AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to equipping police officers to protect against terrorist acts and active shooter incidents

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Legislative finding and declaration. The legislature hereby  
2     finds and declares that there is a substantial state interest in  
3     protecting New York from the threat of terrorist attacks and active  
4     shooter incidents. The legislature also finds and declares that the  
5     burden of stopping such threats falls overwhelmingly on police officers,  
6     who are often not adequately equipped to be able to meet such threats.  
7     Therefore, the legislature declares the necessity for the enactment of  
8     this act to require that police officers in certain locations within the  
9     state be adequately equipped with state of the art personal protective  
10    equipment and firearms that will allow them to meet the existing threat  
11    from terrorist attacks and active shooter incidents.

12    S 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 837-s to  
13    read as follows:

14    S 837-S. ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGES FOR PUBLIC SAFETY. 1. AS USED  
15    IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS:

16    (A) "COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT" SHALL MEAN A POLICE DEPARTMENT OF A  
17    CITY WITH A POPULATION OF MORE THAN ONE MILLION.

18    (B) "ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGE" SHALL MEAN A PACKAGE OF PERSONAL  
19    PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AND ONE OR MORE FIREARMS THAT WILL ALLOW A POLICE  
20    OFFICER TO RESPOND IMMEDIATELY TO A TERRORIST ATTACK OR AN ACTIVE SHOOT-  
21    ER INCIDENT. THE CONTENTS OF THE PACKAGE SHALL INCLUDE, BUT SHALL NOT BE  
22    LIMITED TO: AN ADVANCED BALLISTIC VEST; AN ADVANCED BALLISTIC HELMET;  
23    AND AN APPROVED LONG GUN OR RIFLE HAVING SEMIAUTOMATIC CAPABILITY. THE  
24    EQUIPMENT INCLUDED IN AN ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGE SHALL PROVIDE THE  
25    GREATEST LEVEL OF PROTECTION AND EFFECTIVENESS TO MEET THE THREAT TO THE  
26    PUBLIC AND POLICE OFFICERS FROM TERRORIST ATTACKS AND ACTIVE SHOOTER  
27    INCIDENTS AND SHALL BE COMMENSURATE WITH THE STATE OF THE ART AT THE  
28    TIME OF ISSUANCE, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSIONER. ALL EQUIPMENT AND

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1 FIREARMS SHALL BE REPLACED BY THE COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT EVERY FIVE  
2 YEARS OR WHEN THE STATE OF THE ART IMPROVES AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMIS-  
3 SIONER, WHICHEVER IS EARLIER.

4 (C) "ACTIVE SHOOTER INCIDENT" SHALL MEAN ANY INCIDENT WHERE AN INDI-  
5 VIDUAL OR GROUP IS ACTIVELY ENGAGED IN KILLING, ATTEMPTING TO KILL, OR  
6 THREATENING TO KILL A PERSON OR PERSONS IN A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE AREA BY  
7 MEANS OF A FIREARM, ASSAULT WEAPON OR EXPLOSIVE DEVICE.

8 (D) "APPROVED LONG GUN OR RIFLE" SHALL MEAN A M4A1 CARBINE, AR-15  
9 RIFLE, RUGER MINI-14 RIFLE, MP5, OR OTHER FIREARM WITH SIMILAR CAPABILI-  
10 TIES, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSIONER.

11 (E) "ADVANCED BALLISTIC VEST" SHALL MEAN A BALLISTIC VEST CLASSIFIED  
12 AS AT LEAST TYPE IV BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE STANDARDS FOR  
13 BALLISTIC RESISTANCE OF BODY ARMOR. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL DESIGNATE A  
14 BALLISTIC VEST THAT IS STATE OF THE ART BEYOND TYPE IV AS THE "ADVANCED  
15 BALLISTIC VEST" WHEN SUCH BALLISTIC VEST BECOMES COMMERCIALY AVAILABLE.

16 (F) "ADVANCED BALLISTIC HELMET" SHALL MEAN A BALLISTIC HELMET CLASSI-  
17 FIED AS AT LEAST TYPE III-A BY THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF JUSTICE STAND-  
18 ARDS FOR BALLISTIC HELMETS. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL DESIGNATE A BALLISTIC  
19 HELMET THAT IS THE STATE OF THE ART BEYOND TYPE III-A AS THE "ADVANCED  
20 BALLISTIC HELMET" WHEN SUCH BALLISTIC HELMET BECOMES COMMERCIALY AVAIL-  
21 ABLE.

22 2. ALL COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENTS SHALL MAINTAIN ONE ANTI-TERROR  
23 RESPONSES PACKAGE FOR EVERY EMPLOYED POLICE OFFICER. SUCH ANTI-TERROR  
24 RESPONSE PACKAGES SHALL BE LOCATED IN VEHICLES TO WHICH POLICE OFFICERS  
25 ARE ASSIGNED, SECURE POLICE FACILITIES, AND OTHER SECURE AREAS IMME-  
26 DIATELY ACCESSIBLE TO POLICE OFFICERS DURING THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR  
27 DUTIES. ALL COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENTS SHALL IMPLEMENT A POLICY THAT  
28 POLICE OFFICERS OUTFIT THEMSELVES TO THE GREATEST EXTENT PRACTICABLE  
29 WITH THE EQUIPMENT AND FIREARM INCLUDED IN THE ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE  
30 PACKAGE PRIOR TO RESPONDING TO ANY TERRORIST ATTACK OR ACTIVE SHOOTER  
31 INCIDENT.

32 3. ALL COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENTS SHALL TRAIN ALL POLICE OFFICERS  
33 EMPLOYED BY SUCH DEPARTMENTS NO LESS THAN ANNUALLY IN THE USE OF THE  
34 ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGE AND ITS COMPONENTS, AND SHALL ISSUE  
35 ANTI-TERROR CERTIFICATIONS TO POLICE OFFICERS UPON COMPLETION OF SUCH  
36 TRAINING.

37 4. A COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT MAY APPLY TO THE COMMISSIONER FOR  
38 REIMBURSEMENT OF FUNDS EXPENDED FOR THE PURCHASE OF ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE  
39 PACKAGES. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL REQUIRE ANY COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT  
40 SEEKING REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION TO APPLY FOR ANY AVAILABLE  
41 FEDERAL FUNDS. ANY COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT FAILING TO DO SO SHALL NOT  
42 BE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT UNDER THIS SECTION. THE COMMISSIONER MAY  
43 WAIVE SUCH FAILURE FOR GOOD CAUSE. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL MAINTAIN A  
44 PUBLIC RECORD OF ALL SUCH WAIVERS AND THE REASONS THEREFOR. REIMBURSE-  
45 MENT MAY BE WITHHELD PENDING THE DETERMINATION OF AN APPLICATION FOR  
46 FEDERAL FUNDS.

47 5. THE AMOUNT OF ANY REIMBURSEMENT AUTHORIZED TO BE MADE PURSUANT TO  
48 SUBDIVISION FOUR OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE REDUCED BY THE AMOUNT OF ANY  
49 FEDERAL FUNDS GRANTED TO THE COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE  
50 OF PURCHASING ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGES, AND BY THE AMOUNT OF ANY  
51 OTHER FUNDS RECEIVED DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FOR THAT PURPOSE BY THE  
52 COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT.

53 6. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PROMULGATE REGULATIONS PRESCRIBING STANDARDS  
54 AND SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE CONTENTS OF THE ANTI-TERROR RESPONSE PACKAGE  
55 PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION, THE REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAIN-  
56 ING AND CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION,

1 PROCEDURES FOR REIMBURSEMENT TO COVERED DEPARTMENTS PURSUANT TO SUBDIVI-  
2 SIONS FOUR AND FIVE OF THIS SECTION, AND ALL OTHER RULES AND REGULATIONS  
3 NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

4 7. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION OR ANY OTHER GENER-  
5 AL, SPECIAL, LOCAL OR OTHER LAW, RULE OR REGULATION TO THE CONTRARY, A  
6 POLICE OFFICER'S FAILURE TO ADHERE TO POLICIES PROMULGATED BY COVERED  
7 POLICE DEPARTMENTS PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL NOT AMOUNT TO A  
8 VIOLATION OF A DUTY OR OBLIGATION OF A POLICE OFFICER AND NEITHER THE  
9 POLICE OFFICER NOR ANY HEIR, EXECUTOR, ADMINISTRATOR OR ASSIGN SHALL  
10 SUFFER ANY LOSS OR DIMINISHMENT OF ANY RIGHT, INTEREST OR BENEFIT TO  
11 WHICH THEY ARE OTHERWISE ENTITLED.

12 8. THE FAILURE TO SECURE STATE OR FEDERAL FUNDING SHALL NOT RELIEVE A  
13 COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT FROM THE OBLIGATIONS IMPOSED BY THIS SECTION.  
14 THE LANGUAGE OF THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT A  
15 COVERED POLICE DEPARTMENT FROM EXPENDING ITS OWN FUNDS FOR ANTI-TERROR  
16 RESPONSE PACKAGES, OR THEIR CONTENTS, IN AMOUNTS EXCEEDING ANY ESTAB-  
17 LISHED STATE REIMBURSEMENT LIMITATIONS.

18 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
