AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to banning formaldehyde in certain children's products

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section  
2     2507 to read as follows:  
3     S 2507. BANNING FORMALDEHYDE IN CERTAIN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS. 1. DEFINI-  
4     TIONS. "CHILDREN'S PRODUCT" MEANS A PRODUCT PRIMARILY DESIGNED OR  
5     INTENDED BY A MANUFACTURER TO BE PHYSICALLY APPLIED TO OR INTRODUCED  
6     INTO A CHILD'S BODY, INCLUDING ANY ARTICLE USED AS A COMPONENT OF SUCH A  
7     PRODUCT AND EXCLUDING A FOOD, BEVERAGE, DIETARY SUPPLEMENT, PHARMACEU-  
8     TICAL PRODUCT OR BIOLOGIC, CHILDREN'S TOYS THAT ARE COVERED BY THE ASTM  
9     INTERNATIONAL F963 STANDARD FOR TOY SAFETY, OR A MEDICAL DEVICE AS  
10    DEFINED IN THE FEDERAL FOOD, DRUG, AND COSMETIC ACT, 21 USC 321(H), AS  
11    AMENDED THROUGH FEBRUARY FIFTEENTH, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN.  
12    2. FORMALDEHYDE IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS; BAN. (A) BEGINNING JANUARY  
13    FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN, NO MANUFACTURER OR WHOLESALE MAY SELL OR  
14    OFFER FOR SALE IN THIS STATE A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT THAT INTENTIONALLY  
15    CONTAINS:  
16    (I) FORMALDEHYDE, INCLUDING FORMALDEHYDE CONTAINED IN A SOLUTION; OR  
17    (II) INGREDIENTS THAT CHEMICALLY DEGRADE UNDER NORMAL CONDITIONS OF  
18    TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE TO RELEASE FORMALDEHYDE.  
19    (B) BEGINNING JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN, NO RETAILER MAY  
20    SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE IN THIS STATE A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT THAT INTEN-  
21    TIONALLY CONTAINS:  
22    (I) FORMALDEHYDE, INCLUDING FORMALDEHYDE CONTAINED IN A SOLUTION; OR  
23    (II) INGREDIENTS THAT CHEMICALLY DEGRADE UNDER NORMAL CONDITIONS OF  
24    TEMPERATURE AND PRESSURE TO RELEASE FORMALDEHYDE.  
25    3. FORMALDEHYDE REPLACEMENT CHEMICALS. A MANUFACTURER SHALL NOT  
26    REPLACE A CHEMICAL WHOSE USE IS PROHIBITED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS  
27    SECTION WITH A CHEMICAL KNOWN TO THE MANUFACTURER TO HAVE BEEN IDENTI-  
28    FIED ON THE BASIS OF CREDIBLE SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE BY A STATE, FEDERAL,

1 OR INTERNATIONAL AGENCY AS BEING KNOWN OR SUSPECTED WITH A HIGH DEGREE  
2 OF PROBABILITY TO:  
3 (A) HARM THE NORMAL DEVELOPMENT OF A FETUS OR CHILD OR CAUSE OTHER  
4 DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICITY;  
5 (B) CAUSE CANCER, GENETIC DAMAGE, OR REPRODUCTIVE HARM;  
6 (C) DISRUPT THE ENDOCRINE OR HORMONE SYSTEM; OR
