AN ACT to require the office of temporary and disability assistance to conduct a homelessness study

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The office of temporary and disability assistance shall conduct a homelessness study. Such study shall include, but not be limited to:

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- 1. the adequacy of the current shelter allowance and eviction prevention supplements, in light of increasing costs for housing, fuel and utilities;
- 7 2. whether the inadequacy of the shelter allowance and allowances for 8 fuel and utilities is contributing to evictions, overcrowding and home-9 lessness;
  - 3. whether the inadequacy of the shelter allowance and allowances for fuel and utilities is constraining the ability of the private sector to provide safe and affordable housing to low-income New Yorkers;
- 4. whether the requirement that a family be sued for eviction before 13 14 they can access a rent supplement program is reasonable considering that it imposes litigation costs on landlords who are providing affordable 15 housing, increases state and local costs for court administration leaves 16 tenants with negative credit that may inhibit their ability to find 17 employment and secure housing in the near term and future, and limits 18 the program to others in need including those who are forced to move 19 20 because of domestic violence;

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5. whether the inadequacy of the shelter allowance and allowances for fuel and utilities is constraining the ability of public housing authorities to maintain the condition and safety of their buildings; and 6. whether the shelter allowance should be correlated to the HUD Fair

- 6. whether the shelter allowance should be correlated to the HUD Fair Market Rent levels which are updated annually and based on real housing cost data.
- S 2. By June 30, 2017, such office shall provide a report to the governor, the speaker of the assembly, temporary president of the senate, the minority leaders of the senate and assembly and the chairs of the social services committees in the senate and assembly.
  - S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
