AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to provisions governing the location and layout of premises of licensed retailers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivisions 2 and 10 of section 105 of the alcoholic beverage control law, subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 536 of the laws of 1966 and paragraph (a) of subdivision 10 as amended by chapter 679 of the laws of 1950, are amended to read as follows:

- 2. No premises shall be licensed to sell liquors and/or wines at retail for off premises consumption, unless said premises shall be located in a store, the principal entrance to which shall be CLEARLY VISIBLE from [the street level] GROUND LEVEL and located on a public thoroughfare in premises which may be occupied, operated or conducted for business, trade or industry or on an arcade or sub-surface thoroughfare leading to a railroad terminal. [There may be not more than one additional entrance which shall be from the street level and located on and giving access to and from a public or private parking lot or parking area having space for not less than five automobiles.]
- 10. [(a)] Each retail licensee of liquor and/or wine for off-premises consumption shall have conspicuously displayed within the interior of the licensed premises where sales are made and where it can be readily inspected by consumers a printed price list of the liquors and/or wines offered for sale therein; and no liquor and/or wine shall be sold except at the price set forth in such list[;
- (b) No screen, blind, curtain, partition, article or thing shall be permitted in the windows or upon the doors of such licensed premises,

which shall prevent a clear view into the interior of such licensed premises from the sidewalk, at all times; and

- (c) No booth, screen, partition or other obstruction shall be permitted in the interior of said licensed premises].
- 5 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
