- AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to making technical corrections to the "New York state commercial goods transportation industry fair play act"; and to amend chapter 558 of the laws of 2013 amending the labor law relating to enacting the "New York state commercial goods transportation industry fair play act", in relation to the effectiveness thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Sections 862-a, 862-b and 862-c of the labor law, as added by chapter 558 of the laws of 2013, are amended to read as follows: S 862-a. Definitions. As used in this article:

1. "Commercial goods transportation contractor" means any sole propri-4 5 etor, partnership, firm, corporation, limited liability company, associ-6 ation or other legal entity [permitted by law to do business within the 7 state who] THAT compensates [commercial vehicle drivers] A DRIVER who possesses a state-issued [commercial] driver's license [to transport], 8 9 TRANSPORTS goods in the state of New York AND OPERATES A COMMERCIAL 10 MOTOR VEHICLE AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION FOUR-A OF SECTION TWO OF THE 11 TRANSPORTATION LAW.

12 2. "Commercial goods transportation contractor" includes a general 13 commercial goods transportation contractor or a commercial goods trans-14 portation subcontractor.

15 3. "Commercial goods transportation services" means the transportation 16 of goods for compensation by a [commercial vehicle] driver who possesses 17 a state-issued [commercial] driver's license [and], transports goods in 18 the state of New York, AND OPERATES A COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE AS 19 DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION FOUR-A OF SECTION TWO OF THE TRANSPORTATION LAW. 20 4. "Department" means the department of labor.

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5. "Commissioner" means the commissioner of labor. 1 2 "Employer" means any commercial goods transportation contractor 6. 3 which compensates [commercial vehicle drivers who possess a state-issued 4 commercial driver's license to transport goods in the state of New York] 5 PERSON CLASSIFIED AS AN EMPLOYEE UNDER SECTION EIGHT HUNDRED А 6 SIXTY-TWO-B OF THIS ARTICLE. 7 S 862-b. Presumption of employment in the commercial goods transporta-8 tion industry. 1. Any person performing commercial goods transportation 9 services for a commercial goods transportation contractor shall be clas-10 sified as an employee OF THE COMMERCIAL GOODS TRANSPORTATION CONTRACTOR unless PAYMENT FOR SUCH SERVICES IS REPORTED ON A FEDERAL 11 INCOME TAX FORM 1099 IF REQUIRED BY LAW AND EITHER the person is a separate busi-12 ness entity under subdivision two of this section or all of the follow-13 14 ing criteria are met, in which case the person shall be an independent 15 contractor: 16 (a) the individual is free from control and direction in performing 17 the job, both under his or her contract and in fact; 18 (b) the service must be performed outside the usual course of business 19 for which the service is performed; and (c) the individual is customarily engaged in an independently estab-20 21 lished trade, occupation, profession, or business that is similar to the 22 service at issue. 23 2. A business entity, including any sole proprietor, partnership, FIRM, corporation, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, ASSOCIATION or OTHER LEGAL 24 25 entity that may ALSO be a commercial goods transportation contractor 26 under this section shall be considered a separate business entity from the commercial goods transportation contractor where all the following 27 28 criteria are met: 29 (a) the business entity is performing the service free from the direc-30 tion or control over the means and manner of providing the service, subject only to the right of the commercial goods transportation 31 contractor for whom the service is provided to specify the desired 32 33 result or federal rule or regulation; 34 (b) the business entity is not subject to cancellation or destruction 35 upon severance of the relationship with the commercial goods transporta-36 tion contractor; 37 (c) the business entity has a substantial investment of capital in the 38 business entity, including but not limited to ordinary tools and equip-39 ment; 40 (d) the business entity owns or leases the capital goods and gains the profits and bears the losses of the business entity; 41 42 (e) the business entity [has an option to] MAY make its services 43 available to the general public or OTHERS NOT A PARTY TO THE BUSINESS 44 ENTITY'S WRITTEN CONTRACT REFERENCED IN PARAGRAPH (G) OF THIS SUBDIVI-SION IN the business community on a continuing basis; (f) the business entity [includes] PROVIDES services [rendered] 45 46 47 REPORTED on a Federal Income Tax [Schedule as an independent business or 48 profession] FORM 1099, IF REQUIRED BY LAW; the business entity performs services for the commercial goods 49 (q) 50 transportation contractor pursuant to a written contract, under the 51 business entity's name, specifying their relationship to be as independent contractors or separate business entities; 52 (h) when the services being provided require a license or permit, the 53 54 business entity pays for the license or permit in the business entity's 55 name or, where permitted by law, pays for reasonable use of the commer-56 cial goods transportation contractor's license or permit;

1 (i) if necessary, the business entity hires its own employees WITHOUT 2 THE COMMERCIAL GOODS TRANSPORTATION CONTRACTOR'S APPROVAL, subject to 3 applicable qualification requirements or federal or state laws, rules or 4 regulations, AND pays the employees without reimbursement from the 5 commercial [good] GOODS transportation contractor [and reports the 6 employees' income to the Internal Revenue Service];

7 (j) the commercial goods transportation contractor does not require 8 that the business entity be represented as an employee of the commercial 9 goods transportation contractor to its customers; and

10 (k) the business entity has the right to perform similar services for 11 others on whatever basis and whenever it chooses.

12 3. The failure to withhold federal or state income taxes or to pay 13 unemployment compensation contributions or workers' compensation premi-14 ums with respect to an individual's wages shall not be considered in 15 making a determination under this section, except as set forth in para-16 graph (f) of subdivision two of this section.

4. An individual's act of securing workers' compensation insurance
with a carrier as a sole proprietor, partnership or otherwise shall not
be binding on any determination under this section.

5. When a business entity meets the definition of a separate business entity pursuant to subdivision two of this section, the separate business entity will be considered a commercial goods transportation contractor subject to all the provisions of this article in regard to the classification of individuals performing services for it.

25 S 862-c. Notice to persons receiving remuneration from commercial 26 goods transportation contractors and commercial goods transportation subcontractors. 1. Every commercial goods transportation contractor shall post in a prominent and accessible place on the site where commer-27 28 29 cial goods transportation activity is conducted a legible statement, 30 provided by the commissioner, that describes the responsibility of independent contractors to pay taxes required by state and federal law, the 31 32 rights of employees to workers' compensation, unemployment benefits, 33 minimum wage, overtime and other federal and state workplace protections, and the protections against retaliation and the penalties in this article if the contractor fails to properly classify an individ-34 35 ual as an employee. This notice shall also contain contact information 36 37 for individuals to file complaints or inquire with the commissioner about employment classification status. This information shall be provided in English, Spanish or other languages required by the commis-38 39 40 sioner. [The posted statement shall be constructed of materials capable of withstanding adverse weather conditions.] 41

42 2. Within thirty days of the effective date of this article, the 43 commissioner shall create the notice described in subdivision one of 44 this section and post the notice on the department's website for down-45 loading by commercial goods transportation contractors.

46 3. Commercial goods transportation contractors who violate this 47 section shall be subject to a civil penalty of up to one thousand five 48 hundred dollars for a first violation, and up to five thousand dollars 49 for a subsequent violation within a five year period.

50 S 2. Section 5 of chapter 558 of the laws of 2013 amending the labor 51 law relating to enacting the "New York state commercial goods transpor-52 tation industry fair play act" is amended to read as follows:
