LIABILITIES THE FUND SHALL ASCERTAIN THE TOTAL FUNDING NECESSARY AND

ESTABLISH THE SUMS THAT ARE TO BE PAID BY ALL MIXED MARTIAL ARTS ORGAN-1 2 IZATIONS LICENSED OR REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED UNDER SECTION FIVE-A OF 3 THIS ACT TO OBTAIN THE TOTAL FUNDING AMOUNT REQUIRED ANNUALLY. IN ORDER 4 TO PROVIDE THAT ANY SUM REQUIRED TO BE PAID BY AN ORGANIZATION BE EQUI-5 TABLE, THE FUND SHALL ESTABLISH PAYMENT SCHEDULES WHICH REFLECT SUCH 6 FACTORS AS ARE APPROPRIATE, INCLUDING WHERE APPLICABLE, THE DURATION OF 7 SUCH PARTICIPATION, THE AMOUNT OF ANY PURSE EARNINGS, THE NUMBER OF MIXED MARTIAL ARTS CONTESTANTS INVOLVED, OR SUCH OTHER FACTORS AS THE 8 9 FUND SHALL DETERMINE TO BE FAIR, EQUITABLE AND IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF 10 MIXED MARTIAL ARTS. IN NO EVENT SHALL THE AMOUNT DEDUCTED FROM AN 11 OWNER'S SHARE EXCEED FIVE PER CENTUM OF THE OVERALL TAKE. IN THE CASES OF MULTIPLE OWNERSHIPS THE FUND SHALL EOUITABLY ADJUST THE SUM REOUIRED. 12 THE FUND SHALL SUBMIT TO THE STATE ATHLETIC COMMISSION A PLAN 13 8. (A) 14 OF OPERATION AND ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO NECESSARY OR SUITABLE TO ASSURE 15 THE FAIR, REASONABLE AND EQUITABLE ADMINISTRATION OF THE FUND. SUCH AMENDMENTS, IF ANY, RELATING TO THE ASSESSMENT OF THE COSTS OF INSURANCE 16 FOR THE SUBSEQUENT YEAR, OTHER THAN DEFICIENCY ASSESSMENTS, 17 SHALL BE 18 SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER FIFTEENTH OF EACH YEAR. 19 THE PLAN OF OPERATION AND ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE 20 UPON APPROVAL IN WRITING BY THE BOARD, AND SHALL BE PUBLISHED BY THE 21 FUND UPON SUCH APPROVAL IN ONE OR MORE TRADE PUBLICATIONS LIKELY TO BE 22 OBTAINED BY OWNERS. IF THE FUND FAILS TO SUBMIT A SUITABLE PLAN OF OPERATION WITHIN 23 (B) 24 ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS FOLLOWING THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION OR 25 AT ANY TIME THEREAFTER THE FUND FAILS TO SUBMIT SUITABLE AMENDMENTS ΙF 26 TO THE PLAN, THE BOARD SHALL, AFTER NOTICE AND HEARING, ADOPT AND 27 PROMULGATE SUCH REASONABLE RULES AS ARE NECESSARY OR ADVISABLE TO EFFEC-28

28 TUATE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION. SUCH RULES SHALL CONTINUE IN FORCE 29 UNTIL MODIFIED BY THE BOARD OR SUPERSEDED BY A PLAN SUBMITTED BY THE 30 FUND AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD.

(C) THE PLAN OF OPERATION SHALL CONSTITUTE THE BY-LAWS OF THE FUND AND
 SHALL, IN ADDITION TO REQUIREMENTS ENUMERATED ELSEWHERE IN THIS SECTION:
 (1) ESTABLISH PROCEDURES FOR HANDLING THE ASSETS OF THE FUND.

40 (5) ESTABLISH THE RULES AND PROCEDURES TO GOVERN THE CONDUCT OF AN 41 ELECTION HELD PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (B) OF SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS 42 SECTION.

43 (6) CONTAIN SUCH ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS AS THE BOARD OR FUND MAY DEEM 44 NECESSARY OR PROPER FOR THE EXECUTION OF THE POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE 45 FUND.

9. THE FUND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO EXAMINATION AND REGULATION BY THE STATE COMPTROLLER. The commission shall have and hereby is vested with the sole direction, management, control and juris-16 all such boxing and sparring matches or exhibitions OR 17 diction over PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS to be conducted, 18 19 held or given within the state of New York and over all licenses to any 20 and all persons who participate in such boxing or sparring matches or 21 exhibitions OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS and 22 over any and all gyms, clubs, training camps and other organizations that maintain training facilities providing contact sparring for persons 23 prepare for participation in such boxing or sparring matches or 24 who 25 exhibitions OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS, and 26 over the promotion of professional wrestling exhibitions OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS to the extent provided for in 27 sections 5, 9, 19, 20, 28-a, 28-b and 33 of this act, except as other-28 29 wise provided in this act.

2. The commission is authorized and directed to require that all sites wherein boxing, sparring and wrestling matches and exhibitions OR PROFESSIONAL COMBATIVE SPORTS MATCHES OR EXHIBITIONS are conducted shall comply with state and applicable local sanitary codes appropriate to school athletic facilities.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, and for purposes of this chapter only, the employer of a black car operator, as defined in article six-F of the executive law, shall, on and after the fund liability date, as defined in such article, be the New York black car operators' injury compensation fund, inc. created pursuant to such article.

For the purpose of this chapter only, whether a livery base operating in any locality where liveries must register with a local taxi and limousine commission shall be deemed the "employer" of any livery driver engaging in covered services shall be determined in accordance with section eighteen-c of this chapter.
