amend the election law, in relation to the boundaries of AN ACT to election districts and the designation of polling places

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4-104 of the election law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 5-a to read as follows:

- 5-A. WHENEVER A CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OF A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY CONTAINS THREE HUNDRED OR MORE REGISTRANTS (EXCLUDING REGISTRANTS IN INACTIVE STATUS) WHO ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE AT AN ADDRESS CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY, THE POLLING PLACE DESIGNATED FOR SUCH REGISTRANTS SHALL BE ON SUCH CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OR AT A LOCATION APPROVED BYCOLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY.
- 9 Paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 4-100 of the election 10 law, as amended by chapter 659 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as follows: 11
- 12 a. Each election district shall be in compact form and may not be 13 partly within and partly without a ward, town, city, a village which has five thousand or more inhabitants and is wholly within one town, 14 CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OF A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY WHICH CONTAINS THREE 15 HUNDRED OR MORE REGISTRANTS (EXCLUDING REGISTRANTS IN 16 INACTIVE WHO ARE REGISTERED TO VOTE AT AN ADDRESS ON SUCH CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY, or 17 18 county legislative, assembly, senatorial or congressional district.
- Except as provided in paragraph b of this subdivision, election district
- 20 boundaries, other than those boundaries which are coterminous with the 21 boundaries of those political subdivisions AND COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY

PROPERTIES mentioned in this paragraph, must be streets, rivers, railroad lines or other permanent characteristics of the landscape which are
clearly visible to any person without the need to use any technical or
mechanical device. An election district shall contain not more than nine
hundred fifty registrants (excluding registrants in inactive status) or,
with the approval of the county board of elections, not more than eleven
hundred fifty registrants (excluding registrants in inactive status),
but any election district may be divided for the convenience of the
voters.
