AN ACT to authorize Higher Ground Worship Center, Inc. to file applications for real property tax exemptions

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the assessor of the city of Schenectady is hereby authorized to accept from Higher Ground Worship Center, Inc., applications for exemptions from real property taxes pursuant to section 420-a of the real property 5 tax law for the 2009 real property taxes for the parcels owned by Higher Ground Worship Center, Inc. located in the city of Schenectady at 801 Stanley Street, Schenectady, otherwise known as section 49.33, block 4, 7 8 lot 1.1; 803 Stanley Street, otherwise known as section 49.33, block 9 1.2. If accepted, the applications shall be reviewed as if they had been received on or before the taxable status date established for the 10 If satisfied that Higher Ground Worship imposition of such taxes. 11 12 Center, Inc. would otherwise be entitled to such exemptions if filed the applications for the exemptions by the appropriate taxable 13 status dates, the assessor of the city of Schenectady may upon approval 14 the city council of such city, grant exemptions from real property 15 16 taxation for the 2009 tax years and owing by such not-for-profit organ-17 ization on the effective date of this act, and make appropriate correction of the applicable rolls. If such exemptions are granted and 18 if such not-for-profit organization shall have paid any tax with respect 19 20 subject rolls, the governing body or tax department may, in its sole discretion, provide for the refund of those taxes paid and cancel 21 taxes, fines, penalties or interest remaining unpaid. 22

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
