WHEREAS, In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge supported the idea of a National Father's Day; then in 1966, President Lyndon Johnson signed a presidential proclamation declaring the 3rd Sunday of June as Father's Day; and

WHEREAS, This Legislative Body is proud to pay tribute and commend these men who are worthy of full recognition for their valued contributions and who should be celebrated by all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to commemorate the celebration of Father's Day, Sunday, June 21, 2015, in honor and recognition of all the fathers of the State of New York.
