- AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to requiring all motor vehicle insurers to file annual financial statements and detailed claim data with the superintendent of financial services

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "automobile 2 insurance sunshine act of 2015".

3 2. Legislative intent. The legislature hereby finds and declares S 4 that insurance companies issuing motor vehicle policies in this state 5 owe a duty to the consumers they insure and to those who may in the 6 future be insured by them, to fully disclose in a public and transparent 7 manner all elements relating to their financial condition and solvency. 8 Automobile use and operation is a cornerstone of modern life; in fact, 9 auto insurance is the only coverage most New Yorkers are required by law to purchase. New York's consumers have a right to know the details and 10 specifics of the factors and circumstances behind the financial solvency 11 of their insurer as well as the bases for the rates they are required to 12 13 pay to retain their legally mandated coverage. The determination of auto insurance premiums in New York has, unfortunately, gone on too long in 14 15 obscurity, with those who bear the premium rates unable to learn reasons why they are set where they are. As a matter of public trust, automobile 16 liability insurers should make public the pertinent facts related 17 to

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1 their premium determinations and financial solvency. It is the sense of 2 the legislature that this data should be disclosed in an open and public 3 manner.

4 S 3. The insurance law is amended by adding a new section 343 to read 5 as follows:

6 S 343. FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND DETAILED CLAIM DATA TO BE FILED WITH 7 THE DEPARTMENT. (A) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, THE TERM "INSURER" 8 SHALL MEAN ANY PERSON, CORPORATION, ASSOCIATION OR OTHER BUSINESS ENTITY 9 AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE A MOTOR VEHICLE INSURANCE POLICY IN THIS STATE.

10 (B) ON OR BEFORE APRIL FIRST OF EACH YEAR, EVERY INSURER SHALL PROVIDE 11 THE SUPERINTENDENT WITH A DETAILED FINANCIAL STATEMENT TO SUPPLEMENT AND 12 EXPAND UPON THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE STATUTORY ANNUAL STATEMENT 13 MOST RECENTLY CONCLUDED CALENDAR YEAR. THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT FOR THE 14 SHALL CONTAIN INFORMATION ON A COMBINED BASIS FOR ALL LINES OF INSURANCE 15 AS WELL AS INFORMATION SEPARATELY FOR EACH OF THE FOLLOWING LINES OF 16 INSURANCE: (1) PRIVATE PASSENGER AUTOMOBILE OTHER LIABILITY, (2) PRIVATE PASSENGER AUTOMOBILE PERSONAL INJURY PROTECTION, (3) PRIVATE PASSENGER 17 18 AUTOMOBILE PHYSICAL DAMAGE, (4) COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE OTHER LIABILITY, 19 (5) COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE PERSONAL INJURY PROTECTION, AND (6) COMMERCIAL PHYSICAL DAMAGE. SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENT SHALL INCLUDE THE 20 AUTOMOBILE 21 ENTIRETY OF ITS BUSINESS ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN THIS STATE, OR 22 THIS STATE, BUT HAVING A NEXUS TO INSURANCE POLICIES CONDUCTED OUTSIDE 23 OR CONTRACTS OF INSURANCE INSURING PERSONS OR RISKS IN THIS STATE, 24 CONSISTENT WITH THE PROCEDURES FOR DETERMINING NEW YORK STATE INSURANCE 25 BUSINESS FOR STATUTORY ANNUAL STATEMENT REPORTING PURPOSES. SUCH STATE-26 MENT SHALL BE IN A FORM DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT. THE FORM SHALL 27 SUFFICIENTLY ITEMIZED IN A MANNER THAT ALLOWS FOR AN ACTUARIALLY ΒE 28 SOUND ANALYSIS OF THE INCOME REALIZED BY THE INSURER FROM ALL SOURCES 29 DURING SUCH YEAR, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PREMIUMS, INVESTMENT 30 INCOME, PROFIT FROM SALE OF ASSETS AND ANY OTHER CATEGORY OR CATEGORIES AS DETERMINED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT TO REFLECT THE FULL 31 OF INCOME 32 DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. AT A MINIMUM, SUCH INFORMATION 33 SHALL CONSIST OF THE ITEMS SET FORTH IN THE STATEMENT OF INCOME, EXCLUD-CAPITAL AND SURPLUS ACCOUNT SECTION OF THE PROPERTY/CASUALTY 34 ING THE 35 STATUTORY ANNUAL STATEMENT, AS APPLICABLE TO THE INSURER'S NEW YORK WELL AS THE OTHER INFORMATION DELINEATED IN THIS 36 STATE BUSINESS, AS 37 SUBSECTION. SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENT SHALL ALSO CONTAIN A COMPREHENSIVE 38 DETAILED DISCLOSURE OF THE INSURER'S EXPENSES ACTUALLY INCURRED AND AND PAID DURING SUCH CALENDAR YEAR, TO INCLUDE NORMAL BUSINESS 39 EXPENSES, 40 COMMISSIONS, CONSULTING FEES, LEGAL EXPENSES, ADVERTISING SALARIES, COSTS AND ANY OTHER CATEGORY DEEMED PERTINENT 41 ΤO THE INTENT OF THIS SECTION. AT A MINIMUM, THE EXPENSE INFORMATION REQUIRED SHALL CONSIST OF 42 43 ITEMS SET FORTH IN THE UNDERWRITING AND INVESTMENT EXHIBIT - PART 3 THE 44 - EXPENSES OF THE PROPERTY / CASUALTY STATUTORY ANNUAL STATEMENT, AS 45 INSURER'S NEW YORK STATE BUSINESS. WITH RESPECT TO APPLICABLE TO THE SALARIES (INCLUDING ALL OTHER FORMS OF COMPENSATION), EACH INSURER SHALL 46 47 ITEMIZE THE SALARY OF THE TWENTY MOST HIGHLY COMPENSATED EMPLOYEES OF 48 SUCH INSURER DURING SUCH YEAR, PROVIDED THAT THE NAME OF SUCH EMPLOYEES 49 NEED NOT BE DISCLOSED. SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENT SHALL ALSO PROVIDE THE 50 WITH A SYNOPSIS OF CLAIMS OR SETTLEMENTS PAID PURSUANT TO SUCH PUBLIC 51 POLICIES OR CONTRACTS, LISTING THE TOTAL OF SUCH CLAIMS AND SETTLEMENTS BY TYPE OF INSURANCE OR THE RISK INSURED. AT A MINIMUM, THE CLAIM INFOR-52 53 MATION REQUIRED SHALL CONSIST OF THE ITEMS SET FORTH IN THE EXHIBIT OF 54 PREMIUMS AND LOSSES OF THE PROPERTY / CASUALTY STATUTORY ANNUAL STATE-55 MENT, AS APPLICABLE TO THE INSURER'S NEW YORK STATE BUSINESS AND IDENTI-56 FIED AND CATEGORIZED SEPARATELY FOR EACH ZIP CODE IN THIS STATE. SUCH

FINANCIAL STATEMENT SHALL BE SIGNED AND ATTESTED AS FULL, COMPLETE 1 AND ACCURATE BY THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE INSURER, AND HE OR SHE 2 3 SHALL BE HELD PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE WITH RESPECT TO THE ACCURACY OF THE CONTENT OF SUCH STATEMENT. THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL PROVIDE INSURERS 4 5 WITH A METHOD TO SUBMIT THEIR FINANCIAL STATEMENTS ELECTRONICALLY VIA 6 INTERNET, WHICH METHOD SHALL INCLUDE INSTRUCTIONS RELATING TO THE THE 7 USE OF AN ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE WHICH SHALL BE SUBJECT TO, AND SUBMITTED 8 ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION THREE HUNDRED SIXTEEN OF THIS ARTICLE; IN PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT NO EXCEPTION AUTHORIZED IN SUCH SECTION MAY BE 9 10 REQUESTED OR GRANTED.

11 (C) ON OR BEFORE APRIL FIRST OF EACH YEAR, EVERY INSURER SHALL PROVIDE 12 SUPERINTENDENT WITH DETAILED CLOSED CLAIM INFORMATION FOR THE SAME THE LINES OF INSURANCE PROVIDED FOR IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FOR 13 14 THE MOST RECENTLY CONCLUDED CALENDAR YEAR. UNTIL THE SUPERINTENDENT 15 PROMULGATES DATA COLLECTION FORMS AND PROCEDURES FOR PRIVATE PASSENGER 16 AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE, DATA SHALL BE COLLECTED USING, AT A MINIMUM, THE MOST RECENT PUBLICLY AVAILABLE FORMS USED BY THE INSURANCE RESEARCH 17 COUNCIL FOR ITS AUTO INJURY SURVEY. THE SUPERINTENDENT MAY REQUIRE ADDI-18 19 TIONAL INFORMATION BEYOND THAT WHICH IS CONTAINED IN SUCH SURVEY IF HE 20 OR SHE DEEMS IT NECESSARY AND WARRANTED. INSTEAD OF COLLECTING INFORMA-21 TION FOR ALL PRIVATE PASSENGER AUTOMOBILE CLAIMS THE SUPERINTENDENT MAY COLLECT DATA FOR A STATISTICALLY VALID SAMPLE OF CLAIMS. THE MINIMUM 22 SAMPLE SIZE SHALL REPRESENT FIVE PER CENTUM OF THE NUMBER OF CLAIMS FOR 23 24 EACH YEAR. UNTIL THE SUPERINTENDENT PROMULGATES DATA COLLECTION FORMS 25 AND PROCEDURES FOR COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE INSURANCE, DATA SHALL BE 26 COLLECTED USING INFORMATION WHICH MAY BE AVAILABLE FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE. FOR COMMERCIAL AUTOMOBILE CLAIMS, INSTEAD OF COLLECTING INFORMA-27 TION FOR ALL CLAIMS THE SUPERINTENDENT MAY COLLECT DATA FOR A 28 STATIS-TICALLY VALID SAMPLE OF CLAIMS. THE MINIMUM SAMPLE SIZE SHALL REPRESENT 29 TEN PER CENTUM OF THE NUMBER OF CLAIMS FOR EACH YEAR FOR SUCH LINE OF 30 INSURANCE. SUCH DETAILED CLAIM DATA SHALL BE SIGNED AND ATTESTED AS 31 32 FULL, COMPLETE AND ACCURATE BY THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE INSUR-33 ER, AND HE OR SHE SHALL BE HELD PERSONALLY RESPONSIBLE WITH RESPECT TO THE ACCURACY OF THE DATA. THE DETAILED CLAIM DATA SHALL BE SUBMITTED IN 34 35 THE SAME MANNER AS PROVIDED FOR IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION. 36 (D) THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL, IN BOTH WRITTEN FORM AND AS PART OF THE 37 DEPARTMENT WEB SITE, MAKE SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND DETAILED CLAIM 38 INFORMATION AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC. THE DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION 39 SHALL BE PROVIDED IN AGGREGATE FORM FOR ALL INSURERS COMBINED WITHOUT 40 ANY IDENTIFICATION OF A SPECIFIC CLAIM TO A SPECIFIC INSURER. NONE OF PUBLICLY AVAILABLE DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION SHALL IDENTIFY THE 41 THE 42 INDIVIDUAL INSURER, DEFENDANT OR PLAINTIFF ASSOCIATED WITH THE CLAIM. 43 SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION SHALL BE DEEMED PUBLIC DOCUMENT AND NO PERSON SHALL BE REQUIRED TO FILE A REQUEST FOR 44 Α 45 SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENTS PURSUANT TO ARTICLE SIX OF THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW IN ORDER TO RECEIVE A COPY THEREOF, BUT UPON REQUEST AND PAYMENT OF 46 47 THE FEE FOR COPYING SUCH DOCUMENT, IT SHALL BE PROVIDED. WITH RESPECT TO 48 THE ELECTRONIC COPY OF SUCH FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND DETAILED CLAIM 49 INFORMATION, WHICH SHALL BE ACCESSIBLE ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEB SITE, THE 50 DEPARTMENT SHALL HIGHLIGHT THE AVAILABILITY OF SUCH INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC ON SUCH WEB SITE, AND THE LINK TO EACH INSURER'S FINANCIAL STATE-51

52 MENT AND THE AGGREGATED DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION SHALL BE ACCESSIBLE 53 IN A SIMPLE AND EASY MANNER. BOTH THE FINANCIAL STATEMENT AND AGGREGATED 54 DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION ON THE DEPARTMENT WEB SITE SHALL BE AVAILABLE 55 IN SPREADSHEET FORMAT, IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER FORMAT THE SUPERINTEN-56 DENT DETERMINES IS APPROPRIATE.

ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST OF EACH YEAR, THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL 1 (E) 2 ISSUE REPORTS SUMMARIZING AND EXPLAINING THE INFORMATION COLLECTED FROM 3 THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND THE DETAILED CLAIM INFORMATION. COPIES OF 4 SUCH REPORTS SHALL BE FORWARDED TO THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE 5 SENATE, THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND THE CHAIRS OF BOTH THE SENATE 6 AND ASSEMBLY INSURANCE COMMITTEES. SUCH REPORTS SHALL BE PUBLIC DOCU-7 MENTS AND SHALL BE ACCESSIBLE BOTH IN PAPER COPY AND ON THE DEPARTMENT'S 8 WEB SITE.

9 (F) WHERE AN INSURER FAILS OR REFUSES TO PROVIDE THE SUPERINTENDENT 10 WITH A FULL AND COMPLETE DISCLOSURE AS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, THE SUPERINTENDENT SHALL TAKE SUCH ACTION HE OR SHE DEEMS NECESSARY TO BRING 11 12 THE INSURER INTO FULL COMPLIANCE. SUCH ACTION MAY INCLUDE IMPOSITION OF CIVIL PENALTY OF UP TO FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS ASSESSED AGAINST THE 13 А 14 INSURER FOR EACH VIOLATION, TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF ANY RIGHT TO ISSUE 15 ADDITIONAL POLICIES OR CONTRACTS UNTIL THE INSURER BRINGS ITSELF INTO FULL COMPLIANCE, AN AUDIT OF THE INSURER'S RECORDS BY THE DEPARTMENT OR 16 ITS DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE TO OBTAIN THE INFORMATION AND WHICH AUDIT 17 SHALL BE PAID FOR BY THE INSURER, OR ANY OTHER CIVIL REMEDY THE SUPER-18 19 INTENDENT DEEMS WARRANTED OR NECESSARY UNTIL SUCH INSURER FULLY 20 COMPLIES. IN ADDITION THE OFFICER WHOSE SIGNATURE IS AFFIXED TO SUCH 21 STATEMENT MAY BE PERSONALLY PENALIZED TO THE SAME EXTENT.

(G) THE SUPERINTENDENT MAY PROMULGATE SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS HE OR
SHE DEEMS NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF
THIS SECTION, AND SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS MAY BE PROMULGATED ON AN
EMERGENCY BASIS IF THE SUPERINTENDENT WARRANTS SUCH ACTION TO BE NECESSARY.

S 4. Severability. If any item, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subdivision or other part of this act, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall be held to be invalid, such holding shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this act but it shall be confined in its operation to the item, clause, sentence, subparagraph, subdivision or other part of this act directly involved in such holding, or to the person and circumstances therein involved.
