AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to a state transportation plan

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 22-d to read as follows:

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- 22-D. STATE TRANSPORTATION PLAN. 1. THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTA-TION SHALL DEVELOP AND PRESENT TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE BY OCTO-BER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN:
- (A) A COMPREHENSIVE, TWENTY-YEAR INTERMODAL, LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION 7 PLAN FOR THE STATE THAT SHALL AT A MINIMUM CONSIDER LONG-RANGE NEEDS SPANNING NO LESS THAN A TWENTY-YEAR TIME RANGE EACH TIME IT IS 9 OPED. THE PLAN MAY BE DEVELOPED IN MULTIPLE DOCUMENTS, RELEASED SIMUL-TANEOUSLY, THAT ASSESS STATEWIDE AND REGIONAL SYSTEM NEEDS, AND MAY BE 10 ANALYZED BASED ON GEOGRAPHIC AREA, MODE OF TRANSPORTATION, TRANSPORTA-11 TION CORRIDORS, SYSTEMS, AND OTHER DISTINCT SUBJECTS RELEVANT TO TRANS-12 PORTATION PLANNING. SUCH PLAN SHALL INCLUDE WITHOUT LIMITATION CONSIDER-13 ATION OF A BALANCED, AFFORDABLE, COORDINATED NETWORK OF STATE AND LOCAL 14 15 HIGHWAYS, RAPID TRANSIT, FREIGHT AND PASSENGER RAILROAD, 16 MARINE, AVIATION, PEDESTRIAN/BICYCLING AND OTHER MASS TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES AND SERVICES, WHETHER PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY OWNED OR MAIN-17 TAINED. SUCH PLAN SHALL ALSO ASSESS ITS COMPLIANCE WITH THE MOST RECENT-18 19 LY RELEASED LONG-TERM REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANS FOR EACH METROPOL-20 ITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION IN THE STATE.
 - (B) A FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN IN STATE AND LOCAL HIGHWAYS AND BRIDGES, PASSENGER AND FREIGHT RAIL, SUBURBAN AND UPSTATE TRANSIT, PORTS AND AIRPORTS. IN ADDITION, THE SUBMITTAL SHALL RECOMMEND AND PERFORMANCE MEASURES TO DETERMINE THE STATE'S INVESTMENT IN SUCH FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN SHALL INCLUDE THE TRANSPORTATION. **PROJECTS** INTENDED TO BE COMPLETED WITHIN THE FIRST FIVE YEARS OF THE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS SUBDI-VISION AND EXPLAIN HOW THESE PROJECTS COMPORT WITH THE GOALS OF THE

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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1 LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN REQUIRED BY PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS SUBDI-2 VISION.

- 2. BY OCTOBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINETEEN AND EVERY FIFTH YEAR THERE-AFTER, THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL:
- (A) FULLY REVISE AND SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE THE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN IN CONFORMANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION; AND
- (B) DEVELOP AND SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE A FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN IN CONFORMANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (B) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION.
- 3. IN DEVELOPING AND REVISING THE STATE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN, THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL CONFORM TO THE REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY AND USE OF FEDERAL AND OTHER FUND SOURCES, AS APPLICABLE, SHALL SEEK PUBLIC REVIEW AND EVALUATION BY ANY REASONABLE MEANS AND SHALL:
- (A) CONSULT AND COOPERATE WITH OFFICIALS AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, OTHER GOVERNMENTS, INTERSTATE COMMISSIONS AND AUTHORITIES, STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES AND AUTHORITIES, INTERESTED CORPORATIONS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS CONCERNING PROBLEMS AND NEEDS AFFECTING TRANSPORTATION IN THE STATE;
- (B) REQUEST FROM AN AGENCY OR OTHER UNIT OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT OR OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, OR FROM A PUBLIC AUTHORITY, SUCH ASSISTANCE AND DATA NECESSARY TO ENABLE THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION TO CARRY OUT RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS SECTION; EVERY SUCH ENTITY SHALL PROVIDE THE ASSISTANCE AND DATA REQUESTED, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT SUCH ASSISTANCE SHALL NOT WAIVE OR IMPAIR THE TERMS OF AN EXISTING AGREEMENT NEGOTIATED BETWEEN THE RELEVANT EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATION NOR LIMIT ANY OBLIGATION TO BARGAIN TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT PURSUANT TO ARTICLE FOURTEEN OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW;
- (C) CONDUCT AT MINIMUM ELEVEN PUBLIC HEARINGS, ONE IN EACH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REGION ACROSS THE STATE, WITH OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT TO BE COMPLETED AT LEAST SIX MONTHS BEFORE SUCH DOCUMENT IS REQUIRED TO BE PRESENTED TO THE LEGISLATURE. SUCH HEARINGS SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE SEVEN OF THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW; AND
- (D) MAINTAIN A SECTION ON THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S WEBSITE WHERE THE PUBLIC AT LARGE MAY VIEW THE PROPOSED LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN AND SUBMIT COMMENTS ABOUT EACH PLAN DIRECTLY TO THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 4. COPIES OF THE LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN, ORIGINAL AND AS REVISED, IN ADDITION TO BEING MADE AVAILABLE IN A SEARCHABLE FORMAT ON THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S WEBSITE SHALL BE KEPT ON FILE AS A PUBLIC DOCUMENT IN THE OFFICE OF THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION AND AT EACH REGIONAL OFFICE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 5. THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ANNUALLY DEVELOP AND TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE, BY OCTOBER THIRTIETH, TWO THOU-SAND SIXTEEN AND EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, A LIST OF PROJECTS SCHEDULED FOR PLANNING, ACQUISITION, DESIGN, ENGINEERING, ENVIRONMENTAL ANALYSIS, CONSTRUCTION, RECONSTRUCTION, RESTORATION, REHABILITATION, ESTABLISH-IMPROVEMENT, RENOVATION, EXTENSION, REPAIR, REVITALIZATION, MANAGEMENT, DEVELOPMENT, DEMOLITION, RECONDITIONING AND PRESERVATION, TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE-RELATED APPRAISALS, SURVEYS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES, OR OTHER NECESSARY ACTIVITIES FOR THE UPCOMING YEAR. THE LIST OF PROJECTS SHALL INCLUDE AN ESTIMATE OF FEDER-AL, STATE, AND OTHER FUNDS ANTICIPATED TO BE RECEIVED TO FUND EACH

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PROJECT; A DESCRIPTION, LOCATION, AND ITEMIZATION OF THE ESTIMATED COST FOR EACH PROJECT; AND A DISBURSEMENT SCHEDULE OF COSTS OVER EACH 3 PROJECT'S LIFE, AND AN EXPLANATION OF HOW THE LIST COMPORTS WITH THE FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN AND LONG-RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND WHY THERE 5 ARE DEVIATIONS, IF ANY, FROM THE FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN. PROJECT LISTING 6 INFORMATION RELATED TO COST AND DISBURSEMENT SCHEDULE SHALL BE PUBLICLY 7 AVAILABLE FOR DOWNLOAD ON THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S WEBSITE IN A SEARCHABLE FORMAT, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION FORMATTING AS AN EXCEL 9 FILE BY OCTOBER THIRTIETH OF EACH YEAR.

6. THE LIST OF PROJECTS AND PROJECT INFORMATION ANNUALLY DEVELOPED 11 UNDER SUBDIVISION FIVE OF THIS SECTION, IF AMENDED BY THE EXECUTIVE BUDGET, SHALL BE UPDATED TO REFLECT THE EXECUTIVE PROPOSED BUDGET 12 13 SUBMITTED CONCURRENTLY, AND MADE AVAILABLE ON THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANS-14 PORTATION'S WEBSITE, WITH THE EXECUTIVE BUDGET, IN ADDITION TO THE INFORMATION REQUIRED BY SECTIONS TWENTY-TWO AND TWENTY-TWO-C OF THIS 16 ARTICLE. A LIST OF PROJECTS OR A SEPARATE COLUMN SHALL BE PROVIDED 17 CONCURRENTLY UPDATING THE STATUS OF PROJECTS APPROVED FOR FUNDING COMMITMENT OR DISBURSEMENT DURING THE PREVIOUSLY ENACTED BUDGET, SHOWING 18 19 WHETHER FUNDS WERE COMMITTED OR DISBURSED AS WELL AS ANY REVISIONS 20 EACH PROJECT'S SCHEDULED COMPLETION AND PROJECT COST. SUCH LIST OR LISTS 21 PROJECTS AND ANY PROJECT LISTING REVISIONS REFLECTED WITHIN THE ENACTED EXECUTIVE BUDGET SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTAND-22 ING TO BE SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT AND MAJORI-23 TY LEADER OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY. PRIOR TO 24 DISBURSEMENT OF ANY FUNDS FOR THE FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL PLAN AND LONG-RANGE 26 TRANSPORTATION PLAN FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION OR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S CAPITAL EXPENDITURES, THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING MUST BE 27 28 29 SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATIVE LEADERS OF THE SENATE AND 30 ASSEMBLY AND MADE AVAILABLE ON THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S 31 WEBSITE.

IN EVALUATING ADDITION, REPLACEMENT, OR EXPANSION OF HIGHWAYS, BRIDGES, AIRPORTS, TERMINALS, FERRIES, AND OTHER MAJOR COMPONENTS FOR INCLUSION IN THE PLAN, THE COMMISSIONER OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL PREPARE A COST-EFFECTIVENESS ANALYSIS FOR PROJECTS OVER TEN MILLION DOLLARS, USING A WIDELY ACCEPTED METHODOLOGY TO BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC PRIOR TO COMMENCEMENT OF PRELIMINARY ENGINEERING OR DESIGN WORK. A COST-EFFECTIVENESS ANALYSIS SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED FOR A PROJECT THAT INVOLVES THE REHABILITATION AND MAINTENANCE OF AN EXISTING TRANSPORTA-TION SYSTEM OR THAT PRIMARILY SERVES LOCAL TRANSPORTATION NEEDS.

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
